# Embattled President To Resign? Ford Summoned To White House

WASHINGTON (AP) - Richard M. Nixon, his 2,026-day presidency shredded by scandal, told Vice President Gerald R. Ford today he is resigning as President of the United

Word of his decision came from House Republican leader John J. Rhodes and from a White House aide who asked

not to be identified. Nixon arranged to address the nation over TV and radio at 8 p.m. Big Spring time.

A House Democratic leader said he was told that Nixon's resignation would go to Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger Friday, and that Ford would be sworn in at 5 p.m.

CDT Friday as 38th President. Rep. John McFall, D-Calif., the House Democratic whip, said he got that information

from Majority Leader Thomas P. O'Neill.

HIGH NOON Other congressional sources said the resignation would be

effective at noon Friday. Nixon spent an hour and 10 minutes with Ford today, and a White House aide said the President told Ford then of his decision to resign.

The President then summoned Republican and Democratic leaders of Congress to the White House for an early evening meeting.

It was Rhodes of Arizona, majority leader of the House, who confirmed for the record that Nixon would indeed relinquish the Presidency.

No man has ever resigned from the presidency.

After days of intense speculation over Nixon's course in the face of certain House impeachment, the only question seemed to be the hour at which the President's decision would be

executed. ADMISSION

Rhodes said Nixon would resign by late aternoon. The formal instrument of resignation would go to Kissinger as Secretary of State. Since Nixon's admission Mon-

day that he concealed Watergate evidence from House impeachment investigators, the public and his own lawyers, the pressure has mounted for the President to quit.

A haggard Ronald L. Ziegler, his voice choked with emotion, made only a brief announcement on the day's plans, and did not confirm the resignation.

The ultimate decision apparently was made in the middle of the night in the solitude of the First Family's living quarters. A reliable source said Kissinger was instrumental in convincing Nixon his resignation was necessary in the national

interest Nixon and Ford, the man he picked for the vice presidency after Spiro T. Agnew resigned last October, met alone in the Oval Office. The session began at 11:01 a.m. EDT on a gray, muggy summer day as the nation and the world awaited formal announcement of the embattled president's' plans.

Hundreds of newsmen and photographers milled in the smoke-filled White House press room while the two leaders conferred in the guarded office 36 paces away.

Some sources said flatly Nixon had made the decision to step aside voluntarily rather than allowing the constitutional machinery to grind toward im-

But those aides closest to the President refused to make such a flat assertion - as did official spokesmen.

Shortly after Ford's office announced he was postponing a scheduled 12-day political trip to the Far West, correspondents were called into the White House briefing room by Deputy Press Secretary Gerald R. Warren.

PRIVATE MEETING

Warren then announced that Nixon had "asked the vice president to come over for a private meeting."

A few minutes later, the meeting had begun. The two leaders were alone in the splendid solitude of the Oval Office.



U.S. officials report. more concerned than at any time since the Paris agreement that was supposed to end the Vietnam war more than 18

months ago. Some analysts suggested the Hanoi leadership may regard the Nixon administration's turmoil over impeachment as an opportunity to strike hard in

South Vietnam. WORRY Officials denied their expressions of worry were intended to influence the Senate to restore a \$300 million House cut in U.S. military aid for

into a huge supply complex. According to U.S. officials, the nearly 400,000-man South Vietnamese army is much improved. "They ought to be able to acquit themselves well, but we don't know for certain."



# Snakes' Urge To Get Away From It All

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) - It is not the warmth of the tarmac that lures snakes in to highways but an urge to get away from it all, says a university researcher.

"They seem to be just getting away from it all, probably from peer pressures and population problems," says Richard Franz, an associate at the University of Florida museum.

Every Monday night, Franz patrols U.S. 441, through marshland known as Payne's Prairie, collecting snakes killed by cars.

Franz, who studies the dead snakes to determine their sex, age and travel patterns, estimates 18,250 are killed along the 1.5 mile stretch of highway south of here every year.



Despite denials, including the latest to the Cabinet, of any intentions of resigning, this does not mean such might not come to be the case.

There are certain hard, practical considerations which could influence a change of course. These include a possible conclusion that an adverse outcome would be certain, and that therefore the best interests of the nation would be to close a painful enisode rather than to prolong the ordeal: or that even if the President is sustained by a paper-thin margin there would follow a year of vitiated, crippled leadership of a fractured and divided body at a crucial time. The answer to these only the President can know.

### **Public Alters Attitude**

Patrols of a bar in Manhattan jumped two gunmen who were holding up the place the other day and shot both of them with their own weapons, killing one and critically wounding the other.

