

Grid honors continue for 'Winds By Bill Gray

Floydada junior Todd Cage has been selected as second-team offensive lineman on the 1991 Class 3A All-State high school football team. The elite squad was named by editors and sportswriters from throughout the state based on statistics from regular-season play.

Selection to the All-State Team is a distinct honor not only for an individual, but also for his school. More than 5000 young men (representing 200+ teams in the 32 statewide districts) participated in Class 3A football this year. Of the 48 spots on the 2-deep honors team, Cage was one of only eight underclassmen chosen, and was the only District 2-3A player named to either the first or second

Notification has been received that Cage has also been named to the Amarillo Globe News annual Panhandle-High Plains Super Team, which will be announced in the December 22 edition. This is a unique tribute to the Floydada gridder because the team consists of the top high school talent in the area regardless of school classification.

Ruben Chavarria, a four-year Whirlwind starter at fullback and linebacker, is one of three players from District 2-3A to gain All-State Honorable Mention. Chavarria was selected at linebacker, Littlefield's Anthony Goodson at running back, and Dimmitt's Lincoln Stewart at running back-defensive back.

When asked about the Whirlwind honorees, Coach Dean Bates stated, "Cage is one of the most consistent linemen on both sides of the ball we've ever had. He misses very few assign-

ments and plays very good defensively. .. we get a lot of pancakes out of him (putting people flat on their back)." The coach added, "We're very pleased with the honors coming to Todd. He is but one of a number of good linemen we had this year. We'll certainly be happy to have Cage and all the others back for next year."

Questioned about Chavarria, Coach Bates commented, "Ruben is one of the most intense players I've ever coached. He goes at the same level whether it's on the practice field or on Friday night. Even though he's only 5'6", 156pounds, Ruben is very physical and has made a lot of big plays during the four years he has started for Floydada. Not only was he an exceptional linebacker, he helped our wishbone offense click due to his quickness...plushe's the best



am confident," said Father Adolfo, "that after the final plans are drawn up by an architect and we are able to hire contract labor, we should be in the building by June of 1992.

"We want to use as much local labor as possible. We will concentrate on the inside first and then someday make the outside look more like a church."

Architects are still being interviewed by Father Adolfo with the help of church consultant and member T.M. Whiteley.

"Mr. Whiteley is retired and has been very helpful in drawing up the plans," said Father Adolfo. "He is currently recovering from by-pass surgery. I've told him to take it easy because we need his brains more than we need his labor.

"With the help of the Catholic Extension Service the building itself is already paid for. We now will have to continue raising money from institutions and individuals for the remodeling. Any donations are tax deductible of course."

Three years ago, Father Adolfo was given charge of a project that, because of the work and help from his congregation, he knows will be finished. "My term is over in June of '92," he said. wanted to be able to complete this work. I told my Bishop that I was committed to finishing this building and I wanted to stay to see it through."



High on the mountainside by the little cabin in the crisp clean dusk of evening Stubby Pringle swings into saddle. He has shape of bear, bundled thick against cold. Leather chaps cover patched corduroy pants. Fleece-lined jacket bulges body and heavy gloves blunt fingers. Two gay red bandannas fatten throat under chin. Battered hat is pulled down to sit on ears.

Stubby Pringle looks out over worlds of snow and ice and tree and rock. He stretches tall and hat brushes stars in sky. He is Stubby Pringle, cowhand of the Triple X, and this is his night to howl. He is heading for the Christmas dance at the schoolhouse in the valley.

His horse is flop-eared ewe-necked cat-hipped strawberry roan that looks like it should have died weeks ago but has iron rods for bones and nitroglycerin for blood and can go from here to doomsday. It knows that 27 miles of hard winter going are fore-ordained for this evening and 27 more of harder uphill return by morning.

Stubby Pringle sits his saddle and he grins into cold and distance and future full of festivity. Those are careless haphazard scrambled features under the low hat brim. Not much fuzz yet on his chin. Why, shucks, is he just a boy? Don't make that mistake, though his 20th birthday is still six weeks away. Stubby has been taking care of himself since he was orphaned at 13. Stubby has been doing man's work since he was 15.

Stubby Pringle slaps right-side saddlebag. It contains a two-pound box of fancy chocolates. He slaps left-side saddlebag. It holds a paper parcel that contains a piece of dress goods. Interesting items, yes. Ammunition for the campaign he has in mind to soften the affections of whichever female of the right vintage among those at the schoolhouse appeals to him most.

Stubby Pringle is just another of farscattered poorly paid patched-clothes cowhands who inhabit these parts. He knows that. He slaps spurs to roan. It leaps like mountain lion, full into hard gallop downslope, rushing, reckless of crusted drifts and ice-coated bush ranches slapping at them.

He is Stubby Pringle, born with spurs on, nursed on tarantula juice, weaned on rawhide, at home in the saddle of a hurricane in shape of horse that can race to edge of eternity and back. He is ten feet tall and the horse is gigantic, with wings soaring in 40-foot leaps down the flank of the whitened wonder of a winter world. They slow at the bottom. They look up the rise of the last low ridge ahead.

Hold it, Stubby. What is that? Off to the right. He listens. Sound of ax striking wood.

What kind of dong-bonging dingbusted fool would be chopping wood on Christmas Eve? What kind of chopping is this anyway? Uneven in rhythm, feeble in stroke.

Stubby Pringle sets it up center of front-room floor, and it stands perky and proud. "There, ma'am," he says. "Get your things out an' start decorating. "I got to be going."

He stops in outer doorway. He hears the sigh behind him. "We got no things," she says.

Stubby Pringle looks off at last low ridgetop hiding valley and schoolhouse. "Reckon I still got a bit of time," he says. "They'll be whooping it mighty late." He sheds hat and gloves and bandanas and jacket. He asks for things and the woman jumps to get those few of them she has. He tells her what to do and she does. He does plenty himself. On a stool nearby sits Stubby Pringle, piece of good pine wood in one hand, knife in other hand, splendid sevenbladed knife he always has with him. He is Stubby Pringle, born with feel for knives in hand, weaned on emery wheel, fed on shavings, raised to whittle his way through the world. There in his hands something is shaping. A horse. Flop-eared head is high on ewe neck, stretched out, sniffing wind, snorting into distance. It is a horse fit to carry a waist-high boy to edge of eternity and back.

He closes knife and puts it in pocket. Dress is finished in woman's lap. She sits slumped deep in rocking chair and she too snores slow and steady. Stubby Pringle takes dress and puts it under tree.

Stubby Pringle slips into cold clammy


"Was it worth all that riding?" comes voice of Old Jake Hanlon from other bunk on other wall.







The Story of Jesus

"And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; because he was of the house of linage of David.

"To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child."

It was part of God's plan that His son should be born to the wife of Joseph, a son of Abraham.

For the birth of Jesus fulfilled a promise by God to Abraham, who was called to be the father of many nations.

It was to Abraham that the One God first revealed Himself. It was Abraham who was willing to leave his home and family to journey to a strange land in obedience to the Lord.

Because of Abraham's great faith, God rewarded him with a promise; "...I will bless thee, and in multiplying thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which is upon the seashore . . ."

It was because he was of the house of David that Joseph had to journey to Bethlehem while Mary was with child. In journeying to Bethlehem, Mary and Joseph were fulfilling the prophecy of Micah: "But thou Bethlehem, Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Juda, yet out of thee shall He come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old from everlasting."

Studying the history of salvation shows us that the birth of Jesus to the young spouse of a descendant of Abraham recalls God's promise to one man who was faithful in answering God's

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your


