Today, in West Texas, we travel to the seafood markets available to purchase the ingredients for an exquisite seafood meal prepared and enjoyed "at home on the Plains." Sharon Hillis, Floyd County Extension Agent (Home Economics) conducted the workshop, attended by 25 Home Demonstration club members from all areas of Floyd County.

Home Economist, Kathy Burk, Home Service Advisor of Lighthouse Electric and Laura Rowan, Home Economist of Floydada, assisted Mrs. Hillis in conducting the workshop.

Teaching points in the workshop included: Market forms, quality, nutritive values, and preparation methods of fish. Participants engaged in cleaning, dressing, preparing and garnishing a wide variety of seafood resulting in an unusual array of seafood dishes.

Participants declared the workshop "excellent" and will enjoy preparing new seafood dishes for family and friends from the wide variety of recipes received at the workshop. A "Real treat" is in store for these fortunate ones.

- SAVANNAH STUFFED SHRIMP**  
 2 pounds raw jumbo shrimp (24-30), fresh or frozen  
 7 ounces (fresh or canned) crabmeat drained, flaked, & cartilage removed  
 1/4 teaspoon salt  
 2 teaspoons margarine or butter  
 1/4 cup finely chopped onion  
 2 tablespoons finely chopped green onion  
 2 tablespoons finely chopped celery  
 2 tablespoons finely chopped green pepper  
 1 tablespoon chopped parsley  
 1 clove garlic, minced  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper  
 2 eggs, beaten  
 1 can (5-1/2 ounces) evaporated milk  
 1 cup all-purpose flour  
 3 cups soft (fine) white

Twist tie and leave end for shaping the bird's tail.

### NEWS 'N' NOTES

(by Sharon Hillis)

Squash is no longer classified "summer" or "winter" but by hardness of the shell and maturity.

What may be called summer squash is more correctly labeled soft shell. And hard shell is the name for squash more plentiful during the winter.

This is the season of the year when hard shell squash is coming to market. Varieties now available include acorn, buttercup, butternut and Hubbard.

Consumers buying hard

shell squash should be sure the rind is firm. This vegetable will keep for several weeks if stored in a moderately cool, dry place. It does not require refrigeration.

Hard shell squash has golden-colored flesh which is dry with a "sweetish" taste. Golden or yellow-orange-colored flesh is the sign of Vitamin A content.


Smaller types of hard shell squash, like the acorn, are usually cut in half, seed removed, baked, seasoned

and served in the shell.

The larger squash, such as Hubbard, are usually cut into pieces, baked, pulp removed, mashed and seasoned. Or, you may prefer to remove seeds, cut off the rind, boil, mash and season. Hard shell squash may be more easily cut if placed in boiling water for about 10 minutes.

The fastest speed at which a giant tortoise can crawl is about five yards a minute.

