AREN'T YOU GLAD that we nve in a small town where the older citizens sit out on their front lawns on a summer evening, waving to folks who are out for their nightly walk, and watching the neighbor children playing? Many Americans are not as lucky as we.

A recent Gallup Poll showed that four out of ten citizens of our country are afraid to walk alone in their neighborhoods at night and ten per cent even feel unsafe in their own homes. Many people think that the court system leans too far toward protecting the criminal element, leaving the victimized citizenry at the mercy of hoodlums who are habitually recycled back into society time and again after repeated arrests and convictions.

The Supreme Court recently gave us another rather controversial ruling, other than the welland the flag.

The decision regarding the death penalty for juvenile offenders has sparked heated arguments. Opponents of the decision deplore the ruling, calling it "barbaric" to execute someone at an age when he or she is too young to vote, join the military or purchase alcoholic beverages.

An article in the Amarillo Daily News recently quoted Charles Fulwood, a spokesman for Amnesty International, as saying "It is difficult to see how the U.S. lecture the Chinese government on summary executions, when it up to its neck in the machinery of executing persons

In the Texas Panhandle area. people have been especially offended by what a 17-year-old punk did to an elderly nun at a convent in Amarillo. Regardless of whether you are a Catholic, protestant, athiest or Jew, you tend to feel a certain respect for a woman of 76 years who had devoted her life to the service of her religious convictions. The 1982 Halloween night rape, stabbing and strangulation murder at the St. Francis Convent almost has

overtones of Satanism. It is impossible to think of the perpetrator of this brutal crime as a juvenile. By his own actions, this person has made himself into a very expendable member of society, regardless of his age at the time of the crime.

We live in fear of what such a person would do if returned to society, either by the parole system or by prison escape. And so we breathe a sigh of relief each time someone like Jay Kelly Pinkerton or John Gacy is executed, but the nagging fear returns each time someone like Charles Manson comes up for parole.

Opponents of the court's ruling have asked "How can we achieve the goal of being a "kinder, gentler nation" when we allow the execution of our young?" About nine per cent of the nation's homicides are committed by juveniles. The Supreme Court's decision sends the message that youth will be held accountable for their crimes regardless of their age. We cannot become that kinder, gentler nation until we rid our streets of the violence which preys upon the kind and gentle people.

Our little town is made up mostly of kind and gentle people. Fortunately, there aren't very many of the other kind here. Aren't you glad that we live in an area where people can sit out on their front lawns on a summer evening? Personally, I hope it stays that way for a long, long time.





Accidental Discovery May End Obesity

WASHINGTON - Obesity may be controlled naturally with a new type of pill, discovered by accident, a research scientist confirmed recently.

In studies, scientists noted an unusual side effect. Patients receiving an ingredient in what is now being called FS-1 all lost weight, while body weight in control groups remained constant.

The program has job developers on staff who are in constant contact with the Friona business community, to place participants into jobs or on the job training.

The On The Job Training Program is administered by Panhandle Regional Planning Commission. The Panhandle Regional Planning Commission has been servicing disadvantaged people in the Panhandle area for more than 20
