Parental Involvement Meetings Are Set May 8


There have been two times set for Title I Parental Involvement Meetings to be held on May 8.





The Friona public water system has been recognized for an outstanding level of compliance in monthly monitoring related to the "Total Coliform Rule." The TCEQ notified Mayor John Taylor and City Manager Terri Johnson that for the five-year period, 1997-2001, Friona's public water system had no monitoring or maximum contaminant level (MCL) violations of the "Total Coliform Rule."

A certificate was awarded to the city, "in recognition of your public water system's outstanding performance," said Buck Henderson, Manager of the TCEQ Public Drinking Water Section. "Please congratulate your staff and management for a job well done."

I Guess I Should Have Gotten A Job Description

DEAR SWEET OLD JUNE FLOYD who worked in one capacity or another for the Star for 40 years, (she was here before we were) used to get a kick out of telling this story. It was in the early 60s, and we were still fairly new in Friona. Everyone was out of the front office and June needed to run an errand

so she asked me to sit with the office, take phone messages, etc. and she'd be back in about 30 minutes.

During that 30 minutes we had a couple of "tell so-and-so to call me back" and one classified ad. When June returned and checked over what I'd written down, she nearly died laughing. Remember, I grew up as a city girl, only visiting relatives down on the farm every few years or so. The classified ad read "For Sale: breaded sows and guilts."

What did I know about animal husbandry, for cryin' out loud? How was I to know that these were actually pregnant sows that had been BRED, not breaded? Why didn't the guy just tell me that in the first place?

And as to "guilts". . . well, I thought that was when you got a couple of traffic tickets and failed to tell your husband, so you felt pretty guilty about it. Another lesson in farm lore right then and there, and I learned that a GILT is a little girl pig that is not yet ready to be "breaded."

After that, I didn't get asked to sit in the front office anymore and if you have ever stopped by the newspaper office, you know that Carol is usually found in the "back shop." That's why I've always been listed in the paper as "everything

published, names of the publisher, editor and others on the staff. Carol is always down at the bottom of the list, as "everything else," which just about covers stuff that anyone else didn't want to do. Gosh, they're going to miss me around

Here are just a few of those "everything else" items:

Early on, the local Chamber of Commerce was without a manager part of the time, but we did have several nice downtown stores, department stores, cleaners, dress shops, etc. So Bill and I talked the merchants into staying open late one evening during the Christmas shopping season and we talked hefty fellow into donning a Santa suit so he could stroll through the stores. Then later he was to go sit in the City Park and talk to the kiddos and pass out candy canes. Wait a minute! Sit on what? I raced home, put one of our living room chairs into the back of the station wagon and brought it back down to the park so Santa could sit on something.

In April 1968, the brand new Missouri Beef Packing Plant (now EXCEL) was getting ready to hold our big festive open house, tours through the plant, etc. I thought we should try to lend some dignity to the proceedings, so I drew off a pattern for a large key, about one foot tall by three feet long, and took it to the lumber yard, where they rolled their eyes and then cut the key out of some nice wood, which I spray-painted gold. During the welcoming ceremonies, Mayor Preach Edelmon presented this "Key to the City" to the big wigs from the office of the packing plant. I kept that key pattern in a file at the office for many years just in case another such occasion should ever arise. It never did, but I guess the ribbon-cuttings for new businesses sort of grew out of that idea.

I don't know how I got rooked into this next deal. The newspaper has sponsored a Little League Baseball Team practically from the year one. Well, one summer for some reason I got the distinct non-privilege of laundering all those stinky little team uniforms twice each week. The following summer I pulled a real stubbon streak and said NO WAY!

Perhaps my fondest memory of our days with the paper is of our precious Elva Lou Lewellen. In addition to mothering all of us, she put our ads together, brought fantastic chicken salad sandwiches for our lunches at the office, and made at least one quilt for everyone in the office. On two occasions Elva Lou and Tom gathered up the whole herd of us, spouses, children and all, and took us up to their marvelous Lewellen cabin at South Fork, Colorado for a long weekend. . . once in 1969 and again in 1973. She used to say "You don't work FOR Bill and Carol, you work WITH them." She was one classy person.

Another pleasant memory is the 1970 Panhandle Press Association Convention in Amarillo when Bill was the president. He asked Eva Miller and her Trebelaires to entertain at the PPA luncheon. At that time the Trebs consisted of Kathy McLean, Carleen Greeson, Carolyn Murphree, Nancy Martinez, Ann Hurst, Esther Smith, Cindy Barnett, Sally Kendrick, Denise Buske and Janet Mingus.

We had big crowds at the Press Conventions back in those days and the pretty girls with their peppy vocal numbers in close harmony were a big hit. Eva had started her Trebelaires vocal group back in the fifties when the girls would sing at the USO in Amarillo, as well as for radio, TV and club programs. They were a favorite of Cotton John on Channel 4. Later, our daughter Laura was a Trebelaire in '78/'79. Friona folks miss having the Trebs around now to call upon for musical programs.

Then a year or so later, Bill invited Mary Rando to perform her rousing rendition of "I Am The Nation" at another PPA Convention. Congressman Bob Price was on hand for that one and was so impressed with Mary, that he had her come to Washington to perform the piece on the floor of Congress.

Shipley passed away Sunday, April 27, 2003, at a nursing home in Waco.


He was born December 20, 1913, near St. Vrain, N.M., to John and Nancy Shirley

Another FHS senior, Adam Bandy, placed third in both the long jump and the 400-


meter dash. He missed out by only six inches earning a spot in the

Make sure you know what you originally paid for the stock (its "tax basis"), how long you've held it and its fair market value at the date of the gift. You'll also need to determine if you have to pay gift taxes. (You can give up to \$11,000 per year, free of gift taxes, to as many people as you want.) Your mother will need this information to determine gains or losses when she decides to sell the stock you've given her.

Both you and your mother can gain valuable tax advantages from your gift of stock. When you gave your mother the stock, you also gave her your "holding period"--the amount of time you've held the stock. So, even if she only owns the stock for a day or so before selling it, she'll just have to pay the long term conital gains tay rate, which may be to pay the long-term capital gains tax rate, which may be considerably lower than her current income tax rate. And by giving your mother the shares of stock, you will also benefit-because you'll avoid the capital gains you'd have to pay if you sold the stock yourself. However, before taking any action, consult with your tax adviser to discuss these issues.

As an alternative to giving your mother shares of stock outright, you might also consider contributing to her IRA. She can put in up to \$3,000 per year to a Traditional or Roth IRA--and, if she's 50 or over, she can add an extra \$500 in "catch-up" contributions.

If your mother is elderly and has health issues, she may be dealing with the high cost of prescription drugs. If so, consider taking over some of her pharmacy bills. You can make it easy for her by setting up a credit account, in your

name, at her local pharmacy.

Here's another health-care-related issue you might want to think about: long-term care. Your mother may never need to enter a nursing home, but it's still a possibility for which you'll want to be prepared--especially when you consider that the average cost of a year's stay at a nursing home is now around \$50,000. And in some cities, it can cost almost twice that

To help protect your mother's financial independence, you may want to encourage her to transfer the risk of paying for exorbitant long-term care costs to an insurance company. By purchasing a long-term care policy for your mother, you can cover nursing home stays, home health care and other costly services. If you're pondering this move, though, don't wait too

long, because premiums increase with age.

By pursuing any of these ideas, you can provide your mother with a Mother's Day gift that can last long after the flowers have wilted and the candy is eaten. And if you don't want your father to get jealous, you could use all these suggestions to give combined Mother's and Father's Day
