Three Cedar Hill residents were injured, one severely, after the home they were living in, 1 1/2 miles east of Cedar Hill, exploded blowing one of the men out the door and another onto the roof. The accident occurred Friday, December 18, and appears to have been caused by a butane leak.

The 911 call was received by Sheriff's deputies and EMS personnel at approximately 6:30 p.m. Chief Deputy Charles Overstreet was the first emergency personnel to arrive and was joined shortly by Paramedic Paul McIntosh. Overstreet and McIntosh administered to Louis Arrendondo, 63, who had been found on the roof with two broken legs. Two other victims of the explosion, Sisto Arrendondo Jr., 20, and Alfredo Arrendondo, 62, had already left the scene with Alfredo driving the severely injured Sisto to Lockney General Hospital. The younger man was then flown by AeroCare to University Medical Center, where he is listed as critical, with head injuries and facial fractures.

Alfredo Arrendondo, Sisto's uncle, was treated for a cut hand and released from Lockney General Hospital.

According to Paramedic Paul McIntosh, "When I first got the call and heard about the possible injuries and the number of victims, I called for two helicopters to come to the scene. Before I arrived, two of the men were already at Lockney General and the hospital had requested a helicopter.

"One of the helicopters then went on to Lockney General and the other came to the scene.

Information gained by The Hesperian-Beacon indicated that Sisto and Louis Arrendondo were close to the cookstove at the time of the explosion. Alfredo Arrendondo was standing at the doorway and was blown outside the door.



# Farmers eligible for conservation program funding

The U.S. Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) has rescinded a recently-enacted policy change that inadvertently disqualified many Texas farmers from participating

in a major federal conservation program, announced U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm (R-TX) and U.S. Representative Larry Combest (R-TX).

Gramm and Combest said the ASCS notified them of the change after they had requested the agency to rescind the new policy.

Specifically, many Texas farmers and ranchers will now again be eligible for funding under the agency's Acreage Conservation Program (ACP), which provides matching funds for area farm-

ers and ranchers to instal! water-efficient center pivot sprinkler systems.

"I am pleased that ASCS reacted quickly to reversing this unintended action," Gramm said. "Farmers in the Texas High Plains and West Texas in general have been making tremendous progress in conserving water and reducing soil erosion through the installment of the efficient new sprinkler systems,

"From 1986 to 1990, the number of center pivot systems being used in the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District increased by almost 50 percent," Gramm said. "I was concerned that many farmers simply wouldn't be able to bear the cost of installing the new sprinkler system unless they were eligible for funds under the cost-sharing ACP."

The two legislators said the ASCS recently issued new guidelines that define which irrigated land qualifies to receive ACP funding for converting to sprinkler irrigation systems.

Producers do not irrigate the small amount of land "set-aside" in order to participate in the farm program. Under the new definition, producers would have been ineligible for ACP funds because the set-aside land was not irrigated, even though the remaining land would otherwise be eligible.

U.S. Representative Larry Combest said, "This new definition would have caught conservation-minded producers between a rock and a hard place. Ironically, by complying with ASCS setaside rules, farmers would have been shut out of the ACP program."

Combest and Gramm said the ASCS has now decided to use the old policy as it relates to ACP funding for Texas farms and ranches. The old policy would not consider non-irrigated "setaside" land when determining eligibility for ACP assistance.



# **Cotton acreage listed**

#### **By Shawn Wade**

Production estimates for the High Plains have not been an easy thing to develop for the 1992 crop according to Lubbock based Plains Cotton Growers (PCG).

Best estimates from area crop watchers now place the size of the High Plains crop between 1.35 and 1.37 million bales, nearly 150,000 bales below the December USDA estimate for crop reporting districts 1-N and 1-S. Harvested acreage is expected to be near the USDA estimate of 1.39 million for the area.

"The 1992 crop will definitely go down in the books as one of the strangest on record" notes PCG Executive Vice-President Donald Johnson. "The fact that we lost over one and one half milproduced from a predominately a late crop makes it that much more noteworthy.'

Total crop losses for the area were approximately 52 percent of expected plantings and averaged as much as 60

percent when accounting for the fact that only 2.7-2.8 million acres had actually been planted when the heavy rainfall and seedling disease problems that followed swept through the area.

Acreage figures, provided by the State ASCS office in College Station, indicate approximately 1.475 million cotton acres were certified as standing and slightly under 1.672 million acres reported failed in PCG's 25 county area.

The report also indicates that total planted acres were expected to be over 3.1 million.

PCG calculations indicate that a crop of 1.37 million bales would produce average yields of 473 pounds per acre from 1.39 million harvested acres or 445 pounds per acre from 1.475 million lion acres of cotton is noteworthy by acres. Each scenario is well below the itself, adding in the fact that 1992 will be 524 pound average yield estimated by one of the highest quality crops ever USDA to achieve their 1.51 million bale estimate.





Editor's Note: The following is a Santa Claus? reprint of a letter that was sent to the Editor of The Sun, a New York newspaper. Virginia O' Hanlon wrote the original letter in the fall of 1897. The letter and reply was printed Tuesday, September 21, 1897. The editorial reply was by Francis Pharcellus Church.

