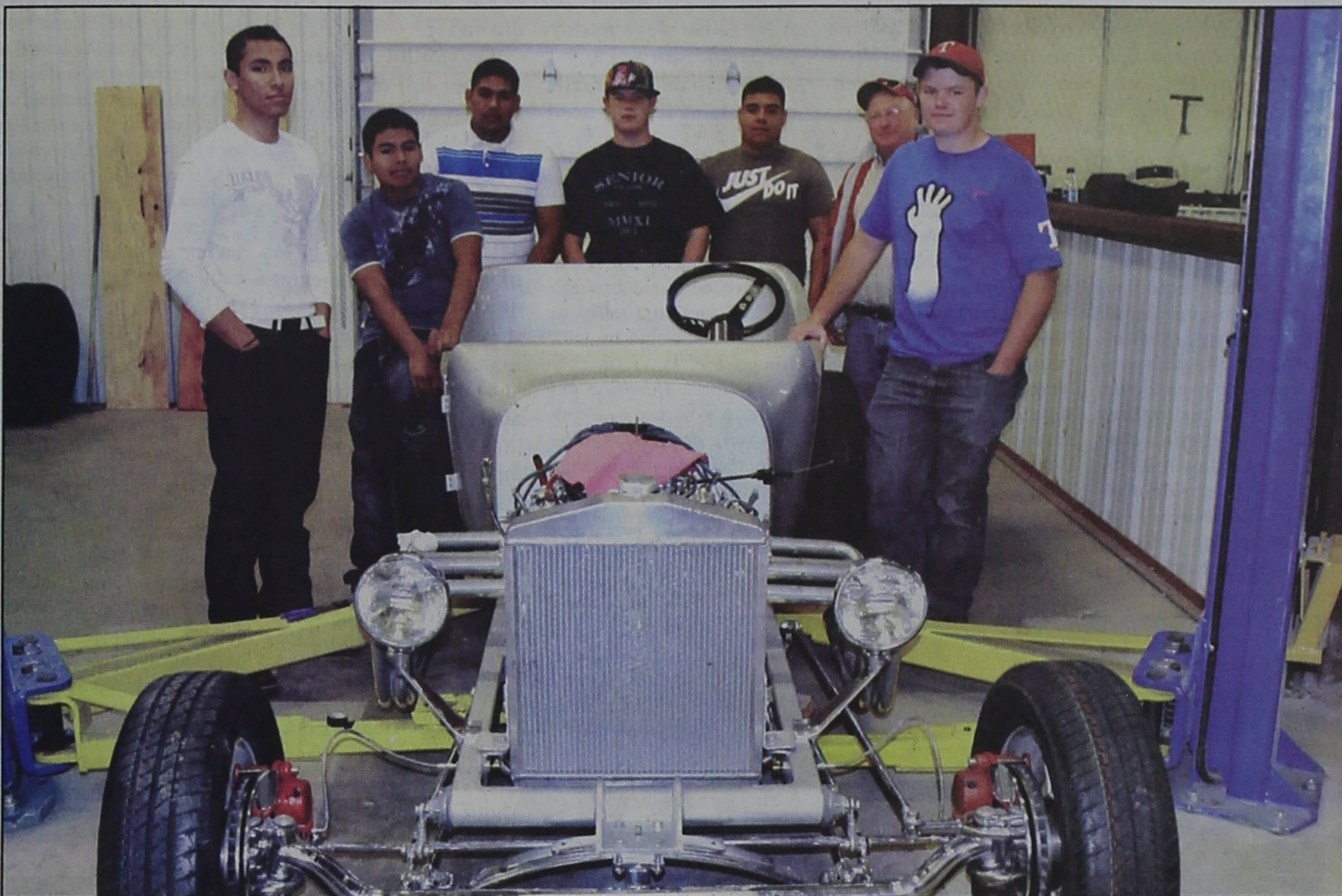

Council to consider no parking zone and bids for equipment sale

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday May 9 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public. Time is reserved at the beginning of the meeting for public comments.

The tentative agenda lists 10 items for council consideration and action. To be considered are: an interlocal agreement between Bovina and Friona to use the Bovina

drug dog; an interlocal agreement between the city and the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) for a regional emergency notification system; and a report from the police department on budget, expenses, personnel, and upcoming activities and events.

