Star Lites By Bill Ellis



IF YE EDITOR has to wake up to the howling sound of the wind blowing just one more time this spring, we're considering one of two alternatives.

One would be a move to Acapulco. The other would be requesting a padded cell in some institution, where we surely couldn't hear the wind blowing.

After having a fairly mild month of March in the wind department, it has more than made up for it during April and May, as the wind factory has cranked up virtually every day the past two months.

And the nice moisture received from the big snows of the past winter has virtually all dried up, as the moisture completely turned off.

If the area doesn't receive its regular "end of school rain" this year, then things are going to really be serious.

Several farmers have commented that seeds have been planted which will require a rain to get to come up.

We seem to go from one extreme to the other in the Panhandle of Texas. As one area farmer put it: "This country can promise you more, and then give you less, than any other section of the country possibly could."

However, the local area has not been all alone in the category of weather extremes.

The winter and early spring brought devastating floods to the West Coast, as well as in Louisiana. We heard Monday that London, England had had rain for the 30th consecutive day. The residents of England were thinking about building an ark.

At least to this point (knock on wood), the severe weather, including tornadoes, has missed the immediate area, but has wrecked havoc on spots in the Midwest and the Southeastern portions of the country.

Some weather experts have blamed the drastic changes in weather patterns on such things as volcanoes. Mount St. Helens, in Washington State, spewed so much smoke and volcanic ash into the atmosphere, for example, that it was felt that this affected weather patterns across a big section of the country.

And there are still volcanoes active today, in Sicily and Hawaii.

OUR FRIEND Nelson Lewis had a suggestion for the problem of disposing of nuclear wastes, with which the Department of Energy is threatening our area.

Since nobody wants the nuclear wastes, and more particularly in a populated area, and one on which the nation depends for a large percentage of its foodstuff products, Lewis has the following suggestion:

"Why not dispose of the nuclear wastes in the frozen North? That would be out of everyone's way, and if the material did happen to generate some heat, maybe it would melt some of the ice-cap and help our diminishing water supply," Lewis

This may be a facetious solution to the problem, but it makes as much sense as anything the government and its bureaucracy has come up with lately.

Age Is Relative, Says Foursome

Three Carpenter brothers from California, South Carolina and Sundown, Texas, gathered in Friona this week for a visit with their sister, Clara Colebank, who is a resident of Prairie Acres.

The Carpenters are visiting in the home of Mr. and Mrs. John Cooper. Mrs. Colebank is Mrs. Cooper's mother. She is the grandmother of Ruth Harguess.

One thing that might set this group apart from other travellers is their ages. The brothers range in age from 85 to 97.

B.I. Carpenter, who is still a fulltime Baptist minister at age 85, lives in Rockland (near Sacramento), California.

Harold Carpenter, a retired telephone-telegraph maintenance foreman for the Missouri-Pacific Railroad, lives in Honea Path, South Carolina. He will be 89 on May 30, and he and his wife drove all the way to Friona from South Carolina.

"Made it all that distance, without incident, and then got stopped by a policeman in Friona!" said Carpenter who was taking quite a bit of ribbing from his relatives for this incident.

Carl Carpenter, the "big brother" of the group, is a retired merchant, having operated a hardware and furniture store in Sundown on the South Plains, for a number of years. He will be 98 years of age on October 21 of this year. "I was born in 1885 -- that's 15 years in the OLD century," Carpenter proudly stated.

Carl Carpenter drove his own travel-trailer until he was past his 95th birthday, and after reaching that landmark, flew to Alaska for a visit.

Mrs. Colebank is 94 years of age. She has been a resident of Prairie Acres since Mr. and Mrs. Cooper moved to Friona.

The Carpenters were born and raised in Lincoln and Eddy Counties, New Mexico.



Each poppy has its own personality to it because it was made by a person while hospitalized because of injuries suffered from the revages of war.

A percentage of the sale of the poppy program is returned to the State Organization to fund this program each year. Marlene Drake, president of the local unit, urges all of our citizens to buy a poppy and wear it proudly.

Fund Drive Hits Original Goal

The fund drive to purchase a new van for the use of Prairie Acres had reached its original goal of \$17,000 at the conclusion of the first week of the drive, according to nursing home administrator Jo Blackwell.

However, drive officials were urging those who had not contributed to go ahead and do so, in order to provide a "cushion" for the project, as well as the possibility of building a carport for the van.

"The \$17,000 was really a minimum estimate. If enough is raised, we can possibly purchase a better-equipped vehicle. Also, a carport would be nice, plus there is the need for insurance for the van," Mrs. Blackwell said.

The Prairie Acres spokesman said it was hoped to buy the van locally, since it was a local project, and that bids would be solicited, so as to secure the best possible price for the nursing home.

"The people of Friona are very special. Our drive chairmen, Tom Jarboe, Andy Hurst, along with the present and past board members, wish to thank everyone for their response to our need. If there are those who have not had the opportunity to give, but wish to do so, if they will call us, we will gladly pick up their donation," Mrs. Blackwell said.

In answer to some questions which have arisen since the fund drive was started, Mrs. Blackwell responded:


Who will drive the vehicle? "We won't hire a full-time driver, but the driver of the vehicle will be a fullyqualified driver. Some of our staff members plan to get their chauffeur's licenses. We will comply fully with whatever the law demands."

Mrs. Blackwell also produced a letter, which was in response to the question: "Will the van be a threat to putting the local ambulance service out of business?"

To The Citizens of Friona:

The Friona Ambulance Service strongly supports the staff and volunteers of Prairie Acres in their efforts to raise funds for a van to be used by the nursing home. This van would enable residents of Prairie Acres to be transported to and from the doctor's clinic without calling for ambulance service.



Around The House

-- How would you enjoy a watermelon that is "all heart"? Well, thanks to advances in plant breeding seedless watermelons are currently available. An obvious question that arises when one discusses seedless watermelons is where do you get the seed to produce a seedless watermelon. Seedless watermelons are the result of genetic manipulation and the use of chromosone doubling chemicals that results in a plant that produces watermelon fruit without seed. So, if

spitting watermelon seeds is not one of your favorite past times, be on the look out for seedless varieties.

-- Do you know the difference between sweet corn and field corn? There is actually very little difference except that sweet corn has a genetic factor which prevents the conversion of sugar to starch which results in sweeter tasting kernels. Today, plant breeders across the U.S. are utilizing this characteristic to produce even sweeter tasting corn. If you've had problems growing corn chances are it is due to lack of good pollination. Each kernel on the cob requires pollination.

SAYS POSTMASTER

Always Costly, Dog Bites Can Be Fatal

The Postmaster says of the classic battle between the letter carrier and the family dog, "There's irony here. Many people find humor in this confrontation, but there is more human tragedy in dog bite cases than you might imagine."

The Postmaster says a California carrier died from blood poisoning after being bitten by a dog. "A death may be rare," he adds, "but the bites are not. The 'Dog Days of Summer' takes on very serious meaning for Postal Service letter carriers."

He says 5,700 letter carriers across the nation were bitten by dogs last year.

The Postal Service has the right to protect its carriers from injury by withholding mail delivery to any resident who keeps an unrestrained dog on property. "In fact, a dog allowed to roam loose can result in interruption of service to a block whole or neighborhood," he adds.

The Postal Service also provides counseling to bitten carriers wishing to file lawsuits against the dog owners. It will also pursue settlement with the third party to recover losses incurred by the Service.

"Things don't have to go

"The best protection our carriers can receive is a little thoughtful action on the part of the dog owner. It's the old story of an ounce of prevention being worth a pound of cure."




Four Frionans Are Amarillo College Grads