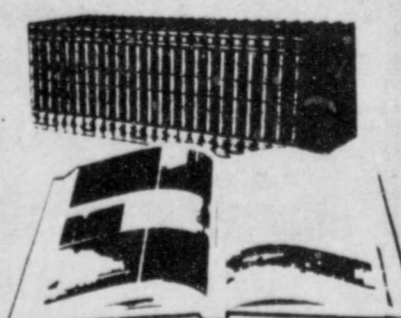

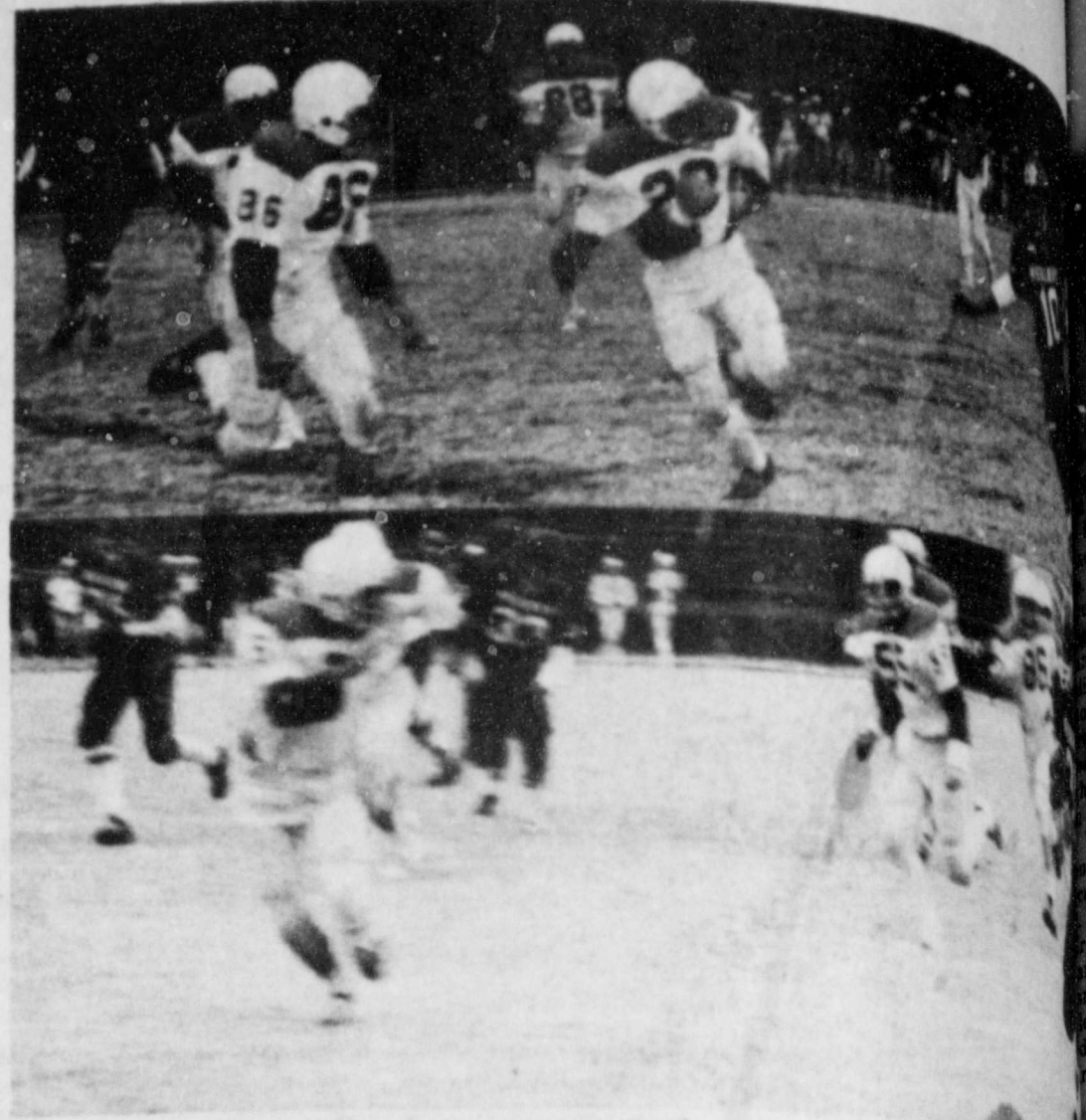

The plane crashed about 100 yards from huge powerlines and the Allmon-Petersburg highway...and an old house.

Mrs. Barton tried to stop one car that passed her by...then she and the children stopped a pickup driven by Floyd farmer Roger Dawdy. Roger, Johnny Hicks and Stephen De La Cruz had been working near Idalou and were on their way home in the snow storm. "It took a few minutes to learn the situation, as the mother and children were hysterical," Dawdy said. He said he found Mr. Barton crawling in the snow near the plane. Barton was placed in the pickup seat with Dawdy, the rest in the back of the pickup, and they headed for Caprock Hospital.

About a mile down the road, they borrowed Mrs. Eddy Fullingim's car...Dawdy went to the hospital, the rest followed in the Fullingim car. "It was a slow enough trip in the snow storm, but when you have a man that you fear is bleeding to death in the front seat with you...the trip really got slow," Dawdy said. Dawdy said Barton never lost consciousness, told him his blood type, address and other information, should he lose consciousness. The Bartons were flying to Lubbock to visit his parents and see the TECH-SMU ball game, and had received weather clearance before leaving Irving. Mr. Barton was moved to Lubbock Methodist hospital intensive care Saturday morning. Mr. Barton's parents took the children to their home in Lubbock Saturday and Mrs. Barton was also taken to their home Sunday. "It was only a miracle of the Good Lord that saved us," Mrs. Barton said.

