## Tractorcade Stretches 14 Miles On Highway

"We're trying to get our government back to the people. We feel we'll get our government back now....or lose it forever," Arnold Schwertner said in a Friday morning phone conversation from Shreveport, La.

The Sandhill man is a member of the Tractorcade which is enroute to Washington, D.C. The delegation - which is "averaging 100 to 140 miles a day" now includes "over 100 tractors plus support vehicles (pickups and campers)," Schwertner explained, noting 'that there are two to three support vehicles for every tractor," The Tractorcade group with which he is traveling has grown to "14 miles long."

500 TRACTORS

The group left Shreveport Friday morning enroute to Monroe, 100 miles away, for a Saturday night clam bake and rally. They plan to remain in Monroe until Monday morning.

A Thursday phone conversation with Georgia leaders of the American Agriculture Movement noted that "500 tractors from Georgia are confirmed...

there may be another 500." The Georgia tractors will link with Schwertner and his group Saturday of next week in Atlanta.

This is expected to produce a procession spanning "80 to 84 miles down the highway.....plus what we pick up at The Sandhill man said "we farmers


The 18x20 inch composite was done by Gary McCaleb, assistant academic dean at Abilene Christian University. It is to be presented to Summerall, chosen last year as the nation's number one sportscaster, at the banquet.

A sketch of Summerall holding a CBS microphone is surrounded by three other scenes: (1) the former New York Giants kicker preparing to boot the 49-yard field goal in the dark and during a blizzard (taken from an actual photograph) which broke a tie against the Cleveland Browns and sent the Giants into the championship game; (2) a pre-game setting showing Summerall and Tom Brookshire in the CBS broadcast booth prior to the 1978 regular season game pitting the Los Angeles Rams against the Minnesota Vikings; and (3) the booth from which CBS sportscasters work major golf tournaments.

## 'We Started With A Screwdriver'

#### Johnny Lloyds Establish Farm Equipment Firm In South Africa



Mrs. Louis (Janice) Lloyd, the couple's sister-in-law, feels that Johnny and Willie Mae have made a significant contribution to agriculture in the Republic of South Africa. "They have helped develop and make available farm equipment, which was badly needed," the Floydada woman said last week while her brother-in-law and sister-inlaw were visiting in the Floydada and Lubbock homes of relatives: Jno. A. Lloyd, Ray Lloyd, Fred Lloyd, G.U. Smith, Louis Lloyd, and others.

The former Floyd residents manufacture and sell parts as well as finished products.

The need for farm equipment and parts - "spares" they are called in South Africa — is pointed out in a story told by Willie Mae. Soon after their arrival in that country, Mrs. Lloyd and son Mitch went into a store in search of drafting paper. The woman salesclerk wanted to know the need for the drafting paper and when she learned the Americans would produce farm machinery and parts, she noted that the need existed.

The woman explained that she and her husband were selling their farm

"because of a lack of spares (parts)." Johnny Lloyd says the demand for parts "is really coming on. 'DECIDED TO TRY IT'

The Lloyds had decided to attempt a different business venture from farming. Their interest in South Africa was stirred after "Mr. Martin had talked to us several times.....we just decided to

She referred to Fred Martin, a former Floydada eqipment dealer who went to South Africa and founded a farm equipment firm.

Actually, the Lloyds manufacture solely for GC Tillage Co., which is owned by Martin. The equipment then is distributed to approximately 350

All of the Lloyd products are sold basically in the Republic of South

Johnny and Wilie Mae "started from scratch....we went over with just our personal clothing" and set up their operation in Howick, South Africa. This is in the state of Natal.

The couple and their son Mitchell arrived Nov. 19, 1975. They "rented a small building" the following March and started their business: Texas Tillage Mfg.

The firm's growth has been little short of phenomenal. Their initial employees were two black men....and last year their payroll consisted of 46 black, white, and Indian employees. Soon after the farm implement business were founded, its owners decided that their rented facilities were inadequate. In October 1977 they designed a new plant "and we thought we would have plenty of room."

