up to Nogal Lake, (some 20 or 30 miles) despite the fact that at Capitan, you're almost spitting
distance from the distance from the lake.
That was when we discovered N.M.
State Highway 105 on According to the map, this road would lead to Nogal Lake, and save around 20 or 25 miles. Why not? State 105 didn't have a big sign
where it "intersected" with the main road. Just a small highway sign pointing the direction to the lake. Despite some protests from the back seat, we proceeded down the five or six miles. It turned out to be a
dirt (and rocky) road for its entire stretch, and there were times you'd swear that the road was going to end at a fenced pasture, but it wo keep going past a cattle guard. Mexico, this type of road isn' unfamiliar to you. It really wasn't a hard road to negotiate. Just the fact that it was termed a state highway got
the best of those in the best of those in our group. The highway is marked, by the way, by single stakes, one at each end
of the six-mile stretch, with a small metal plate attached, which simply has the numbers "105." Nothing fancy...just like the road
105, we decided that we Texans have become spoiled by our highway system. We have come to expect fourlane highways, or at least a wide road with paved shoulders for state
highways--and that's what we have in most cases.
One final word of warning, based on our experience of Easter weekend: I don't know if they have "Farm to
Market" roads in New Mexico or Market" roads in New Mexico or
not--but based on what we found this state road to be, I would urge you to approach any road in that state which might be designated as a Farm Road with extreme caution

## Why A.A. Works: What Twelve Traditions Mean

At the beginning, we in
Alcoholics Anonymous felt much like Eddie Rickenbacker and his company when their plane crashed into the
Pacific. Saved from death, they Pacific. Saved from death, they
found themselves still floating upon a dangerous sea, and there was no doubt among them that their common welfare came first: Nobody dared rock that raft lest they all perish." founder of A.A., in describing cothe Twelve Traditions came to be adopted in 1950. But what are these Traditions? How do they function? Representing the distilled experi-
ence of A.A.'s past, the Twelve Traditions are the basic principles by which A.A. members collectively work together and relate as a whole to the world. By adhering to these, he pointed out: "A.A. cannot possibly
be split apart by politics, religious differences, money, professionalism, public controversy--or by oldtimers who take a notion to be big shots.' When first published (in the A.A monthly magazine, The Grapevine, in
1946), "the Traditions got a mixed 1946), "the Traditions got a mixed Only groups in dire trouble took them seriously; others "were obviously bored" as they listened to him expound on the basic tenets. He "Bill, we'd love to have you come and speak. Tell us where you used to hide your bottles... how you finally sobered up. Just, please, don't talk any more about those damned Traditions

But time has changed all that. The
average A.A. member-and there are average A.A. member--and there are that the chain of recovery in the Fellowship is only as strong as its
weakest link. Thus, few would wnowingly exploit or tamper with the principles embodied in the Traditions, realizing that they are the key to the unity, functioning, and even the survival of A.A.
Like the Twelve Steps that form the basis of individual recovery from alcoholism in A.A., the Twelve Traditions are subject to continuing scrutiny and reinterpretation. The furthest thing from dogma, they can
be changed by a three-quarter vote of be changed by a three-quarter vote of
the membership--currently about 40,000 local groups in some 110 countries.
Here are the Traditions, word for word, with a capsule explanation of word,
each:

1. "Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends survive or the survive or the individual will not. 2. "For our group purpose, there
is but one ultimate authority-a God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern." The collective voice of the group is the "law" and the "leader" -not any one person.
2. "The only requ

## FHA Raises Loan Limits

Texas' allocation of funds for
direct loans in the direct loans in the economic
emergency farm loan program has eeen increased from $\$ 5,890,140$ to $\$ 18,415,000$, State Director J. Lynn Futch of the Farmers Home Administration ( FmHA ) announced ${ }^{\text {oday. }}$ The increase will be distributed the U.S. Department of Agriculture's farm credit agency. Nationally, the direct loan portion of the $\$ 600$ million economic emergency program
was raised to a $\$ 310$ million share. was raised to a $\$ 310$ million share.
Interest rates for direct loa obtained from FmHA county offices are 10.25 per cent on loans made for operating purposes and 10.75 per cent Economic emergency loans are authorized for bona fide farmers and
ranchers who are directly and primarily engaged in, and expect to continue in, agricultural production, are unable to get sufficient credit from their regular lenders, and need credit to maintain viable farming
operations. FmHA can loan up to $\$ 400,000$ to any one borrower under the economic emergency program.
Permitted use of loan funds include financing of 1984 crop production, purchasing essential livestock, feed and equipment, and paying delinquent installments on farm and real estate debts if a lender is demanding payment.

THE FASCINATING HISTORY OF EYECARE-PART III Lenses for the nearsighted (myopic patients) were invented in the early 1500s. Pope Leo $X$ wore them for hunting and claimed they helped him
to see better. Nearsighted people wanted to wear their glasses most of the time and a search began to find a practical, comfortable way to keep eyeglasses from falling off the face. Methods used included frames with leather straps, cords tied around the ears, long weighted cords that hung over the ears, vertical extensions fitting over the wearer's forehead, and metal spikes that attached to the wearer's hat. The Germans made the finest frames in Europe during this period. They were designed to enable the wearer of reading glasses to look over They were designed to enable the wearer or reading glasses to look over
the lenses to see at a distance. This is similar to the popular "half-eye" type eyeglasses we have today.
The first eyeglasses to arrive in America came on the nose of Peter
Brown, a pilgrim, in 1620 . Most early settlers in this Brown, a pilgrim, in 1620 . Most early settlers in this country, however,
were farmers and, until urban centers were developed, eyeglasses were not widely used in America. During the 17 th century in Europe eyeglass styles were the lorgnette (an opera glass attached to a handle), said to have been used by Marie Antoinette, and the monocle, worn by
Napoleon (who was nearsighted). Eyeglasses with temple (ear) pieces Napoleon (who was nearsighted). Eyeglasses with temple (ear) pieces
were invented about 1728 by Edward Scarlett, a London optician. They held glasses on by pressing against the head. Later, they were hinged or had sliding extensions. In the 18th century, Benjamin Franklin invented the first bifocal by splitting two pieces of glass, each with a different power, in the middle and mounting
