Brennan Well Known For Brevity, Simplicity

OXNARD, Calif. (AP) — Walter Brennan played many different personality types over a half century, but he was known for brevity and simplicity in his own life.

Brennan, who died at 80 on Saturday after a long battle with emphysema, was noted for playing the grizzled sidekick to the big stars Westerns early in his career. He later gained national fame as the wise and wisecracking grandfather, Amos McCoy, in television's "The

Brennan's first Oscar was awarded for his 1936 performance in "Come and Get It," in which he played a lumberjack who ages from

Two years later, he won an Oscar for portraying an 84-year-old man in "Kentucky." In 1941, Brennan won again for his role as Judge Roy Bean in "The Westerner," starring



The United States Supreme Court re-emphasized the doctrine of a free press Tuesday when it unanimously ruled that newspapers cannot be forced to give political candidates free space to reply to editorial

Overriding a Florida Supreme Court ruling which concluded that a state statute was designed to add to the flow of information and ideals, the high court said the law violates the First Amendment free press


Obviously, a responsible newspaper attempts to present a fair account of the news. This includes printing adverse opinion which may be in contrast to that of the newspaper. However, the court ruled that 'the choice of material to go into a newspaper, and the decisions made as to limitations on the size of the paper and content and treatment of public issues and public officials — whether fair or unfair — constitutes the exercise of editorial control and jugment." The court declared that the government cannot interfere with a newspaper's judgment about what it publishes. Ruling the Florida statute unconstitutional should give impetus for more in-depth coverage of political campaigns and political figures. If the law had been upheld, newspapers might have felt so encumbered in reporting political events that no reporting nor analysis would have been done. That would have seriously disenfranchised the practice of free expression, leaving the public uninformed.

As a result of the ruling, the American public should get more coverage and opinions of their political candidates. It would, however, be an unwise press that did not extend politicians an opportunity for rebuttal. Responsible newspapers will do so — not out of fear of government regulation, but for the sake of arriving at the truth.

With mounting impatience, Walters drove for 15 minutes behind a slow-moving truck on a winding road. Finally the truck driver waved him a go-ahead signal.

BUT AS WALTERS swung out to pass, a car loomed up from the opposite direction. A collision followed, and Walters landed in the hospital with assorted injuries. In due course, he filed a lawsuit against the trucking firm.

'Their driver gave me a 'bum steer' when he waved me on,' Walters charged in a court hearing. "BUT IT WAS AN innocent mistake," countered the company.

He was just trying to be helpful.

Besides, Walters still had the final responsibility for his own driving.' However, the court granted Walter's claim. The court said that the truck driver, having once undertaken to give directions, had to do so with caution.

COURTS GENERALLY agree. It is worth noting, however, that Walters had no real chance to see the danger ahead. If he had and took a chance anyhow, he might well have been found negligent himself, regardless of the misleading signal from the truck driver.

In fact, a motorist continues to bear some degree of responsibility even when he is obeying the signal of
