Boys Ranch Rodeo

At Cal Farley's Boys Ranch, thirty six miles northwest of Amarillo, 385 pint-sized cowboys are getting ready for their thirty fourth annual Boys Ranch Rodeo.

Practice rides on the broncs and bulls have been going on since June with only about 150 riders expected to appear in the Ranch's rodeo arena over the Labor Day weekend. They will be competing in bareback bronc riding. Brahma bulls, steers, calves and even stick horses for the three-to six year-olds. It is the only rodeo of its kind in the nation in which boys riding professional rodeo stock under RC A rules are the only contestants.

Approximately 3,000 boys have lived at the Ranch since it was started in 1939, and the rodeo is also a traditional homecoming for the Boys Ranch Alumni Association Some of the graduates and their families travel long distances to attend.

An added attraction will be Texas-sized barbeque beef plates that will be prepared and sold by the boys for only \$1.50 Reserve box seat tickets at \$2.50 will be on sale at the Boys Ranch Office, 600 West 11th Street in Amarillo. General admission will be \$1.50 for adults and ' \$ 75 for children under twelve. Performances are scheduled for 3:00 p.m. each afternoon, September 3 and

The Bible Says ---


'Honor your marriage and its vows, and be pure; for God will surely punish all those who are immoral or commit adultery.' Hebrews 13:4 LB

Do you remember the vows that we repeated to become husband and wife We stood before God and a company of witnesses. Before that select audience, we repeated or answered yes to something like this; 'I promise to keep myself pure for you... until death shall part us.

To break this yow is dislovally at its highest level. There is no higher promise than that one! God is not part of the union for, "The two shall become one flesh' but God witnesses the union and in fact does the joining: What God hath joined together, let no man put asunder.' Once that union is made, there is only one reason for breaking the union that is acceptable to God. Man allows many reasons for divorce, God is the judge and lawgiver.

Man is weak and of a sinful nature at times. Man will fall in the passion of the moment, when the temptation is great. During times like these, man does not always act and do the thing he would normally do. These moments of weakness are not under discussion here. We are talking about the willing, planned and carefully executed affairs' between two people who are not married to each other.
