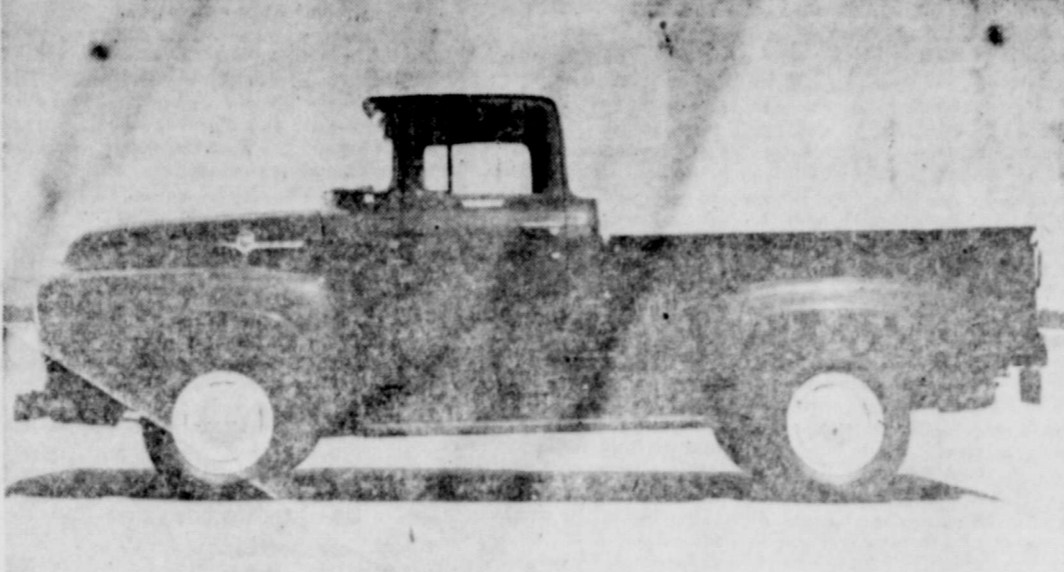

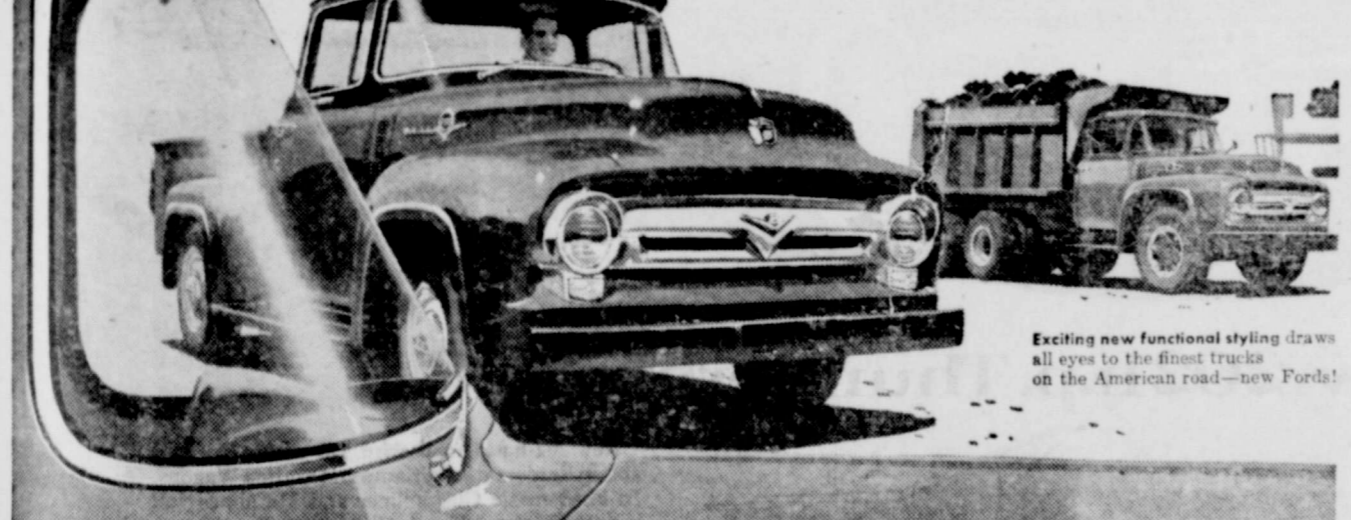
Bula Schools Make Plans for Homecoming

NEW FORDS, CARS AND TRUCKS ON DISPLAY AT MAHAN'S, FRIDAY

Safety features offered for the first time by any automobile company, power equal to the Thunderbird, and lower body silhouettes are available in 1956 Ford cars which 6,800 Ford dealers place on display Friday (Sept. 23), including a showing at Mahan Motor Company in Morton.

