basically that the date in which they will open, September 15th, is already time for league play to get underway. They also know that there will have to be a two week period or more before a lot of folks are ready to even consider bowling in leagues. And, what is even more important, they know that league bowling is the backbone of the financing of a bowling alley.

things is it desirable to have the preliminary secretarial work taken care of. Although it will not be possible to get leagues completely established, it will be possible even before the alley opens, to decide what types of leagues will be formed, what hours they will bowl, begin the outline of forming teams, and get the leagues themselves sanctioned by the American Bowling Congress.

At Monday's meeting, the City Secretary of the Lubbock City Bowling Association, and the secretary of women's leagues in Lubbock will both be on hand to help set up the initial operation.

The better the representation at the meeting, Van said, the better we will be able to tell what kind of league interest to expect. Now is also the time for groups to anticipate formation of leagues and specific hours during which they would like to bowl.

League bowling is a one night a week participation for players in the league. They bowl three games during that one night. Teams have five members bowling at one time, though many have a total of seven or eight players so they can have alternates in case one or two members fail to show up during a given weekly session.

League team sponsorship can take various forms, and at this initial meeting prospective sponsors will be able to better understand what can be done in the way of sponsoring teams, and also have a hand in setting up the plans to better suit their liking.

The importance of ABC sanctioning is stressed because any bowler, going from one town to another, entering state or national tournaments, or competing in any other way, must have ABC sanctioning before he can compete.

Although there are a lot of folks in Morton and Cochran County who have bowled, and some who have been regular members of leagues, there is a substantial majority who don't understand how leagues operate, how to keep score, or any of the rules. This initial meeting will offer a good opportunity for those who will be bowling, to get together enough to know exactly what direction in which we are moving.

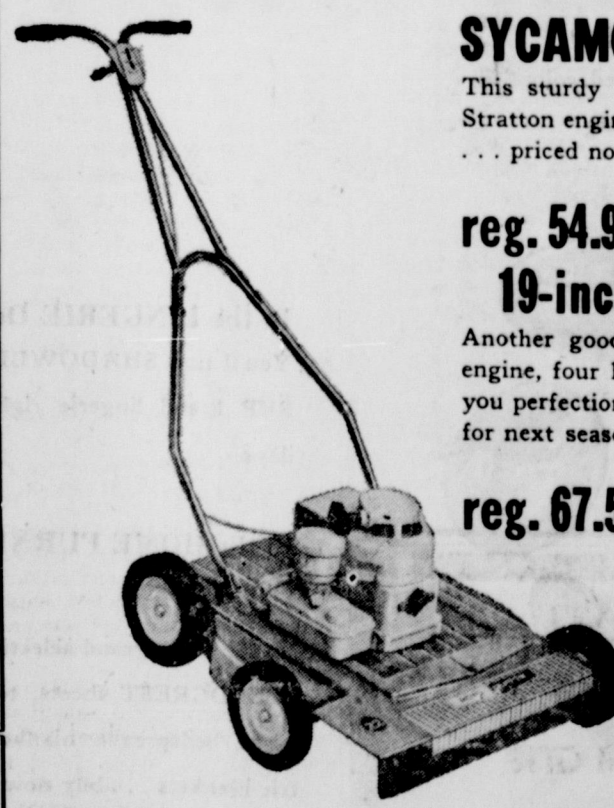
