

Floydada receives second GFOA Award

FLOYDADA — Edd Henderson Jr, representing Edd Henderson CPA's, came before Council Members Dale Lawson, Albert Hill, Clar Schacht, Leroy Burns, Wayne Tipton, and Eric Cornelius on December 15 to report that due to computer problems, the printed form of the annual financial audit for last fiscal year is not yet completed. Henderson said that the audit is complete and looks very good. The official report will be available next month.

During the Thursday evening session, Henderson also told the council that for the second year in a row, The City of Floydada has been recognized by the Government Finance Officers Association with a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. According to Henderson, this award is much sought after by government entities and that very few if any cities the size of Floydada have the expertise and capability of receiving the award.

The certificate is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting. Attaining the award represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management. The certificate was awarded to Floydada City Manager Gary Brown.

...Minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved as presented on a motion by Schacht with a second by Tipton.

... Payment of monthly bills was authorized following a review of financial reports by the council.

... Bids were opened and reviewed for two proposed demolition projects. The bid was awarded to Gordon Adams of Lockney for the demolition of structures and clearing of the lot located at 211 E. Crockett on his written bid of \$850.00. Motion was made by Schacht and seconded by Tipton. All voted in favor. No other bids were received.

Adams also won the bid for the demolition project at 501 W. Virginia on a bid of \$950.00. Felix Beltran submitted a bid on the project, \$1,150.00. Motion to award the bid to Adams as low bidder was made by Tipton with a second by Hill. All were in favor.

... All council members voted for Laron Fulton's annual contract for the city farm lease renewal on a motion by Burns with a second by Lawson. Fulton pays the city \$132500.00 per year in return for his farm use of the acreage in the city farm.

... An offer for the purchase of a tax title lot was approved by the council on a motion by Schacht with a second by Cornelius. Rudy Valadez offered \$125.00 for a vacant lot located at 312 E. Tennessee Street. The sale will not be completed until all taxing entities involved have approved the offer.

... During the public forum portion of the meeting, Edd Henderson Jr. took the opportunity to thank the city for its support of the girls athletic programs during recent months.

#780 establishing service charges for city utility calls was passed on a motion by Schacht with a second by Lawson.

All voted in favor.

... No action was taken on a proposal to establish a city food service ordinance. The regulation and inspection of local food service establishments will remain a function of the state without city action.

... The city went on record as being in support of establishing a local youth center as proposed by the Gifted and Talented class at Floydada Junior High. A motion by Tipton with a second by Hill stated that the city would be favorable to working toward making such a center a reality in the future. All voted in favor of encouraging the group to pursue their proposal.

... Cornelius made a motion to authorize the city manager to submit an application for a 911 grant. The grant, if received, would provide 75 percent of the funds necessary to place road identification signs at all intersections within the city. The city would provide the other 25 percent of the cost.

This would benefit the city by updating the street signs and would be a major step forward for the 911 system as it will make all parts of the city easier to locate when a request for emergency assistance comes in. All council members voted in favor of the motion.

... City manager Gary Brown was given authority to waive landfill and tipping fees at the Municipal Landfill whenever requests from eligible organizations are properly presented. Motion to allow Brown to do this on a consistent basis was made by Burns and seconded

... The city managers report for the month included the information that Mackenzie Water Authority has submitted the paperwork necessary to seek grants and loans to help in the current water crisis. Also on the report was the fact that the monthly payment to Mackenzie will decrease by an as yet unspecified amount in January.

Brown also reported that the railroad right of way in Floydada is to be cleared of debris after the first of the year and that a construction incident in which an electrical wire was cut resulted in a short power outage on the afternoon of Thursday, December 15. The damage was quickly repaired by city power crews.

An informational survey was distributed in which Texas cities that have municipal power companies were ranked according to the cost of services provided. Floydada ranked 24 in the survey overall. The city placed 14th in winter rate for electricity, 20th in summer electric rates, 17th on an annual average for electric charges, 64th for cost of water, 7th in cost of sewer, and 22nd for total cost of electric service, sewer service and water service as of November 1994.

Brown presented a short speech he gave to the SPAG committee responsible for ranking funding requests for TDC Community Development Block Grants. The presentation centered on the need to update and improve old water lines in the city to provide better service to customers and to provide better fire protection for local residents. Brown reported that SPAG had ultimately ranked the city request at tenth in the

pursuit of grant funds this year.

SPAG anticipates being able to fund about 16 projects, so the project looks good at this time. Grant application will also be ranked by a state level committee then points from the two rankings combined to arrive at a final decision concerning the awarding of grant funds.

