"They have their hands full already without having to answer telephones. The best thing to do is to seek shelter and listen to your local radio stations or the National Weather Service Radio." <br> Plans during a tornado at the schools were explained by Bob Copeland. Copeland stated, "Drills are practiced with the kids so they know exactly where to go and what to do. This helps keep the situation moving smoothly, and the children stay calmer." In A.B. Duncan, kindergarten and 1st grade, two rooms share an adjoining bathroom. During a tornado warning the children from both classrooms are taken into the bathroom and placed crouched on their knees with their hands over their heads. Second and third grade children are taken into their own restrooms and placed in the same position. In Andrews Elementary the students are taken into the ground level hall, facing the wall with a book, or their hands placed on their heads. In junior high and high school all students are taken to the lower hall and assume the same position with their heads against the wall.' <br> Copeland feels the greatest danger that the students face at the school during a tornado are those removed from the school by their parents. Copeland stated, "A vehicle is one of the worst places you can be during a tornado. Some parents come running into the school screaming for their children, creating panic. When one frightened child screams, you have the | rest crying and screaming. They are no longer able to listen to your instructions and they are then taken out of the shelter of the building into the open and into the parents' vehicles. I wish the parents would seek shelter and trust that their children are being taken care of." <br> Trooper Dude Speed of Matador spoke on the May, 1984, tornado at Matador. He was a spotter at Matador when that tornado struck. Trooper Speed said injuries were kept to a minimum in the town, because the citizens heeded the warnings. After tree across the state were responsible for securing the perimeter of the town to protect citizens and prevent looting. <br> Jim Pritchett of KKAP, Floydada's radio station, has a listening area of 100 miles radius. "Our standard operating procedure during a tornado watch," says Pritchett, "is to have an updated broadcast every 15 minutes. In the case of a warning, the regular broadcasting will be interrupted immediately, and the public will be informed." Citizens were also reminded that because of power failure during a storm, battery operated radios should always be on hand. <br> In case of false alarms caused from lightning setting off the sirens, the city's tornado alert signal will be as follows: Three (3) signals.
