## Floyd Deputy Indicted

On Misconduct Charges
PLAINVIEW: A Hale County grand
jury Monday indicted former Floyd County deputy indicted former Flif Eddie Anzayd
on an official misconduct charge but refused to truecill him in in connection With the June rape of a year-old
Vernon woman. Aernon woman.
Anzaldua had been accused of
stopping the woman's car on U.S. 70 ust inside of Hale County and raping The oficial misconduct charge, a Class A misdemeanor, carries a $\$ 2.000$
fine or one year in prison or both. The grand jury suggested the rape accusation be further investigated by
Floyd County authorities and that any
action on it be taken in that county.

The grand jury indictment rendered Monday said, "On or about the 7th day
of June 1976, Eddie Anzaldua, a Floyd County police officer, with intent to harm another, to wit: Clara Chappell,
did then and there intentionally and did then and there intentionally and
knowingly commit and act relating to
his office and employment that his office and employment that
consstituted an unauthorized exercise of onstituted an unauthorized exercise
his official power...by taking Clara
Chappell into custody for the purpose of haveving sexual intercourse with the
said Clara Chappell."

Hale County district attorney
Marvin Marshall said he would dismiss the rape charge as a result of the erand
jury finding, and $54 t h$ district judge jury finding, and 54 th district judge
John Thomas Boyd set bond at $\$ 750$ on
the official misconduct charge. The
rape bond had been set at $\$ 12,500$.

Anzaldua was suspended from the

investigation of the case.