As a side note, Brown told the council that the community of Cone is facing some serious problems with the state concerning their unauthorized water service to Cone residents. The state has no records that the area even has a water service and the provider has not been doing any testing or reporting as required by the state. Brown added that Dougherty Community may soon face some problems regarding the testing aspect of the state regulations although that particular water facility has been on state lists all along.

City offices will be closed only on Monday, December 26, for the Christmas holiday according to Brown. Friday December 23, will be a work day as

The 11 minute presentation is designed to assist in making the city a candidate for industry and business consideration when companies are seeking a new location for their business. Copies of the tape are available at City Hall for anyone interested in owning one. The city will be

donating one to Jennifer Harbin, a member of the Junior Council, who will take it with her when she travels to Belgium as an exchange student.



CHD discusses hospital building future

FLOYDADA — Members of the board of trustees for Caprock Hospital District discussed the future of district owned facilities at the regular monthly session on December 20. Board member J. R. Turner stated, "It is my projection that we would have to have \$2 million to open a hospital and that we would have to double the tax rate to keep it open.

"I am guessing at that figure. I don't think we could get someone like St. Mary's or Methodist to take it without leaving a tax base on it. I understand the Plainview hospital is just more or less a first aid station for Lubbock and I think that is what would happen here.

"I think we could spend it all and they would still bypass it and go on to Lubbock." Turner said that he was not in favor of leaving a tax base on it in order to get a larger hospital to come in and operate the Floydada facility. He said it would use up the tax base and not provide any better service than is now available.

Board President Tom Farris told those present, "I think that by now, most people agree that the hospital won't work here, but we have a clinic that might." Farris asked that the board consider the question of doing something with the hospital building such as possibly selling it. "I agree with you that people would bypass the hospital, but they are not bypassing the clinic, they are using the clinic."

Turner wondered if there was a chance for better clinic services if the district were abolished and a free enterprise doctor allowed to come in and set up an operation. Both he and Farris agreed that the potential is present, but Farris expressed doubt as to whether anyone would be interested in trying to operate the clinic without some type of tax base to assist.

Heflin stated that he would like to see the clinic remain open even if it needed a tax money to operate. Farris stated, "I think the taxpayers are willing to pay some tax in order to have a clinic. I don't believe they are willing to pay the rates they are paying now, and I don't think they should have to."

Board member Carmel Eastham

observance of Christmas this weekend.

asked, "You don't think they are willing to pay tax with the reduction we made?"

Farris responded, "I think the reduction was good, I don't think it was enough, but it was a start. I think we should be able to operate with less tax dollars now. If we can't then I think we ought to forget it and let somebody private come in and try to run it."

Eastham said, I don't think there is any way we can lower taxes any lower and operate a clinic with two doctors." He added that he is in favor of keeping the clinic and in favor of hiring another doctor to handle the patient load, if needed. "I am saying that I think the taxes are where they ought to be."

Board member Joy Assiter told the group that she thinks we need the clinic, but "I still have hopes that we'll have a hospital."

Fred Thayer, former board member, stated, "I'm just like you all, I don't know what will or won't work in Floydada. I don't know what the cost will be. We came very close to getting the facility back open one time and as far as I know at this point, the plant itself is close to being ready to open as a hospital and would meet whatever guidelines are required by state, federal and Medicare and so forth. As far as getting the facility ready, here shouldn't be that much additional cost."

Thayer said that looking at surrounding communities such as Lockney, Crosbyton, Tulia, and Hale Center, which have hospitals that apparently operate within a measurable means of profit. He expressed the opinion that Floydada has the capability of making a hospital feasible and needs only a doctor to get it going. He reminded the board that the community is unlikely to grow without a hospital.

Among the concerns Thayer expressed was the fact that at this time, no one knows just what health care, especially rural health care, will be in the future. The results of attempts to reform the current system are yet to be known and may remain vague for a long time according to Thayer.

He ended by saying, "I think it is very

to do away with this facility at this point with so many unknowns. I'd like to see us not have to pay any taxes for medical care in Floydada and Floyd County, but I think that is a false hope. We're gonna have to pay something. If you do away with the district, the county will have to raise taxes to pay for indigent care. We are never going to do away with taxes completely.

"I think we need to take at least a wait and see attitude on what the federal government is going to do with their programs before we decide what direction we are going to take. Recruiting doctors, even for the clinic, will be impossible without the hope of a hospital."