The council will be asked to authorize city manager Patricia Phipps to solicit and accept bids for the sale of bicycles, computer moni-

tors, printers, keyboards, mouse, fax/copy machine, phones, vehicle light bars, spotlight, radio mount boxes, vehicle camera, and vehicle cages.

The council will also consider authorizing Phipps to sign the Parmer Medical Center mutual aid memorandum of understanding and to authorize her to solicit and accept bids for a new roof for the city offices at 617, 619, 621, and 623 Main St.

Discussion will be held to extend the depository agreement with Friona State Bank for an additional one year ending April 30, 2012.

At the last council meeting Ordinance 2011.05.09 to amend the city code of ordinances related to no parking of vehicles on certain streets was postponed until the May meeting. It will be revisited Monday, specifically no parking between the 1300 and 1400 block of Cleveland

and 325' on the south side of 14th and Cleveland to the alley as requested by Parmer Medical Center.

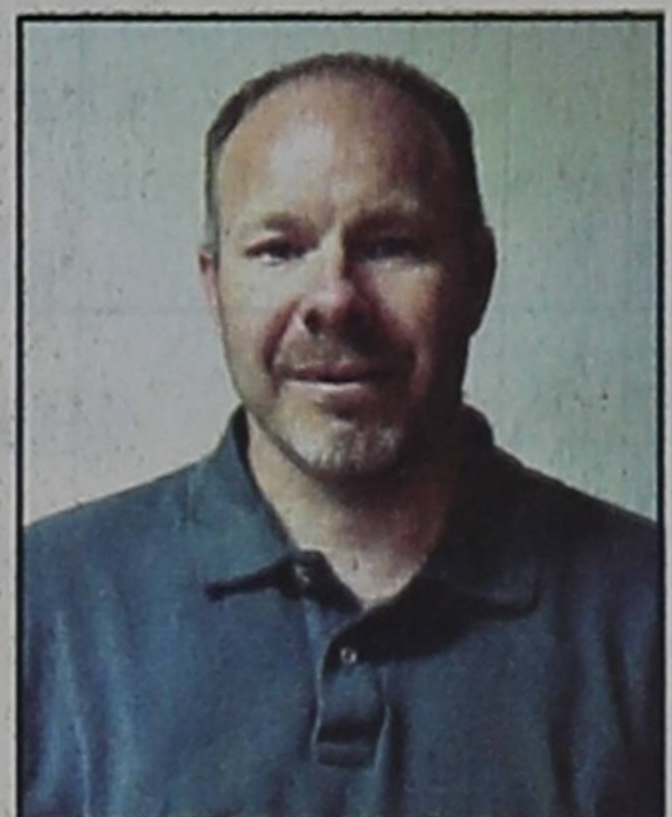
The council will consider and take action on the accounts payable and the financial statement for April 2011 before adjournment. The above items comprise the tentative council agenda and are subject to change. The official final agenda is posted on the window at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

School board early voting underway

The early voting period for the May 14 school board election is underway. It runs May 2-10 and voting is at the school administration office.

The May 14 election will take place at the city council chambers, 619 Main St. A sample ballot is included in this issue of the Star. Two places on the school board are being contested by six candidates. Voters have two votes and can cast both votes for one candidate or one vote each for two candidates. The Friona Star contacted each candidate for a photo and brief biography. Each candidate expressed a desire to participate in and give back to the community. The candidates are:



Tracy Bunker

Tracy and his wife Suzanne have four children; Courtney, 13, Bryce 11, Caden, 6, and Aubrey 3. He moved to Friona in 1995 and has owned and operated Bunker Trucking since 1999.

He is the only incumbent in the election and is seeking his third term on the FISD board of trustees. In addition to operating his trucking business and serving on the school board, Tracy is active on the board of the local Kids Inc baseball organization.

