What is the purpose of the proposed one percent sales tax to be voted April 3, 1971 by
The reason as explained by city officials, is to raise necessary funds without putting an even greater burden on the property owner, whom they feel already is carrying an excessive tax load. They note that the Texas Legislalture realized this situation and provided an avenue whereby municipalities could equalize taxes.

Scores of Lone Star State towns and cities have adopted the one percent sales tax plan.
Texas Municipal League points out that two of the main assets of a sales tax are (1) Providing a means of financing to substantiate the ad valorem tax, which has virtually reached its peak; and (2) Being a fair tax, with each family being taxed only on items which are re-

Among pressing needs of Morton are a new fire truck and fire fighting equipment which remain at the disposal of town and rural dwellers alike. The insurance key rate will be effected if the presnet fire truck is not replaced in thenear future. This effects the insurance rate of

A continuing project is seal coating for city streets. Every street should receive a seal coat
Wages and other city expenses increase as the cost of living rises. Meanwhile, the ad valorem tax structure fails to produce additional in come.

Combining these and other factors the City Council decided that a city sales tax was generally the most advisable avenue. This plan, they were told is working in towns and cities across the state without placing an undue burden on anyone, especially older property owners.