Farris responded, saying, "I happen to disagree with about 90 percent of what you just said. I think that the uncertainty of the medical field is the very reason small hospitals like this one never will work. I think you will be able to see the day when Lockney doesn't work and Crosbyton doesn't work. I think it is all going to go to larger medical facilities and small towns are going to be more like first aid stations. I do think you can recruit a doctor in Floydada to a clinic practice. I think our need for a physician is more immediate than hoping to open the hospital. We do not have the money to open the hospital and as far as I know, we have no plans of opening the hospital, but we do need another doctor if we are going to continue our clinic.

A report handed out by Dr. Albert during the Tuesday morning meeting showed that the clinic has generated \$291,655.87 from seeing 5,971 patients between the dates of May 23 and December 15. This amount includes \$75,941.07 which has been collected and \$215,714.80 which is being carried as accounts receivable. Albert said that statements for services rendered had been sent out for the first time the week of December 13-15 when the computer system became operational.

Albert also told the board that insurance filings were made for this period on December 16. He estimated that 60 to 70 percent of the patients seen at the clinic are either Medicare or Medicaid patients for which the clinic will receive 45 percent reimbursement on covered services. The district will receive no reimbursement for services that are not covered by Medicare and Medicaid.

He suggested that the board establish a policy and define the mission of the clinic, adding that if the mission is to treat anyone who is sick, the clinic will need assistance in the form of tax money coming in to offset the loss incurred by the large patient base of Medicare and Medicaid clients.

On the other hand, if the clinic mission is to make a profit, Albert said that it would be necessary to eliminate the indigent patients and the people who can not or will not pay, treating only those who will pay for services up front and those who have insurance. He told the board that any practice with more than 20-25 percent Medicare and Medicaid patients will not show any profit.

The final suggestion Albert had for the board was to set short and long term goals, identify the means of obtaining those goals, delegate the necessary tasks for accomplishing those goals, check progress on a regular basis and above all, encourage all to work toward the same goal.

Board member Rob Heflin asked if local fees were high enough at the clinic or if they need to be increased.

Albert said that fees at the clinic are consistent with other clinics in the area, but are 1/3 to 1/5 of what is charged in Lubbock. He added that the fees may need to be reviewed in light of newly issued payment schedules for Medicare and Medicaid patient services

Susan Kirk, a taxpayer attending the meeting, asked to speak. She told the board that a major plus when she came to Floydada 11 years ago was that there was a hospital here. "Now that I have children, It is still a primary concern of mine. I have had to use Lockney's hospital three times since this one has closed down. The idea of being able to stay in my hometown is comforting. I hope you don't have to close down the clinic. I would like to see a new doctor come in and keep that open, but I also hope you don't have to shut down all plans for the hospital."

No action was taken concerning the future of the facility or on the issue of roof repairs needed at the clinic. More information will be sought before deciding how to handle the repair or replacement of the roof.

No action was taken following an executive session discussion between the board and attorney Tom Riney concerning three items of pending litigation, Swate vs. Caprock Hospital District, Caprock Hospital District, Caprock Hospital District vs. Swate, and Walls vs. Caprock Hospital District. Former board member Fred Thayer sat in a portion of the discussion as he is one of the individuals named in the lawsuits.

... Minutes of the regular meeting on November 15, 1994, and a special called session on December 6, 1994, were

reviewed and approved as presented on a motion by Heflin with a second by Assiter.

... Board approval was given for the sale of a tax title lot to Rudy Valadez for \$125.00. The sale will not be final until all taxing entities involved have voted to approve the offer. Motion was made by Eastham with a second by Turner.

... A motion by Eastham was seconded by Heflin and called for hiring the Horizon Group to recruit a physician for the clinic. All voted in favor of the motion and the clinic administrator was instructed to notify the three competing firms of the decision.

... Financial reports were reviewed and approved by the board. Motion to accept the reports and approve payment of monthly bills was made by Assiter and seconded by Heflin. All voted to approve the motion. According to Board President Tom Farris, the district has \$381,000.00 on deposit and the largest item paid under administrative costs was bills from two attorney firms totaling \$10,000.00.

..., The clinic administrators report was short, with Ericson saying only that the computers were working great and that the billing was all done and current. He also told the board that Dr. Albert will be off for Christmas from Thursday, December 22 through the New Year holiday.

Ericson informed the board that the clinic has not been able to find a physician to serve as consultant for the nurse practitioner during that period. If none is found, the nurse practitioner cannot see patients. She must be able to consult with a physician, at least by phone, any time she is seeing patients.

He also told the board that he expects the instances of Dr. Albert and/or the nurse practitioner being off all or part of Fridays will decrease after the first of the year. This information came after an inquiry from Turner concerning times when no one was available to see a patient on a Friday.

