## Suit Dismissed

Judge Pat Boone, Jr. dismissed the following case in 154th District Court when a joint motion was made to this effect.

Plaintiffs, Charles Ary, et al. and defendants, Mary Beth Willey, County Clerk, Herbert Dunn, Tax Assessor-Collector, G. T. Sides, County Judge, A. J. Spain, Commissioner of Precinct 1, T. L. Free, Commissioner of Precinct 2, Jack Peel, Commissioner of Precinct 3, and Hubert Dykes, Commissioner of Precinct 4, filed a joint motion to dismiss the case filed in the 154th District Court

of Lamb County.

The order of Dismissal, signed April 4, 1974, by Judge Pat Boone, Jr., finds that the parties to the suit have reached a complete settlement of their differences and orders that all costs will be paid by the Plaintiffs.

The suit was an appeal to District Court from the order of the Commissioners Court denying Plaintiff's petition to call a local option election in Justice of the Peace, Precinct 4. Petitioners requested a writ of mandamus issue to order the County Officials to re-evaluate the lo-

cal option petitions and make a new determination as to whether or not a local option election should be called. It was filed October 17, 1973, following certification by Mary Beth Willey, County Clerk, and the Lamb County Commissioners Court that there were not sufficient signatures of qualified voters on the local option petitions to call an election. The order of dismissal prohibits re-filing of the suit.