It was the second time in less than a week that witnesses to an armed robbery in New York City had turned on the culprits and disarmed them. In the other incident, two witnesses to the holdup of a drugstore at Kennedy International Airport in which the pharmacist was shot and killed chased the gunman, tackled him and held him until police

Now this sort of volunteer citizen law en-

forcement is definitely not recommended as a general rule. The police welcome all the help they can get but they prefer it in the form of more officers and better equipment - and witnesses who remain alive and are willing to testify against criminals.

Still, it's an encouraging development. If the worm is turning in the city where 34 apartment dwellers watched the murder of Kitty Genovese 10 years ago, and not one called the police because he "didn't want to get involved," maybe there's hope for all of us.





Going Down

The headlines are that Mr. Nixon as gathered his staff about him, and they are hard at work elaborating a strategy of survival. Inevitably one thinks of the staff meetings called by Hitler in his bunker, as the Russians came closer and closer, with the precision and inexorability of an Aeschylean drama. Little by little it becomes clearer and clearer to all the staff that, in fact, there is nothing to be done: no strategem left over, no secret weapon unfired. What you get then is the synthetic optimism of the generals and the admirals who dare not tell the leader the truth. The truth is that - Mr. Nixon is

going down.

THESE FEW WORDS are not directed to the question of right or wrong, but to the shape of things to come. The erosion in Mr. Nixon's position during the past fortnight is extraordinary, and in fact was not forseen by Nixon or his lieutenants. The critical moment came, we now know, when the chief counsel for the House Judiciary Committe, John Doar, suddenly evolved as prosecutor. He had spent months and months assimilating the data, and now he recognized what he saw as a pattern; and he felt it his obligation to advocate the impeachment of Richard Nixon, and his removal from office.

His advocacy would not have been decisive except that there were 10 members of the Juduciary Committee, conservative Democrats and centrist Republicans, who listened. It turns out that they were particularly disposed to listen after the ranking Republican blurted out at a caucus of Republican members his belief that no Republican could in good conscrence vote for impeachment. This extraordinary and subversive emission had the opposite effect of that intended: a half-dozen Republican congressmen forced themselves all the more diligently to come into mortal embrace with the facts. And they arrived at conclusions adverse to Mr. Nixon.

THE POLL THIS MORNING shows that now two-thirds of the American people believe that Richard Nixon should be impeached. Surely there was never a verdict given more reluctantly. A year ago the American people were solidly opposed to impeachment - even though a similar majority did not believe that he was telling the truth about Watergate. Those who oppose impeachment on the ground alone that it would prove to be a plebiscitary lubricant, encouraging Presidents in the future to come and go according to the whim of the people, can hardly adduce the history of this impeachment proceeding, which demonstrates not how easy it is to be impeached, but how hard it is to be impeached.

AND THOSE WHO WONDER about what will happen when it comes to the Senate know now, courtesy of Newsweek Magazine which got hold of a confidential list, that the White House is counting on 36 senators to stand by Nixon, two more than are needed to prevent his disposition. But already that list is shaky: Sen. Griffin has said he may vote for conviction. There are nine senators listed as "safe" by the White House who are running for reelection. Now I find it altogether unlikely that the Seante vote will come before the election itself. For one thing there is too much material to go through. For another, the senators don't want it - why should they? This way they can tell their constituencies in October that they must wait to hear the evidence before coming to a conclusion.

Although Simon listed reductions totalling \$25.6 billion, the memo clearly precluded all this being pressed in any one year, much less this year.

"I previously voted against everal earlier proposed revisions which were strictly urban-oriented because I was holding out for important provisions I believe vital to West Texans."

One thing that could happen, lowever, would be that the guerrilla operations again could get so far out of hand as to invite heavy Israeli retaliation and generate such turmoil as to make any settlement impossible. That in turn could erode the foundations of the disengagement agreements on the Syrian and Egyptian fronts.

PEACE CHAMPION

Because of prospective beneits from detente with the United States and the West, the Soviet Union still is cautious, and seems to want to appear in the role of peace champion. But instability has suited Soviet policy purposes, and still does in the Middle East.

If Moscow really wanted to move peace ahead it would offer full re-establishment of diplomatic relations with Israel. That would recognize Israel's right to exist as a Jewish State and Israel would welcome the renewed tie if it signified genuine coexistence.

Instead, however, the Russians further agitate matters by their treatment of the PLO - the Palestine Liberation Organization. They have granted a Moscow office, which the guerrilla organization hails as tantamount to an embassy, and they have recognized the PLO's claim to be the "sole representative" of Palestinians in the projected Geneva peace confer-
