A new conservation farming
technique saved an estimated 1.8 million gallons of tractor Yuel in Texas this year,
reports an official of the U.S Soil Conservation Service. . Edward E. Thomas, state conservationist for the SCS in
Temple said minimum tillage Temple said minimum tillage farming systems elaminated per acre during 1973 on about "A tractor burns about gallon of fuel per acre for the average farming operation," Thomas said. "Eliminating reduces fuel consumption by five gallons of,, gasoline or diesel per acre.
To haul 1.8 million gallons of fuel in railroad tank cars woutd require a train nearly two miles long.
Thomas predicted even greater fuel savings in the
future as more farmers turn to the new system.
Way from being perfected way from being perfected," come a long way in the last 3 years. If similar gains can be conservation farmers will be able to make a major contribution in helping ease
the energy crunch, With minimum tillage crops are plented directly into the stalks and leaves left over
the previous crop without the previous crop without
prior prearation.
Herbicides are used to control
weeds, cutting out several
tractor trips over a field. tractor trips over a field.
Some farmers report mimimum tillage saves as
manyas 10 to 12 tractor trips many as 10 to 12 tractor trips
per crop. A statewide average per crop. A statewide average The surface cover of dead
leaves and stems greatly leaves and stems greatly
reduces wind erosion dust revuces wind erosion, dust practice is equally effective in preventing water erosion and
sedimentation from cropland. sedimentation rom cropland.
Thomas said one of the big problems with minimum tillage is that surface-applied weeds don't always work properly on all soils in Texas. $\underset{\text { dependable herbicides adapted }}{\text { He said better more }}$ to mulch farming are needed. Thomas credited the state's
conservation farmers with conservation farmers
helping develop minimum tillage farming systems. "Thispractice was evolved by trial and error during the
last few years," Thomas said. "SCS agronomists, researchers, chemical companies, conservation
district leaders, and district leaders, and
innovative farmers have all had a part in developing the measure. We only hope
continued progress can be made in this field.
With 20 million acreas of cropland in Texas, long-term fuel saving possibilities by
improved methods of mimimum tillage are huge,
Thomas pointed out.
