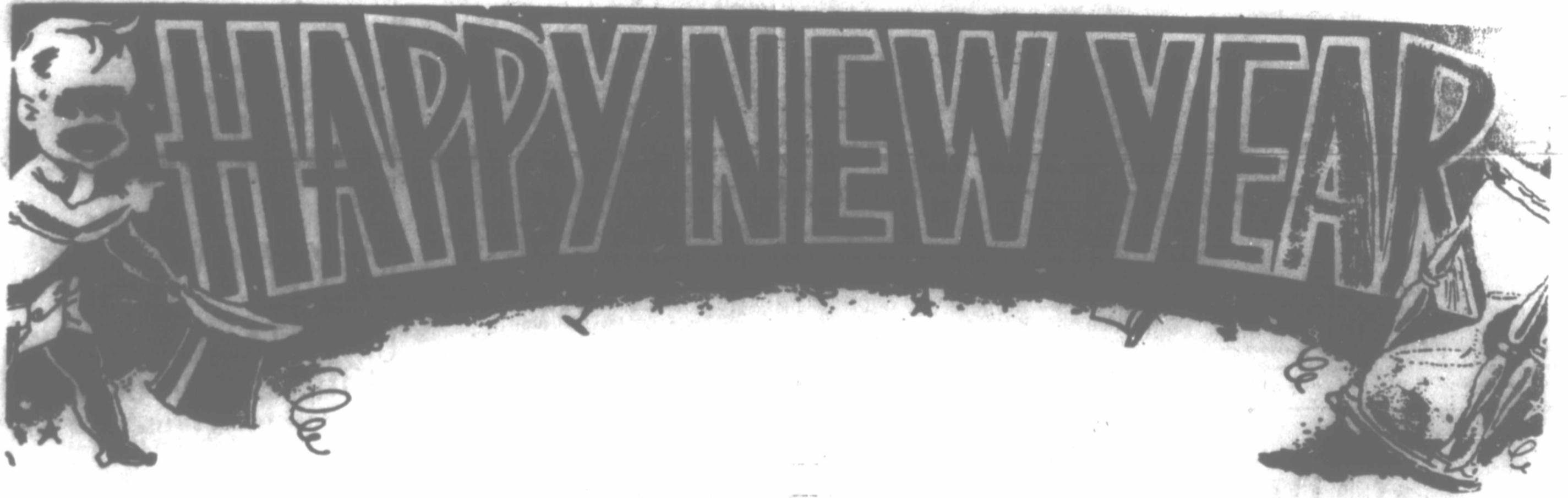

## Evert Defends Title in World Series of Women's Tennis

Chris Evert has announced she will play in the 2nd L'eggs World Series of Women's Tennis, Jan. 10-11, at the Lakeway World of Tennis in Austin, Tex. Joining Evonne Goolagong, Martina Navratilova and Virginia Wade. Victory will be worth \$50,000 of a total purse of \$100,000. This is the largest winning share in women's sports. Evert won the first World Series last spring, defeating Billie Jean King 4-6, 6-3, 7-6 in the final.

John Ozmun, marketing manager for Leggs Products, Inc., Winston-Salem, N.C., the tournament sponsor, said achievement in the Grand Slam events is what determines eligibility for the World Series.

The tournament will be telecast live on the ABC television network, covering 90 minutes on Saturday (Jan. 10) and two hours on Sunday (Jan. 11).

## GEORGE MAHON SAYS

Congressman George Mahon met December 16 with the president, at which time he urged the President to veto the Energy Conservation and Oil Policy Act of 1975. Mahon joined with 19 Texas Members of the House of Representatives in opposing the final version of the controversial and long-debated bill, which had been earlier agreed upon by the Senate and House conferees and which passed the House December 15 by a vote of 236 to 160. Action by the Senate is expected soon.

Mahon said that enactment of the bill would be a disaster. "If the bill becomes the law, the American consumer will be the big loser because the measure would stifle incentive for increased exploration and production and make the nation increasingly dependent upon high-priced imported oil," said the Congressman. "The measure has some good provisions, but the rollback provisions would prove to be disastrous," he continued. Mahon feels that continuing the present system of price control for a while longer would be far preferable to the proposed energy measure.

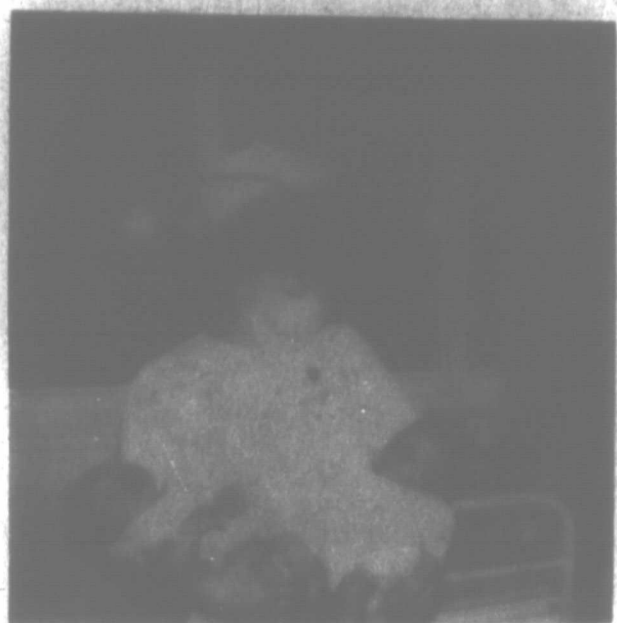

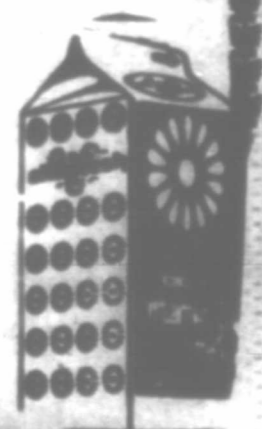