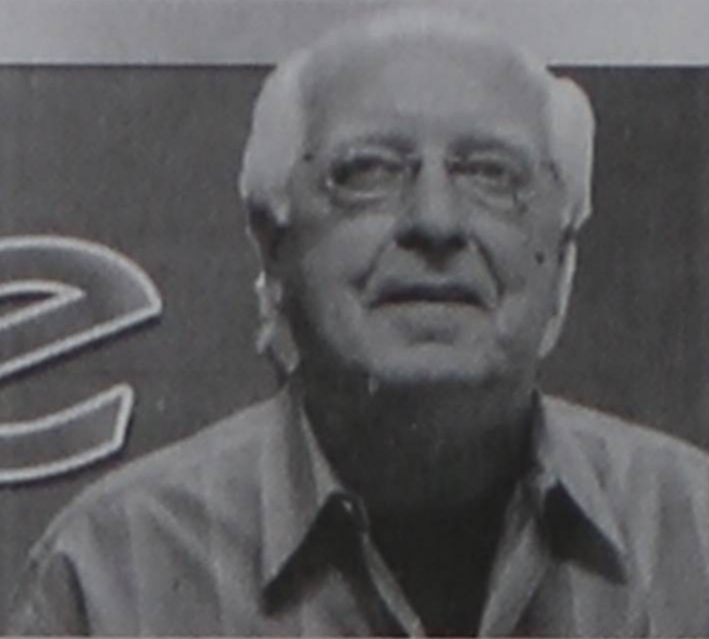


Greg O'Brian

Head-on accident injures three

A head-on collision Tuesday evening about 6:45 p.m. sent three people to area hospitals. The accident happened approximately five miles south of Friona on Hwy 214 when a northbound Volkswagen passenger car attempted to pass another vehicle and collided with a 1998 Mercury traveling southbound and occupied by Robert and Peggy McGehee of the Lazbuddie area.

Friona firemen, who had just returned to the station af-

ter battling a grass fire southeast of Friona, responded to the scene and used their jaws of life to extract Mr. McGehee from the vehicle. Mrs. McGehee was said to have a compound fracture of the femur among other injuries. Both were transported to PMC then to Amarillo. Both Friona and Bovina EMS were dispatched to the accident.

Two unidentified males occupied the Volkswagen passenger car. The passenger

in the vehicle was transported to PMC with a broken arm and other injuries. The driver was checked over at the scene by EMS and later taken to Parmer County jail by DPS Trooper Maltos, the investigating officer. The driver did not have a license and both men were determined to be undocumented immigrants. Sheriff Randy Gerries said the driver would be held until his status and any charges can be determined.

Having known Mitch most of my life and knowing what a quality mechanic he is, I had confidence it was a well-built machine. He wanted to sell the car to finance the next school project and I wanted to fulfill a lifelong dream. At the end of the day both of us were extremely happy.

The car now resides at our home in Katy, Texas. We drive it around town and the surrounding area on the weekends. Everyone we pass typically looks at the car and waves. We even had people roll down their windows and tell us what a sharp looking car we have. It is one of those cars you are proud to own.

Long term we will probably enter it in some of the local parades and car shows. We have even talked about bringing it back to Friona someday so it can roll down Main St. one more time in the annual Maize Days parade.

The students, under the tutelage of Mitch Terry, built a wonderful car I am very proud of. I'm quite sure they were proud of their accomplishment and bet they learned a lot about machines and working together to build such a fantastic project.