Heavens to Betsy. The political world is still shock. It's not just about what happened in November. It's about what might happen starting in January.

Speaker Foley has passed word that he's looking for a job. Evidently the \$132,000 he will receive in "retirement" income is insufficient to keep him in the style to which he has become accustomed. He would prefer to stay in Washington, where he has been for 32 years. We doubt he will have much difficulty finding a comfortable berth among the power brokers of Washington, despite the fact their influence is likely to be much less in the immediate future.

Governor Ann Richards, making the rounds in New York with her good friend Ms. Jane Hickie, has also passed the word she is in the job market. She doesn't want to make a run for the Democratic nomination for President, she says, although we think she is missing a bet there. The Democrats could do a lot worse, and probably will. Her employment prospects are not great, but prospects for financial security are probably very good. We imagine she will be much in demand as an after dinner speaker for fund raisers, and as a member of the Board of Directors for those corporations seeking "diversity."

The President's good friend and Surgeon General, seeking to promote the general health of our nation's children, had certain suggestions in that regard and ended up without a job. Mr. Clinton has suddenly become very sensitive about such things. We suspect that had the November elections gone differently she would still have her job, and her soap boxes. After all, Ms. Elder's suggestions were no more shocking than many others she has put forth during the past two years, without Presidential admonition.

Still, we believe she will probably benefit, financially, from her brief participation in governmental affairs. She has no employment skills that we are aware of, but she will at least be able to draw a crowd of curious. For awhile.

One of the things that has Washington in such shock is the feeling that those who will be taking over the House and Senate actually intend to try to keep their promises to the electorate. They promised, in writing, to downsize the federal government and move at least some of the decision making back to the states, where the Constitution says it should be. Now they act like they meant it. Washington is not accustomed to things like

And it's not just the political establishment, Democratic or Republican, that is in such a state of shock. (Both, we suspect, for the same reason. Neither thought it could happen.) The national media is still reeling. One can only imagine the horror that ran through the editorial boards of the Washington Post, or the Austin American-Statesman, or the New York Times, as the election returns came in. The electorate had clearly lost its senses. Despite all the advice that had been given, they marched off in a different direction.

So now, what can we expect?

We expect a genuine effort on the part of the new Congress to downsize government. We expect a true line item veto to be enacted by the Congress, giving the President power to chop egregious pork from the budget. We expect a vote on a balanced budget amendment to the constitution. We do not necessarily expect the amendment to pass Congress, but we do expect a vote on it, something the Democratic leadership would not allow in the past. The same goes for term limits for members of the House and Senate. We expect the issue of welfare reform to be returned to the states, where it once was and where it should be. We expect something to be done about the almost unrestricted flow of illegal aliens to this country. We expect the President to pay much less attention to the Black Caucus, and the various other "caucuses" that infest the Washington scene. We expect "unfunded mandates" to become a thing of the past. This, and much more. In short, we expect interesting times ahead. If that does not happen, we will be sorely disappointed.

And what do we not expect? We do not expect miracles, but neither do we expect the ACLU, or the trial lawyers, or the gays and lesbians, or the anti-religious crowd to exercise as much clout in the new Congress as they have in the past. That alone will make the election worthwhile.

Just in case you missed it. The Associated Press reports that out in California the authorities have begun arresting and sentencing to prison those citizens who have tuberculosis but don't take their medicine. They can get up to one year. Meanwhile, in Austin, our own state capitol, city authorities are considering a measure to spend nearly \$400,000 in federal funds to provide subsidized apartments for people who have AIDS. The city would also help provide moving expenses. There's a message in there somewhere.

Floydada for longer than he or anyone else can remember.

His age has slowed him down a little and even though he was unable to make the peanut brittle for his friends this year, he had already made sure the tradition was carried out. Leibfried has been training Janie Rando in his art and she made sure to make all Leibfrieds familiar peanut brittle stops this Christmas

Rando has been helping Lorin and his wife, Bennie, around the house and enjoyed watching the Christmas concoction being made. She was able to do what a lot of people would probably enjoy doing-learn from the master

Lorin and Bennie celebrated their 17, and although both will be 90 years

"Mr. Peanut Brittle Man", Lorin little help to maintain their home and independence.