*...we didn't know what we would land on!*

The Don Barton family from ... was hit the Plains snowstorm ... Friday night, they knew ... to land...they had lost radio ... they didn't know where they ...  
... lights were just not ... we didn't know when we ... land whether we would hit ... trees, houses, or what," Mrs. ... from her hospital room at ... Hospital.  
... came down in a grain ... stalk field on the Patterson ... at a mile west of the Allmon ... thought we were down safe ... plane started to roll, but then ... into the irrigation ditch," ... son said.  
... and 13 year-old son ... were in the front seat of the ... and they suffered wind- ... Mrs. Barton and ten year ... were in the back seat. ... Barton suffered a broken wrist

and broken ankle, his face was a mass of broken bones and blood.  
Their first thought was to crawl away from the plane should it catch fire. The plane's nose wheel folded under when it hit the ditch. The plane crashed about 100 yards from huge powerlines and the Allmon-Petersburg highway...and an old house.

Mrs. Barton tried to stop one car that passed her by...then she and the children stopped a pickup driven by Floyd farmer Roger Dawdy. Roger, Johnny Hicks and Stephen De La Cruz had been working near Idalou and were on their way home in the snow storm.  
"It took a few minutes to learn the situation, as the mother and children were hysterical," Dawdy said. He said he found Mr. Barton crawling in the snow near the plane. Barton was placed in the pickup seat with Dawdy, the rest in the back of the pickup, and they headed for Caprock Hospital.

About a mile down the road, they borrowed Mrs. Eddy Fullingim's car.... Dawdy went to the hospital, the rest followed in the Fullingim car.

"It was a slow enough trip in the snow storm, but when you have a man that you fear is bleeding to death in the front seat with you...the trip really got slow," Dawdy said. Dawdy said Barton never lost consciousness, told him his blood type, address and other information, should he lose consciousness.

The Bartons were flying to Lubbock to visit his parents and see the TECH-SMU ball game, and had received weather clearance before leaving Irving. Mr. Barton was moved to Lubbock Methodist hospital intensive care Saturday morning.

Mr. Barton's parents took the children to their home in Lubbock Saturday and Mrs. Barton was also taken to their home Sunday.

"It was only a miracle of the Good Lord that saved us," Mrs. Barton said.

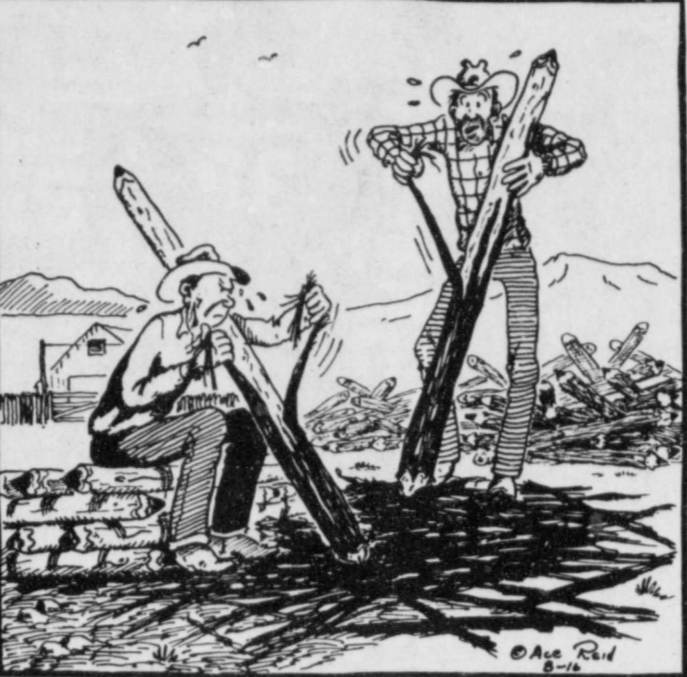