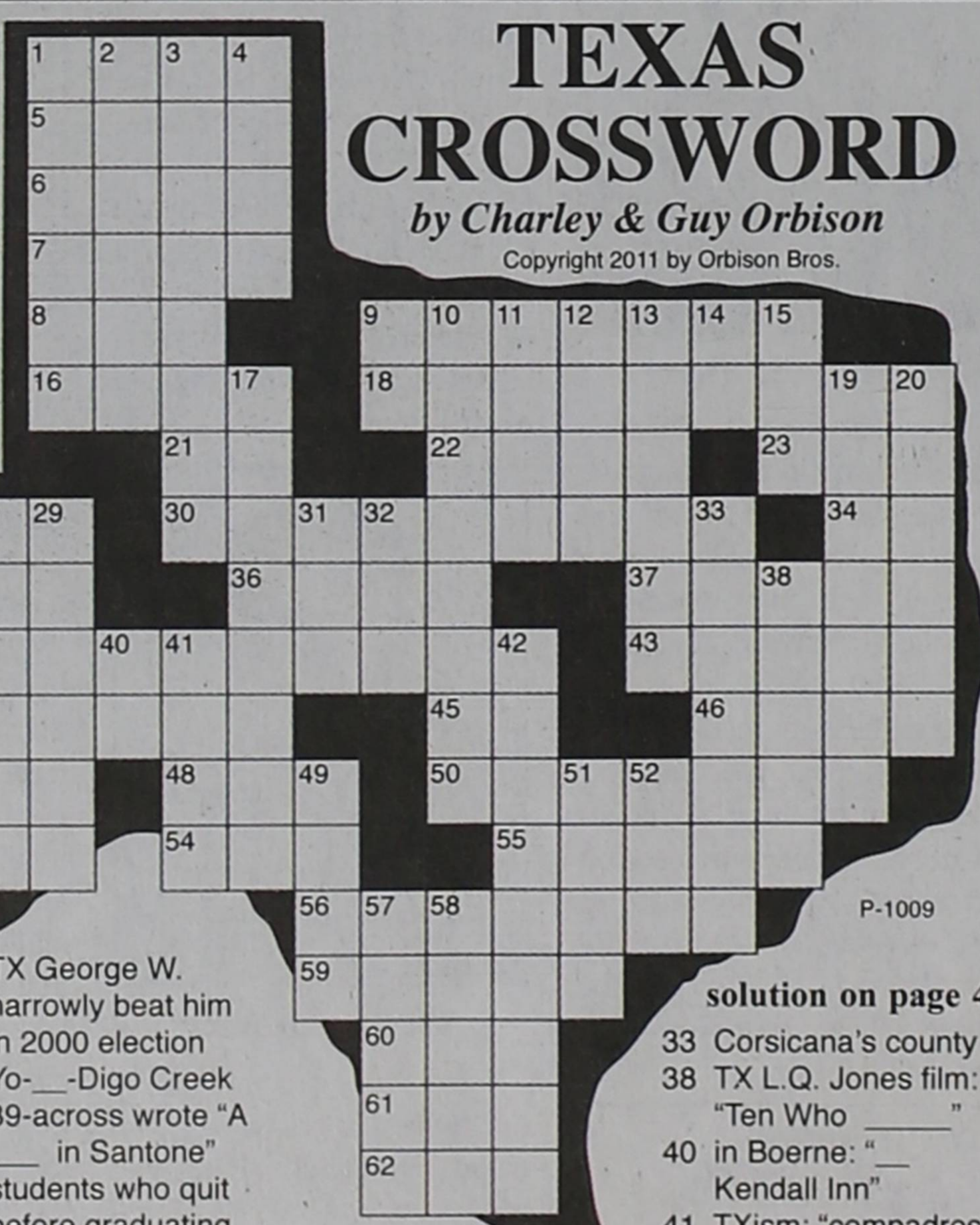

For buying our clothes too big, confident we would grow into them, (we did).

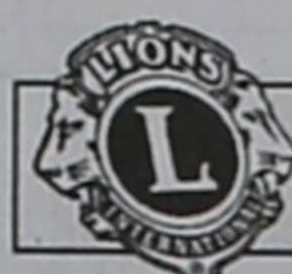
For that firm hand and stern look usually preceded by our first, middle and last name, so we would know for sure we were in trouble.

Happy Mother's Day and God bless you, Moms.