NEW MODELS TO BE SHOWN

When new models go on display at Ford dealer show-rooms, Friday, Mahan Motor Company will have a two door custom; a four door custom; a four door Fairlane; a two door Victoria and a new 6-cylinder truck, all 1956 models, Mac Mahan has announced.

Station Wagon models, and develops 202 horsepower for Fordomatic, or 200 hp for overdrive or standard transmission. Customline and Mainline Fords offer a Y-8 engine developing 176 hp for Fordomatic or 173 hp for overdrive or conventional drive. Also, the economical Ford six, increased to 137 hp, is available on all models with all transmission types.

Ford safety research, coupled with studies of medical groups, led to the development of a "lifeguard design" in 1956 models. New door latches give added protection against the chance that a door may open under impact. The new doors have been proved in full scale crash tests at Dearborn, Mich.

To keep the driver's chest from hitting the steering wheel in event of a crash, the new three spoke Ford steering wheel has its center hub recessed 3 and 1/8 inches below the wheel rim.

Rear view mirrors have a special backing designed to prevent shattering.

Front and rear seat mountings have been strengthened so they will resist greater impact.

In addition, Ford offers two optional safety devices. Seat belts, designed to withstand pull up to 4,000 lb. will help hold occupants inside cars and to prevent forward motion. Foam plastic padding on instrument panels and sun visors will help absorb impact if a person is accidentally thrown forward.

Styling advances in the Ford for 1956 include a new grille with oblong parking lights at outer ends set in frames which wrap around the fender sides. Body side molding is re-styled for Fairlane, Station Wagon and Customline models. Restyled tail lamps and deck lid handles, a larger recessed hood ornament, and a completely new instrument panel are offered in all models.

The 1956 Victoria is one and one half inches lower than the comparable 1955 model. Two door and four door sedans also have new tops reducing total car height almost a full inch. However, headroom was not reduced since the contour change is mostly along the top's centerline, and fabric headlinings are installed closer to the steel top.

At the same time Mahan will unveil the 1956 Ford truck with 200 new models featuring greater engine performance and payload capacity.

The new Ford cars will be built in four series offering 18 body styles—two more than in 1955. They are available in 13 solid exterior colors or 21 two-tone combinations.

A Thunderbird Y-8 engine leads the power selections available for 1956. It is installed on Fairlane and an addition to the line is the Parklane Station Wagon, a two-door car which offers an eight by five foot load space with tailgate extended. It is fitted inside with deluxe upholstery and trim combinations and has special bright metal trim inside and outside. Early in the model year, Ford will start production of a new four door Victoria style in which side pillars have

been eliminated to provide all around vision.

A 12-volt electrical system at standard on 956 models, providing 80 percent faster engine cranking and more capacity, to handle the increasing number of accessories being offered on cars today. The new 4 ampere Ford generator has 61 per cent greater power output than last year's model. Batteries have 22 per cent more capacity.

Optional convenience and comfort features in the 1956 Fords include power steering as well as power-operated brakes, seats, and window lifts. Air conditioning, fresh air heaters and tinted safety glass are available. This year Ford offers a signal seeking radio which automatically selects new stations. A dual-range automatic control adjusts the set for city or country listening.

Two new models have been added to the Ford truck line — T-750 tandem axle model in the heavy truck series, and a new, longer wheelbase pickup. Gross vehicle weights extend from 5,000 pounds on the pickup to 42,000 pounds on the heavy duty tandem axle models.

For 1956, Ford's cab design introduces increased visibility of the wrap around windshield and optional wrap around rear windows. Introduced for the first time to the trucking industry are two standard safety features — a safety steering wheel and safety door latches. Seat belts are optional.

As in the case of the cars, the wheel is designed with horn button to protect the driver's chest in event of crash. And the same safety door latch is available on cars and trucks. Tubeless tires, standard equipment this year, increase Ford truck economy. Larger payloads can be carried because tubeless tires and wheels weigh less, which is a very important feature to a trucker with 10 tires on his truck.

Last week we wrote of history recorded in the Old Testament. This study is of history in the New Testament.

The history of Christianity in the apostolic period is found in several New Testament books. These may be classified as biographical, historical, and the epistles.

The life of Christ is portrayed in the first four books of the New Testament by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. These are the biographical books, and they constitute the only source of information of the history of His life and work.

The one true book of history of the New Testament is that of Acts of apostles. This records the works of the apostles and the spread of the Christian religion over the world. Approximately the first thirty years of Christianity is recorded as a matter of history in this book.

Acts of Apostles, written by Luke (63 AD), is an accurate and reliable historical account of the early church. It gives a number of contemporary happenings which tie it into well-known events of the day, thus its accuracy and value as history is assured. The style of the book is that of a scholarly and well educated man of the times. Its author knew how to approach his subjects and how to present them according to sound principles of historiography.

The New Testament epistles, principally those of Paul, complete the material of the period dealing with the history of the church. These were not written as historical studies, but they give us much information of the movements of men and of Christianity throughout the world.