#### The Editorial read:

We take pleasure in answering at once and thus prominently the communication below, expressing at the same time our great gratification that its faithful author is numbered among the friends of The Sun.

#### Dear Editor:

I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says, "If you see it in The Sun it's so." Please tell me the truth; is there a

VIRGINIA, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except what they see. They think that nothing can be that is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, VIRGINIA, whether they be men's or children's, are uttle. In this great universe of ours, man is a mere insect, an act, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole truth and knowledge.

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! How dreary would be the world if there

were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no VIRGINIA'S. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We would have no enjoyment, except in the sense and sight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies! You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys to catch Santa Claus on Christmas Eve, but even if they did not see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove? Only faith, fancy, poetry, love romance, can push aside that curtain and view and picture the supernal beauty and glory beyond. Is it all real? Ah, VIRGINIA, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

No Santa Claus! Thank God! He lives, and he lives forever. A thousand years from now, VIRGINIA, nay ten times ten thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood.

A short story by Arthur Gordon On that cool December morning in 1878, sunlight lay like an amber rug across the dusty streets and adobe houses of Santa Fe. It glinted on the bright tile roof of the almost completed Chapel of Our Lady of Light and on the nearby windows of the convent school run by the Sisters of Loretto. Inside the convent the Mother Superior looked up from her packing as a tap came on her door.

Sister Mary Helen and I are the only ones here who've had cholera. So we have to go. And you have to stay and run the school. And that's that!" Then she called, "Manuela!"

A young Indian girl of twelve or thirteen, black-haired and smiling, came in quietly on moccasined feet. She was a mute. She could hear and understand, but the Sisters had been unable to teach her to speak. The Mother Superior spoke to her gently: "Take my things down to the wagon, child. I'll be right there." And to Sister Francis Louise: "You'd better tell your carpenter friend to come back in two or three weeks. I'll see him then."

"I told the Bishop," said Mother Magdalene, "that it would be a mistake to have the plans drawn in Paris. If something went wrong, what could we do? But he wanted our chapel in Santa Fe patterned after the Sainte Chapelle in



Nor did she understand it when they led her, still in her heavy wraps, down the corridor into the new, as yet unused chapel, where a few candles burned. "Look, Reverend Mother," breathed Sister Francis Louise. "Look!"

Like a curl of smoke the staircase rose before them, as insubstantial as a dream. Its base was on the chapel floor; its top rested against the choir loft. Nothing else supported it; it seemed to float on air. There were no banisters. Two complete spirals it made, the polished wood gleaming softly in the candlelight. "Thirty-three steps," whispered Sister Francis Louise. "One for each year in the life of Our Lord."

Mother Magdalene moved forward like a woman in a trance. She put her foot on the first step, then the second, then the third. There was not a tremor. She looked down, bewildered, at Manuela's ecstatic, upturned face. "But it's impossible! There wasn't time!"

"He finished yesterday," the Sister said. "He didn't come today. No one has seen him anywhere in Santa Fe. He's gone."

"But who was he? Don't you even know his name?"

The Sister shook her head, but now Manuela pushed forward, nodding emphatically. Her mouth opened; she took a deep, shuddering breath; she made a sound that was like a gasp in the stillness. The nuns stared at her, transfixed. She tried again. This time it was a

She clutched the Mother Superior's arm and repeated the first word she had ever spoken. "Jose!"

AUTHOR'S NOTE: The wonderful thing about legends is the way they grow. Through the years they can be told and retold and embroidered a bit more each time. This, indeed, is such a retelling. But all good legends contain a grain of truth, and in this case the irrefutable fact at the heart of the legend is the inexplicable staircase itself.

You may see it yourself in Santa Fe today. It stands just as it stood when the chapel was dedicated almost ninety years ago-except for the banister, say?

which was added later. Tourists stare and marvel. Architects shake their heads and murmur, "Impossible." No one knows the identity of the designerbuilder. All the Sisters now is that the problem existed, a stranger came, solved it and left.

The thirty-three steps make two complete turns without central support. There are no nails in the staircase; only wooden pegs. The curved stringers are put together with exquisite precision; the wood is spliced in seven places on the inside and nine on the outside. The wood is said to be a hard-fir variety, nonexistent in New Mexico. School accounts show no record that any payment for the staircase was ever made.

# The Story of Jesus

The birth of Jesus; this momentus event in history is so important to us that we measure all other events in time in relation to that date.

"To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child."

It was part of God's plan that His son should be born to the wife of Joseph, a son of Abraham.

For the birth of Jesus fulfilled a promise by God to Abraham, who was called to be the father of many nations.

It was to Abraham that the One God first revealed Himself. It was Abraham who was willing to leave his home and family to journey to a strange land in obedience to the Lord.

Because of Abraham's great faith, God rewarded him with a promise; "...I will bless thee, and in multiplying thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which is upon the seashore . . ."

God also included other nations in His promise to Abraham: "And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed: because thou hast obeyed My voice."






"And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles

Studying the history of salvation shows us that the birth of Jesus to the young spouse of a descendant of Abraham recalls God's promise to one man who was faithful in answering God's call.