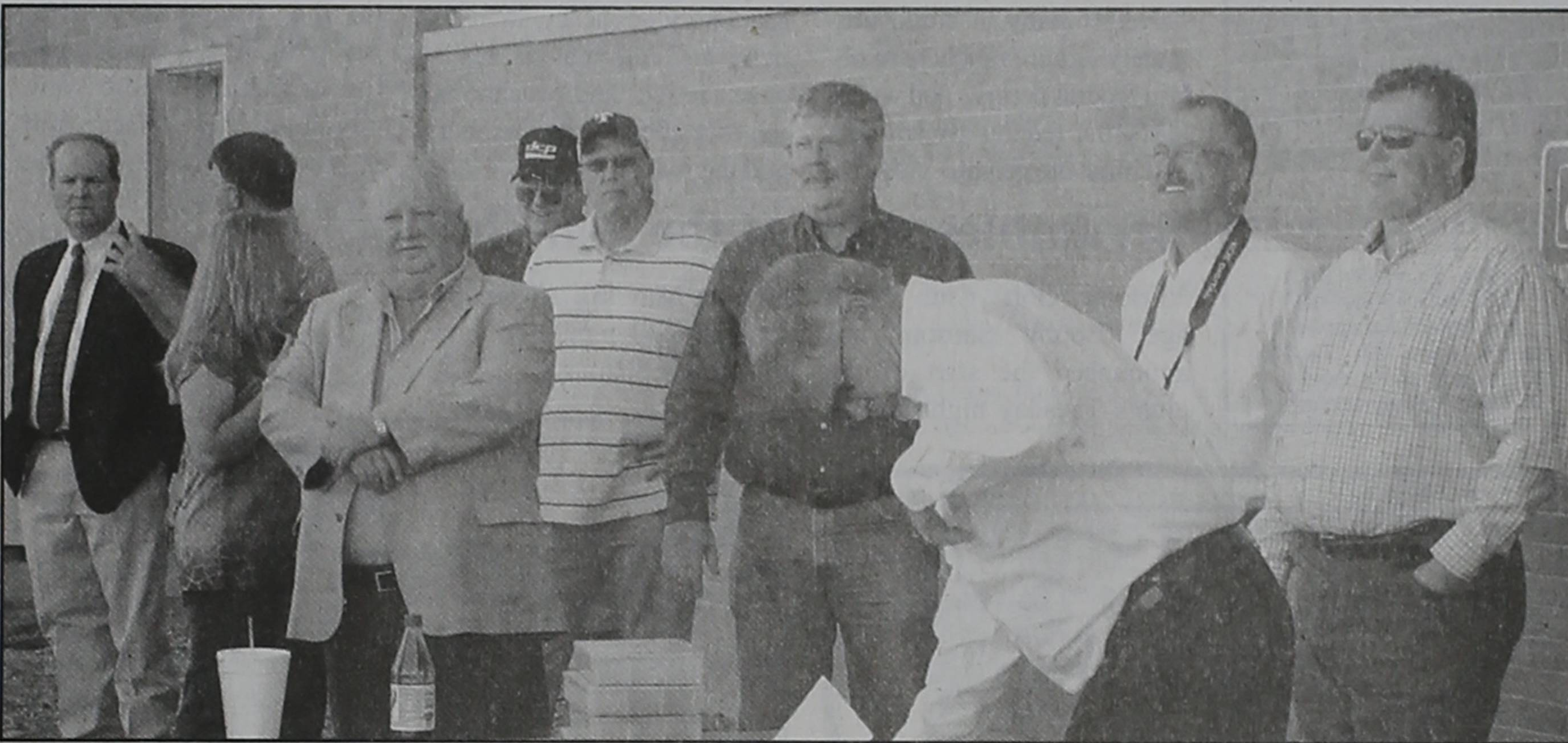

EPA private water regulations harmful

The Obama Administration has issued guidance documents that would allow the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Army Corps of Engineers to regulate private bodies of water. This guidance reverses U.S. Supreme Court decisions and circumvents the lawmaking process as intended by U.S. Congress and the U.S. Constitution.

In 2010, the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association (TSCRA) and other industry organizations worked to defeat a bill in Congress that would have given the EPA this authority.

"This debate has already happened in Congress. TSCRA worked closely with other agriculture organizations to stop this sweeping regulation and kept it from becoming law," said Joe Parker, Jr., rancher and president of TSCRA. "Now, the Administration has completely disregarded that, and instead, has taken a backdoor approach so it can further regulate the private property of landowners."

The Clean Water Jurisdiction Guidance would negatively affect ranchers by giving the federal government unprecedented regulatory authority over water bodies such as stock tanks, drainage ditches, ponds, small and intermittent streams, creek beds, playa lakes and mud holes.