Lorin was born June 22, 1905 in Roby. His wife was born Jan. 2, of the

same year, in Parker County Bennie moved to Floyd County in 1922 and Lorin moved to the county in

1923 to continue his farming livelihood. The couple met at a friends home and married Dec. 19, 1924 in the Circuit East Methodist parsonage of Rev. Brotherton

The Leibfrieds lived on their farm 10 miles east and 3 miles south on the Matador Highway. Their daughter, LaJuana, was born Nov. 3, 1925. LaJuana is now married to Jiggs Jackson and the two make their home in Perryton. The Leibfrieds also have three grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

"We nearly starved to death for the 70th wedding anniversary, December first 6 or 7 years of our marriage," said Lorin. "We started off during the deold next year, they manage with just a pression and we were just hanging on with our toenails. I remember the terrible duststorms where you couldn't see across the street.

"One year I brought a 3-4 ton wagon load of maize head to Yearwood Elevator after I had worked all day. I was paid \$2.50. In 1926 I got 2 1/2¢ per pound for

In 1928, Lorin quit farming and started working as an office sub clerk with the Post Office. In the beginning Lorin worked 3 hours for 65¢ an hour.

One year later Lorin became Floydada's first city mail carrier and was earning \$2,100 a year. "I got to where I could rattle money in my pocket," said Lorin.

The first city mail route was six streets wide and six blocks long. He made two deliveries daily, one morning and one

In a 1986 interview published in The Floyd County Hesperian, Lorin remembered his most severe winter as a mailman in February 1940.

"The snow was terrible and a high north wind was blowing by the time Mr. Peanut Brittle delivered his young daughter from school and a music lesson to their home, four miles north of Floydada on the Silverton highway. That was Friday afternoon," said the

"Just as father and daughter were turning from the highway, their car died. Attempts to start it failed, and snow was too high by this time to push the vehicle into the garage.

"Realizing that he probably would have no auto with which to reach town and deliver mail, Leibfried arose at 4 o'clock Saturday morning. Only 'a spot about as big as my hat' was visible on his snowcovered car," the article continued.

"He walked on the drifted snow over the top of a double garage to feed and milk his cows and care for other livestock. A big path was cleared to enable the two milk cows to reach water.

"His home chores completed, Leibfried walked four miles into Floydada to deliver the mail' along the Silverton highway where the snow had pretty well blown away.' A friend drove him home late that day."

In that same article, Lorin remembered his first days on the job when he was 24 years old. "I didn't know many people and I had no sorting case," Lorin said. Lorin would "separate mail by sitting on the floor and forming a circle around himself with the mail."

For 23 years Lorin walked the city route and then because of leg problems Lorin transferred back to a clerk's position. For 11 years he served in the clerk's position and in 1963 transferred to a rural route. He retired July 23, 1972.

While Lorin worked his mail route, Bennie maintained their home and raised a family. She also worked in the shoe department of the Ration Board (located where Duncan Abstract office is now) during WWII.

Bennie also worked for Ethel Graham in the county tax office and under Byron Clark with the Federal Land Bank. She also served as the business manager and tax assessor and collector for Floydada Independent School District.

The couple has also been very active in the First United Methodist Church, of which they have been members since

'We've lived in this house (714 S. Main) for 52 years and never had a garage sale," said Lorin. "There is a bunch of good junk around here some-

Bennie's advice to other couples wanting to have a long and happy marriage is to "take one day at a time."

Lorin doesn't remember when he started making and delivering his peanut brittle. "I know it has been over 20 years," said Lorin. "I started because I wanted something to do."


Every year Lorin would make 50 patties for his church bazaar which would be sold. Then between Thanksgiving and Christmas Lorin would hand out 75, or more, patties around town.

He would begin with 25-30 pounds of peanuts and two cases of corn syrup. Lorin says his recipe is no secret and

didn't mind sharing it with anyone. According to Lorin it takes about 15 minutes to make 4 patties of the brittle.

His recipes calls for: 2 cups of sugar, 3/4 cups of white corn syrup and 2 tbl. of water. Combine these

ingredients and cook until it is boiling "good". Turn the heat down to medium and then add two cups of raw peanuts and cook 9-10 minutes. Add one level teaspoon of soda, mix "real well", and then pour the mixture into four 9-inch pie pans.



The Story of Jesus

name Emmanuel." St. Luke tells us "And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed . . . And all went to be taxed, everyone into his own

"And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; because he was of the house of linage of David.

"To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child." It was part of God's plan that His son

should be born to the wife of Joseph, a son of Abraham. For the birth of Jesus fulfilled a prom-

ise by God to Abraham, who was called

to be the father of many nations. It was to Abraham that the One God first revealed Himself. It was Abraham who was willing to leave his home and family to journey to a strange land in obedience to the Lord.

The prayer was led by Bro. H.E. Smith, the grandfather of Margaret Ginn, and he prayed for everybody and everything, telling us now good the

Lord had been to us. We thought he would never quit as we were so anxious for Santa to come.

