According to Roy Hickman, C. of C. secretary, "The value of a fertile, well managed winter pasture provides a livestock ration adequate in the necessary feed elements, makes possible the production of more and better livestock and can be made to fit into any planned crop rotation. Livestock can be grazed more profitably and a vigorous stand of pasture plants competes successfully with most perennial weeds.

Seeds to be bought by the C. of C. and given to the four farmers for demonstration purposes are: Vetch, Crested Wheat, Perennial Eye and Clover.