Additionally, it could ultimately require ranchers to obtain federal permits and would allow the federal government to come on private property

for inspections. The permits and enforcement would make it necessary for ranchers to hire engineers and attorneys to guide them through the permitting process and defend themselves against unnecessary federal regulation.

A 60-day comment period will begin as soon as the draft guidance is published in the Federal Register. TSCRA will submit comments on behalf of the more than 15,000 cattle raisers it represents.

The Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association is a 134-year-old trade organization. As the largest and oldest livestock association in Texas, TSCRA represents more than 15,000 beef cattle producers, ranching families and businesses who manage approximately 4 million head of cattle on 51.5 million acres of range and pasture land, primarily in Texas and Oklahoma. TSCRA provides law enforcement and livestock inspection services, legislative and regulatory advocacy, industry news and information, insurance services and educational opportunities for its members and the industry.

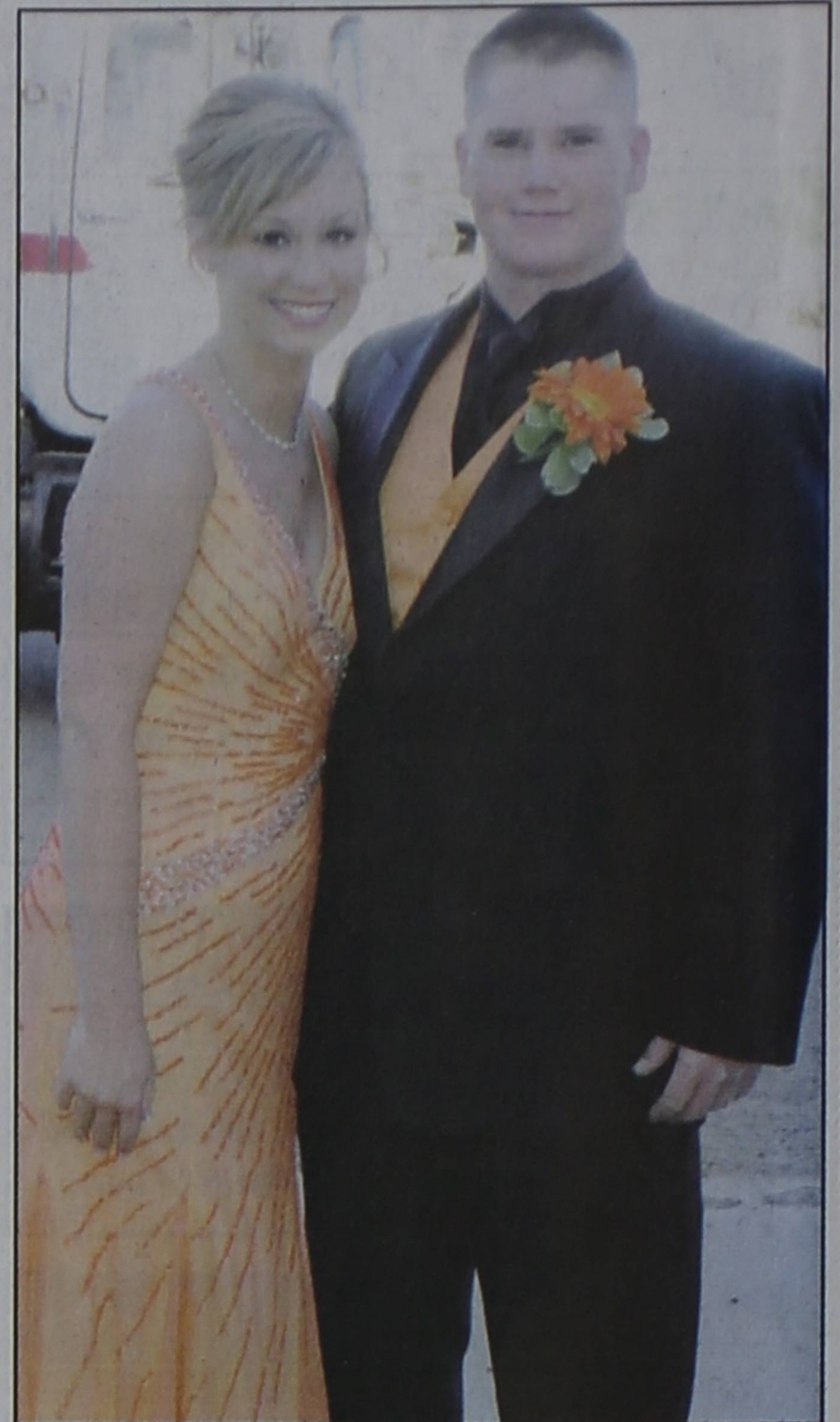

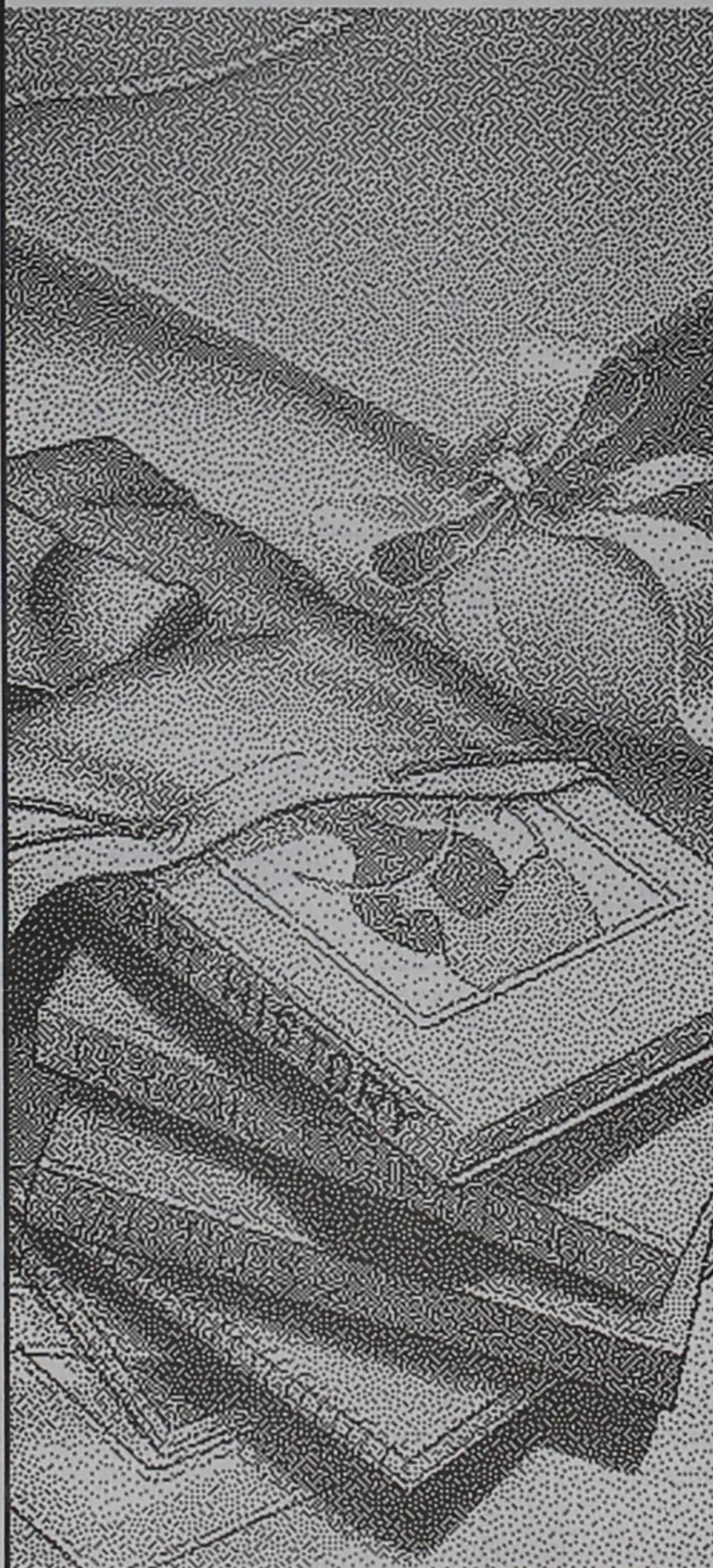
