

In order to get the full benefit of cover crop, it is best to plant

early in the fall, giving protection to the land throughout the fall and winter months. Many of the cooperators have found it more feasible to drill their cover crop dir ectly into their cotton or grain sor ghum stubble, never once leaving the land bare to blow. To take advantage of early fall rains, some cooperators have found it to be advantageous to drill in their cover crop following the last evaluation of their cotton and grain sorghums. It might also be important to include a soil improving crop, such as vetch or sweet clover, which would better prepare the land for nother cropping season.

If irrigation is anticipated, it might be well to apply approximately 100 pounds of 16-20-0 fertilizer per acre. This will give the cover crop maximum growth for better wind erosion protection.

O: course, the most important reason for cover crops is the protection of the soil against the wind. It is the best stabilizing measure we know of for cultivated land. A good cover crop reduces the loss of soil to practically nothing. Aside from its stabilizing ability, it offers much needed organic matter. Great amounts of organic matter are obwell as the production of nitrogen, tained from the foliage and fibrous root system. This factor aids in conserving what precipitation that falls and makes it more available