#### **OUTGROW FACILITIES**

They were wrong! Even before the Lloyds moved into their 11,000 square foot building last June 15, they realized the facility was "too small."

Lloyd, who unlike his wife, still speaks with a touch of Texas, says his firm manufactures "six or seven plows." They imported only one pattern cutter from the U.S. Two other models - a Master 20 71/2 foot semi-mounted offset disc harrow and a Hutch Master 12 to 20 foot plow - are "under license," which means that a royalty must be paid on them.

Most of the equipment, however, has been designated by the Lloyds. They have plans for a cultivator to go onto the market in October, "when we come into cultivator season.'

Among Johnny's creations are several other models, including 2424 and

The Lloyd's equipment is shipped as far as Capetown, "about a thousand

## Users Express Need For Railroad Service

Floydada was host last Tuesday night for one of a series of regional meeting throughout the state to receive comments from the public on draft economic analyses of railroad line segments which have been designated for possible abandonment by railroad companies operating in Texas.

Although this was not an abandonment hearing, users from Floydada and Paducah strongly indicated that a proposal by the Quanah, Acme and Pacific Railway Co. to abandon its line between Floydada and Acme would seriously affect rail users and communities along the line.

The commission's study shows proposed abandonment of 104.8 miles of QA&P line in Floyd, Cottle, Hardeman and Motley counties would mean:

-- A loss of rail service to all shippers on the line, except those with access the Santa Fe in Floydada;

-- Increased transportation costs to rail users and communities along the

-- A lower development potential for communities on the line.


Judge Keyes issued her ruling following hearings conducted in 1976 in Paducah and Washington, D.C.

The third and latest abandonment application was filed Aug. 1, 1978.

It has been the contention of the railway that it was losing revenue on the line. QA&P, a subsidiary of the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway Co., contends that as few as 34 cars per mile have been used on the line.

Rail users claim that the demand is increasing annually. They believe that enough farm commodities - grain sorghum, wheat and cotton - are being shipped to make the line profitable.

Roger D. Poage of Floydada, one of the persons who has been involved, points out that the meeting last week in Floydada was "not an abandonment hearing" as some local residents believed. No date for an actual abandonment hearing has been set.

Johnny's pickup — a small Datsun which was assembled in South Africa after parts were shipped from Japan — will travel "45-to-50 miles" on a gallon of gasoline. "You can let that pickup smell gasoline fumes and it will go 100 miles." Johnny says in jest.

He admits, however, that the vehicle's comfort leaves something to be desired. "It's about like riding in a

SEMI-TROPICAL

The pickup has no air conditioner, nor do any vehicles in South Africa due to the semi-tropical weather. Heaters are standard on vehicles.

'We're in summer now," explain the Lloyds who have found that seasons in South Africa are opposite of those in the United States. Weather is warm at Christmas. The poinsettia, a plant indentified with Christmas in the USA, grows wild in South Africa "about Easter." Poinsettia plants reach a height of 18 feet.

With an altitude of 4,500 feet above sea-level, "almost every tree blooms some time during the year" in the Lloyds' home town. Howick is 60 miles from the major city of Durban, "just about the same distance as from Floydada to Lubbock.'

Temperature there varies generally from 50 to 90 degrees, with an average daytime temperature of 75. Mornings

The Lloyds "are in the process of buying a house after renting since we have been here." The design is Texas. Constructed with brick walls, the residences have little wood due to a

termite problem. "Cabinets, base-boards and rafters are the only things wooden in the houses," Johnny says.

Most people in the Howick area are "English speaking", a situation which does not exist throughout South Africa. Schools in the country which include people of four basic races — European (anglo), black, Indian, and colored (mixed race) — are segregated.

Race relations generally are regarded by the Lloyds as "good," although the nine black tribes "do not get along."

