## Jury Misconduct Hearing Today

However Labor Department and TEC officials took a spot survey at the meeting and were well enough convinced to set a date for another survey. Here, in the words of the County Agent, Homer Thompson, is what was done and agreed upon: Wayne Grant, District Director of T.E.C., consented Wednesday of last week, immediately after the called farmer's meeting here had adjourned, to send a wage survey representative to Cochran County to accept voluntary information on wage rates being paid the citizen cotton pullers in our fields.

Again may I stress that it is very important that every farmer who is working one or more citizen laborers pulling cotton come in and make this voluntary report so that the wage rate can be kept down where it belongs.

Thompson sent letters to Ed McDonald of the Department of Labor scoring the inadequate survey and to the TEC thanking them for arranging for other surveys; and D. E. Benham, who was in charge of the meeting last week, outlined the results in a report.