Then there was the manger scene and a couple of skits by some of the classes, in home made costumes, which to us were real beautiful.

Then we heard a noise from the balcony. Santa had come through the belfry and was coming down the stair with his Ho Ho and large bag of presents.

Each child got a bag filled with apples, oranges, nuts and hard candy from Santa.

Then the presents from under the tree were passed out. Both Vaughan and Hester got dolls, but for the life of me I can't remember what I received, but it sure wasn't the little red wagon I had written for.

We had a time showing each other and exclaiming over the gifts and visiting with friends. Then Silent Night was sung, and off for home we went eager for Christmas morning.

As we were driving home, (Dad didn't have to drive for Maud was ready to get to the barn), Dad remarked it was such a beautiful night; that it must have been a night like this that the Savior was







Zero values assigned to certain water depletion areas in county

-From High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1

Despite heavier than normal pumpage of irrigation wells during the past two vears, many area landowners will be unable to claim a cost-in-water income tax depletion allowance for tax year 1994.

"Rises in water levels during the late 1980s and early 1990s within certain portions of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 service area have caused us to assign zero values to certain areas on our county water depletion maps. No further decline can be assigned until the water level falls below the historical low water level measurement used to assign a water depletion value for the observation wells in those areas," says A. Wayne Wyatt, High Plains Water District Manager.

Counties or portions of counties District. within the Water District with little or no assignable water depletion values due to water level rises in previous years are southwest Armstrong, southern Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, northeastern Floyd, Hockley, southern Lamb, south and west Lubbock, and all of Lynn.

Persons owning land from which ground water is used for irrigation farming may claim a deduction on their federal income tax return for the cost of the water used. This deduction is based upon the value of ground water, as evidenced by the fact that tracts of land with ground water in storage beneath them sell for a higher price than land with little or no ground water in storage. Soil sampling guidelines show increased profitability

By David Kostroun Extension Agent-Entomology (PM) Crosby/Floyd Counties

Growing cotton with less than adequate fertility misses one of the biggest money makers in the cotton business — converting 1 pound of cheap N into 10 lbs. of expensive lint. Despite the tremendous return from fertilizer, many fields on the High Plains are not adequately fertilized or are over fertilized due to the difficulty of predicting exactly how much fertilizer will be needed to allow maximum productivity. Not knowing next years rainfall or temperature pattern limits a High Plains producers ability to dial in the optimum fertilizer level. Fertility practices based on soil samples increase net profits, reduce mix thoroughly and fill a 1 pound soil unnecessary or excess applications of sampling bag. Either send the sample to inorganic fertilizers, thus reducing the the Texas A~M Extension Service Lab chances of ground water contamination, or a reputable commercial lab in Texas, and reduce pest problems indirectly related to fertility imbalances.

last 2 years has made predications of soil nutrient status difficult. If the last two years experienced good yields, the soil could be low in residual fertility; while a minimal crop could have left the soil nutrients largely non-utilized and still available. Only by analyzing your soil irrigation conference can you be sure of the nutrient status. Now is an excellent time to sample next year's cotton fields for nutrient status. After harvest and before any tillage allows easy collection of soil samples. The following guidelines should be helpful in obtaining a good soil sample.

1) Each field's soil sample is composed of 20 cores or subsamples, mixed together to make one composite sample. Collect the sub-samples or cores from

throughout the entire field. If a field is composed of different soil types or rotations, collect a separate sample from each. Mixing soil from high and low fertility areas will give an analysis and fertilizer recommendation that's wrong

2) Sub-samples should preferable be collected with an auger or corer for ease of extraction and consistency of soil volume and depth. However if you only have a sharp shooter shovel, dig 20 shallow holes (8 inches deep) and cut off a 1 inch slice from one side of the hole. Then trim this 1 inch slice to only 1 inches wide and 8 inches long.

3) Collect the 20 core (or 1" by 8" block) sub-samples in a plastic bucket, with the requested details about the crop. Three area growers who possess the ability to succeed in irrigated farming will share their management techniques at the annual High Plains Irrigation Conference and Trade Show January 5 at the Amarillo Civic Center. Registration and the trade show begin at 8:25 a.m. and the conference program at 9:25 a.m. Three continuing education units (CEU) will be offered.

Harold Grall, a grower in Moore County, will discuss why and how he is using ridge till farming to conserve and manage irrigation water and rainfall.

Rex McCloy, a grower in Hutchinson County will share how he utilizes irrigation systems and current technology to cut crop production costs.

