## Postal Service To Implement Mail Size Standards In July

| other pieces of mail become effective July 15, 1979. A seven cents surcharge for takes effect the same day. <br> Both the surcharge and the effective date for implementing size standards were adopted by the Postal Service's Board of Governors at its April 3 meeting. The new size standards were recommended to the Postal Rate Commission in April, 1976, and adopted shortly after that by the Service s would not become effective until after the spring of 1978, giving customers at least two years to prepare for the change and exhaust their supplies of non-conforming envelopes and cards. <br> After July 15, pieces will be nonmailable if they are less than $31 / 2$ inches high, 5 inches long, or seven thousandths (.007) of an inch thick. <br> The seven cents surcharge will be applied to first-class mail weighing one ounce or less and single piece third-class mail or two ounces or less that exceed any of the following dimensions: <br> *6 $1 / 8$ inches high <br> * $111 / 2$ inches long. or <br> * $1 / 4$ inch thick. <br> ODD-SHAPED PIECES <br> Also subject to the surcharge are oddshaped pieces within the weight units noted above.
