cotton seed and sesame oils. Peanut and olive soil are more classified as monounsaturated fats.
Hydrogentated fats are vegetable shortenings and margarines which are solid at room
temperature even though temperature even though they
originate from plants. originate from plants. The
vegetable oil has undergone a
process in which hydrogen was process in which hydrogen was added to fill some of the chemical links. This hardening process
causes the oil to become more causes the oil to become more
saturated and increases the storage saturated ane products.