Randy Hensley, a grower in the O'Donnell area of the South Plains will discuss how he uses drip irrigation to boost cotton yields with limited irrigation water.

Freddie Lamm, a researcher at Colby, Kansas will present data on irrigating corn with drip irrigation and his view of the economic feasibility.

Other topics to be aired are the influence of '94 weather on corn yields and the yield potential and economic comparison of short and full season corn and grain sorghum to match irrigation capacity. These will be discussed by Brad Lance, field agronomist with Pioneer Hi-Bred International at Lubbock and Brent Bean, Extension agronomist at

Amarillo. Effective, safe strategies for chemigation will be presented by Carl Patrick, Extension entomologist at Amarillo. Leon New, Extension agricultural engineer will discuss planning and man-

aging irrigation systems for efficiency. Manufacturers and dealers will be on hand to show and discuss technology of the latest irrigation and chemigation equipment during the trade show.

A \$5.00 registration fee will include a catered lunch.

The Water District constructs annual change-in-water level maps based on measurements made in more than 1,000 privately-owned wells within its 15county service area. The same wells are measured each year, and the current measurement is compared to that of the previous year to determine the average annual change in water level measure-

The resulting water depletion data is inspected and approved by U.S. Internal Revenue Service engineers for use by landowners in filing cost-in-water income tax depletion allowance claims. Landowners and/or Certified Public Accountants may contact the Water District's Lubbock office to request this information.

"We regret that certain landowners may not have a cost-in-water deduction for this tax year as a result of the water level rises. However, it is more important to remember that these water level rises reflect the commitment of producers to conserving the area's ground water resources. As a result of their efforts to adopt more water efficient irrigation practices, they have extended the life of the Ogallala Aquifer," says Wyatt.

South Plains cotton crop records high price, cost

Cotton growers on the Texas South Plains, an area that annually produces about half the state's cotton and 20-25 percent of the nation's crop, are rapidly winding up an unusual season with a more usual scenario: Good news-bad news. For many, the emphasis is on the good news: Mills are paying top prices for the lint, as high as 65 to 75 cents a

Despite a long, dry summer with rainfall well below normal, which devastated 1 million of the 3 million cotton acres in the 25-county area, the fields which survived are yielding an estimated 2.7 to 2.8 million bales, said Kater Hake, cotton agronomist in Lubbock with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Last year the 25 counties produced 3.45 million bales on 3.1 million acres which were harvested.

Quality of last year's crop was very high and this year's quality is equally as good, Hake said.

"But the price from the mill is about 10 cents a pound higher than last year," the agronomist said. "Last year, most growers' top receipt was about 60

Although many South Plains growers are receiving top price for their cotton this year, there is another side to the coin, says Dr. Jackie Smith, professor and agricultural economist with the Extension Service at Lubbock.

"This may be our highest gross return on our cotton, but we haven't had a more expensive crop to produce, either," Smith said. The long summer drought wiped out much of the dryland crop and meant high irrigation costs for farmers who could water their fields, he said.

Many area growers sell their cotton through the Plains Cotton Cooperative Association (PCCA) pool, which pays a seasonal average price. "These growers may not be getting the season's highest price, but today's market is improving their seasonal average," Smith said.

He noted that, year in and year out, growers in the pool feel they benefit from it. Some growers entered cash contracts earlier in the season which, while bringing a good return, won't equal the

current price. "Many of our growers are in the denim option, which means they sell their lint to the PCCA denim plant at Littlefield and share in the plant's profits," Smith noted. While the current market price may be higher than the price received through the denim option, over the years growers have benefitted from the option, Smith said. He said probably 15 to 20 percent of the area's cotton is in the denim option this year.



Texas Legislature to re-draw state congressional districts

with the difficult task of redrawing U.S. Congressional districts in the session beginning in January," said Representative Delwin Jones, chairman of the House Committee on Redistricting

The state legislature is required to redraw congressional districts following the publication of each decennial census. In the 1991 special session a plan on congressional redistricting was approved by the legislature. However, that plan was challenged in court on the basis that gerrymandering made the U.S.

House districts illegal. Last August, a panel of three federal judges ruled the boundary lines of three Texas congressional districts unconstitutional. In their decision, the judges ruled that one Dallas district and two Houston districts were drawn "...for the purpose of providing safe seats in Congress..

In September, the judicial panel approved the congressional districts as drawn for the November general election, but ordered the legislature to fix the flawed boundaries by March 15,

Texas Attorney General Dan Morales has appealed the court's ruling and is requesting a stay of the deadline.

