## On Marionfite Farm <br> Conservation Program With Grain Stubble

| Marion Fite, Parmer Coun ty farmer who farms near Friona, has used two operations to produce good residue on his grain sorghum land, according to Eddy T. Willman of the Soil Conservation Service. <br> Fite produced an estimated 6500 pounds of grain sorghum per acre on his produced 11,000 pounds of grain sorghum residue per acre, Tillman added. <br> The problem facing Fite was how to manage the residue so that he receives the most from it while at the same time managing it not to interfere with the grain sorghum crop he plans to plant on the same field next spring. <br> In trying to solve this prom gram, Tillman said Fite used a rotary tiller across the lower end of the field. This reduced the amount of residue by onehalf. <br> Tillman explained that this | accomplishes five things: (1) Maintains soil structure which will maintain the rate at which water enters the soil, an important benefit, Tillman said, because the clay loam and silty clay loam soils tend to cement together retarding water intake and movement, making irrigation easier. (2) Conserves moisture by having the mulch duce the rate of evaporation, (3) Modifies soil temperature by having the mulch on the surface which will keep the soil warmer in winter and cooler insummer. (4) Affects available plant nutrients by changing the chemical content of the soil and inReduces the soil susceptibility to both wind and water erosion, <br> To be sure that residue has been reduced to the proper amount, Fite followed the rotary tiller with an offset disk on a portion of the field. This addi- | tional operation reduced the amount of residue on the surface to 2,250 pounds per acre.
