The 1971 Sudan Hornets will close out this football season here Friday night in a game with the Kress Kangaroos before a Sudan Homecoming crowd.

The Hornets bowed to the Farwell Steers 28-0 Friday night in a one-sided game at Farwell. However, according to the statistics the game was very evenly played. Farwell had 353 total yards with Sudan having a total of 303 yards, 235 yards on the ground and 68 in the air. Sudan also had five penetrations past the 20 yard line of the Steers

ROAD WORK PLANNED

The Texas Highway Commission recently approved development of 5.7 miles of Farm to Market Roads in Lamb County. District Highway Engineer Oscar L. Crain of the Texas Highway Department in Lubbock said the estimated cost of the work is \$213,000 with Rhea Bradley of Littlefield as resident engineer.

The work will include the reconstruction of Farm to Market road 37, some 2.0 miles south of Amherst, south to FM 54.