"I have filed a plan, House Bill 281, to redraw the congressional boundaries. The initial thrust of this plan will be to correct the Dallas and Houston Districts that have been declared unconstitutional. My plan will be in accord with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and is designed to win pre-approval of the Justice Department and eventually the support of the U.S. Supreme Court," said Jones.

"We will draw a plan that is fair to all involved and will not be designed to protect or harm incumbents. The primary goal will be to satisfy the constituency of each district, comply with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and meet the requirements of recent court opinions,"

"Redrawing U.S. House districts will be difficult, but not impossible. We will

"The Texas Legislature will be faced review all 30 congressional districts before we make a final draft of the bill and take a vote," said Jones.

"Many of the current districts have created local problems with voting precincts. Some districts make it difficult for people to know which U.S. House district they reside in. And the geographic outline of some districts split cities, counties and communities into more than one district, confusing the constituents of the districts in question. We hope to correct these problems as we re-draw congressional districts," said

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PUBLIC UTILITIES. CHAPTER 17, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FLOYDADA, TEXAS, BY ADDING ARTICLE 6, SECTION 17-115, SERVICE CHARGES, AND PROVID-ING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council of the City of Floydada, Texas, to establish certain service charges to encourage consumers of the city utilities of the City of Floydada to pay their account on time and in accordance with proper financial regulations, and to adhere to the proper use of public utilities and services:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLOYDADA, TEXAS:

ARTICLE 6, Section 17-115. Service Charges, be added to CHAPTER 17, PUBLIC UTILITIES, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FLOYDADA, TEXAS:

ARTICLE 6. Service Charges

Section 17-115: Certain service charges shall be assessed any utility consumer (customer, user, etc.) of the City of Floydada, Texas when certain condi-

a) In the event any consumer of any of the City's utility system does not pay matured bills at the set rates and charges within twenty (20) days from the date the same becomes due and payable, or upon receipt of a returned check, it is hereby made the further duty of the City Secretary to discontinue utility services of the user. Whenever the amount past due and delinquent is paid by such consumer, a service charge shall be assessed and collected before services may be reconnected or resumed.

b) In the event that a meter has been pulled from any consumer due to delinquency of account, misuse of services, theft of services, or receipt of a returned check, a service charge shall be assessed before a meter can be set back into

c) In the event any consumer of any of the City's utility system for which a check or draft has been presented for payment and such check or draft has been returned due to "insufficient funds," "no account," or "closed account," a service charge shall be assessed.

These fees are set as follows:

During Business Hours After Business Hours Reconnect Fee \$15.00 \$35.00 Set Meter Fee \$30.00 \$40.00 Returned Check Fee \$25.00 \$25.00

These service charges are hereby established to become effective the 1st day of January, 1995, and are subject to change by action of the City Council.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Santa Claus' Sleigh Ride Started in Turkey?

Santa Claus, Father Christmas, Kris Kringle: Whatever you call the beloved symbol of Christmas, you probably imagine him living at the North Pole, surrounded by elves and reindeer.

But the real St. Nicholas lived in a warm, sunny town on the Mediterranean - in what is now Turkey.

According to Catholic Church history, St. Nicholas was born in the town of Patara in 245 A.D. When he was a young man, his wealthy father died and left Nicholas a great fortune. Instead of spending it on himself, Nicholas started anonymously giving money to the

needy, especially children. Nicholas eventually moved to Myra (modern-day Demre) after a trip to the Holy Land. One morning, he walked into a church to find the town elders congratulating him as the municipality's new bishop. According to Turkish legend, the elders had gathered the previous evening and heard a voice tell them that the first man to enter the church the next day would be bishop.

During his many years as Bishop of Myra, Nicholas reportedly performed several miracles, including saving sailors from drowning and resurrecting three boys who had been killed by an evil butcher. In Catholicism, St. Nicholas is the patron saint of children, sailors, teachers, students and merchants.


The most famous St. Nicholas story led to the legend of Santa Claus. A nobleman who had fallen on hard times lived near Patara with his three beautiful daughters. Because he could not pay their dowries, the daughters had no chance of marriage.

One night, Nicholas threw a sack of gold through a window of the nobleman's shabby castle. The nobleman and his daughters were delighted, but the money was only enough to pay for one wedding. So on another night, Nicholas threw a second sack through the window.

The Editorial read:

Dear Editor:

I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says, "If you see it in The Sun it's so." Please tell me the truth; is there a Santa Claus?

VIRGINIA, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except what they see. They think that nothing can be that is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, VIRGINIA, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours, man is a mere insect, an act, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole truth and knowledge.

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! How dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no VIRGINIA'S. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We would have no enjoyment,
