| With farm and ranch income fluctuating considerably from 1973 to 1974, producers may want to consider a technique called "income averaging,"' says Dr. the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. <br> 'Income averaging'" can reduce taxes in situations wher taxable income changes measurably from year to year.