Johnny Lloyd speaks enthusiastically about his adopted country, where he regards the government as "very stable." The Republic of South Africa is one of the most staunch anti-Communist Nations in the world. Anyone suspected of Communist activity is 'jailed immediately."

The highest minimum wage in this nation is \$2.50 per hour.

South Africa's policy draw praise from Lloyd. He regards them as "very fair, very courteous, and very effi-

A person of any race is eligible to become a policeman "if he can pass the training. Various races "are compatible, but

do not desire to mix.' Although several nations have im-

posed economic sanctions against South Africa, Lloyd does not believe these will bring the country to its knees. Leaders of that independent nation are most resourceful, the former Floyd County man points out.

"The Republic of South Africa is strong enough that we do not feel thrreatened," Johnny adds. Janice Lloyd sees the nation as having "a very fair and stable government."

FARMING SITUATION

The region around Howick depends basically upon agriculture and raw products for its economic well-being. Farming and ranching are the major industries, although "there is some gold and diamond mining."

Most crops are planted in October and November - a time which would be comparable to Spring in West Texas. March, April and May are generally regarded as "harvest time."

No cotton is grown near the Lloyds' home - "the closest place is 500 or 600 miles from here" - due to the high altitude. Most cotton produced in South Africa is "hand picked."

Around Howick, agriculture consists of sugar cane, soybeans, corn, some milo, "and, of course, vegetables. And, there are quite a few dairies."

Mrs. Lloyd says that friends in Bishiptoe "grwo tomatoes year a-round."

Just as the name implies, this program enables a student to receive both academic and vocational training. The coop students receives more practical, work oriented knowledge than other students, thus is better equipped to take immediate advantage of job opportunities.

The purpose of the program is to prepare handicapped students to enter the world of work, so they can be as self-sufficient as possible upon graduation from high school. This program makes tax paying citizens out of students who otherwise may well be recipients of some form of government assistance. This helps promote a healthy self concept, as well as a feeling of satisfaction in the student.

Any student who is currently enrolled in special education classes, or who is eligible to receive such services, may participate in the Cooperative School-Work Program, with the approval

of the Admission, Review, and Dismissal Committee of the Caprock Plan A.

dependent School District In the classroom phase of the program, each student continues with academic subjects, especially reading, writing, and math. Those who can achieve a degree of success in certain regular classes are placed in these classes. Their progress is carefully monitored.

The Vocational Adjustment Coordinator (V.A.C.) places the emphasis on teaching coop students the necessary attitudes, habits, behaviors, and skills required to obtain and keep a job in the community. These skills include learning how to complete an application, learning what to do in a job interview, learning how to get along with fellow workers, developing self-assurance, and taking pride in doing a job well.

When the student has received maximum benefit from class work and has demonstrated basic social skills, the V.A.C. will assist in placing the student in a part or full time job in the community. While on the job, the student will remain under the careful supervision of the coordinator who works with the student and em-

ployer to assure job success. The Vocational Adjustment Counselor is a certified public school teacher with a degree from a recognized

university and advanced training and certification in special education. The VAC wears many hats. He functions as a teacher, psychologist, counselor, job trainer, job specialist, family living specialist, probation officer, and friend. Flexibility is the

Dale Smith was the first VAC when the high school program was established in 1968. Dale was followed the next year by Vance Zinn. In 1970, James Lovell was selected, and in 1971 Sue Lovell joined him. They operate as a team, a teaching approach that benefits both the teacher and the student. The teacher is encouraged to do what he does best, while the needs of the students are considered supreme.

Basically, James coordinates the job training program and teaches his classes. Sue originates the curriculum, keeps the records, supervises working students, and teaches her classes. Each claims all the students as his or her own. And, within the limits of human frailty, they try to keep up with all that is happening to each student.

In a followup of the 70 Floydada coop graduates, 31 are working fulltime in jobs that are considered "middle class"......and this one so called statistic makes all the effort seem just that much
