### AIR AGE ASSISTANCE IN BRUSH CONTROL

Mesquite is getting more dense and larger on the pastures in this area. It is now a proven fact that cattle have swollen tongue and jaw disease when eating mesquite beans over a long period of time. It also takes four times as much

water to produce a pound of dry mesquite than it does to produce a pound of dry grass. It requires a little less than 500 lbs. of water to produce a pound of dry grass & it requires about 1700 lbs. of water to produce a pound of dry mesquite. Texas farmers are taking to the

air for maximum economy in brush control programs. Application of chemicals to control oak and mesquite is gaining in popularity by increasing forage production & boosting farm profits. Farmers should not expect "miracles" from chemical control and retreatment may be required in most cases advises A. H. Walker, Range Specialist. If properly done a good aerial control job will pay big dividends. Four important rules to remember: (1) Use the proper chemical at the right time and in the cor-

rect amount, (2) secure qualified personnel to do all flying jobs, (3) rest the treated areas after spraying and (4) use chemicals with caution, they are not poisonous, but drift can cause damage to susceptible crops.

Recommend that mesquite be sprayed 50 to 80 days after the 1st leaves appear and have turned a dark green color.

Apply a low volatile ester of 2, 4, 5-T or silvex at one third lb rate with a half gallon diesel oil and enough water to make 3 gallon of spray solution per acre.

Swath width should not exceed 60 feet. Regrowth mesquite requires 1/2 pound of 2,4,5-T mixed with fuel gallon of diesel oil and enough water to make 4 gallons of the sol-

ution per acre and put on in a 42 foot swath. Expect 25 to 35 percent root kill and count on re-treating in 5 years. Cost of the two treatments will be about \$11.50 per acre.

At the Spur Experimental Stations of stilbestrol and terramycin, yearling steer rations give higher, more economical gains and heavier carcasses on extended feeding trials than either stilbestrol or antibiotics alone.

Only slightly higher gains were noted on a 96 day feeding trial when cattle were given dual combinations of stilbestrol and terramycin, aureomycin or ilotycin. It was on a 140 day test that specialists detected a decided advantage for the mixture of additives.

Suggest, if interested in this feeding of anti biotics that you contact the County Agent or Mr. Marion at the Spur Experiment Station. To purchase calves 400 lbs. weight for feeders, suggest that you think of doing it in October or November. This is the seasonal low price period, usually and should be ready to market on the seasonal high price period — or April and May. Also, receive the spread in price of about 3 cents per pound due to gain — usually.

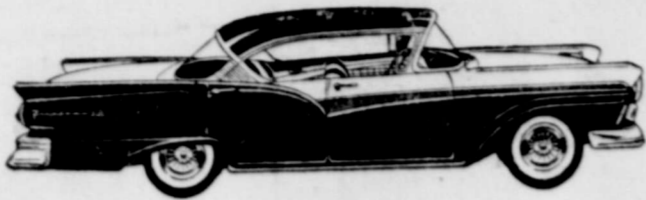

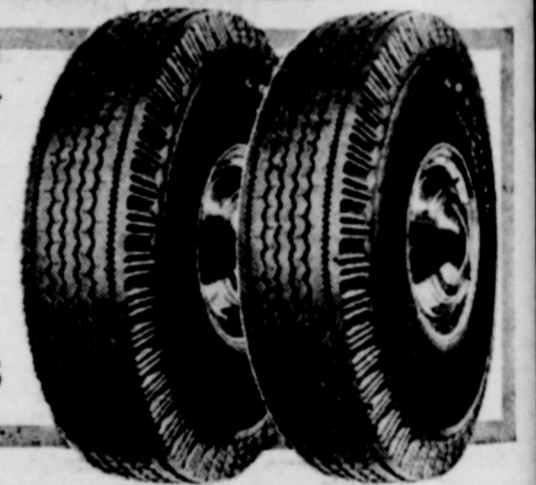

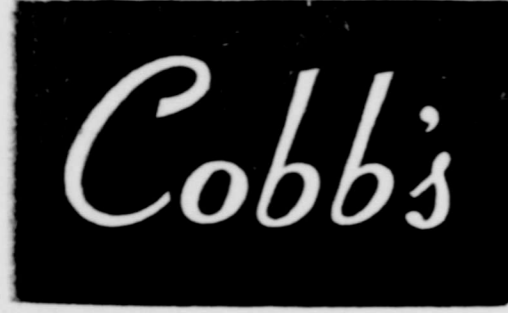
