

Determined Woman Causes Changes

ATCHISON, Kan. (AP) — Things will never be the same around the Atchison jail. The sheriff's wife saw to that.

Lurena K. Hansen, who is also the jail's cook, laundry lady, dishwasher, part-time dispatcher and jailer, threatened to strike.

She told the Atchison County commissioners that they were going to get her a new stove, a new refrigerator, 26 mattresses, 36 towels and a 36-cup coffee maker, or else.

Mrs. Hansen, 44, also wrote to Kansas Atty. Gen. Curt Schneider that she had "a problem that needs your immediate attention."

And she objected to the county allowance of \$2 a day for feeding prisoners. She demanded it be raised to \$3.

Mrs. Hansen said when she and husband Ernie ran a drycleaning plant before he was elected sheriff, "I thought I was overworked, working 12 hours a day. Then we came up here, and I work around the clock."

Friday, after two days of squabbling the Atchison commissioners voted to buy, among other items, a stove, a refrigerator, 26 mattresses, 36 towels and a 36-cup coffee maker for the jail, which can accommodate 26 prisoners.

Ex-Convict Is Suing For Share In Estate

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP) — J. Lloyd Parker, who served a prison term for the murder of his wealthy father, and two brothers have filed suit over oil holdings and other property worth millions of dollars.

Parker and his brothers Earle North Parker of Fort Worth and Robert Allison Parker of Houston are attempting to get a share of the property owned by Katherine Francis Johnson before her death in 1967.

Defendants include J. Lee Johnson III, a prominent Fort Worth investor, Katherine Johnson Durkin and Catherine Lehane Johnson of Fort Worth.

The three were sued individually and as trustees of the estate of J. Lee Johnson Jr., a Fort Worth banker who died Oct. 1, 1974.

Mrs. Clay Parker, mother of the three boys, was a sister of Katherine Frances Johnson and their brother was J. Lee Johnson Jr.

The suit asks the court to rule that each of the three Parkers own a one-ninth interest in property which Katherine Frances Johnson placed in two trusts.

The trusts were created in 1937 and 1943.

Katherine Frances Johnson specified that, if

she should die without children, her property should go to her brother and sisters and their descendants.

Records show she tried to revise the trusts in 1958 to provide that the property should go to J. Lee Johnson III, her nephew, and Catherine Johnson Durkin, a niece.

Dorm Rule Is Rescinded

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP) — The state Second Court of Appeals upheld a lower court ruling which declared unconstitutional Texas Women's University's regulations requiring single women to live in dormitories.

The court said the school

may be right that it needs the girls in the dorm to pay off bonds, but said it cannot treat women one way and at the same time allow men to live in private off-campus housing.

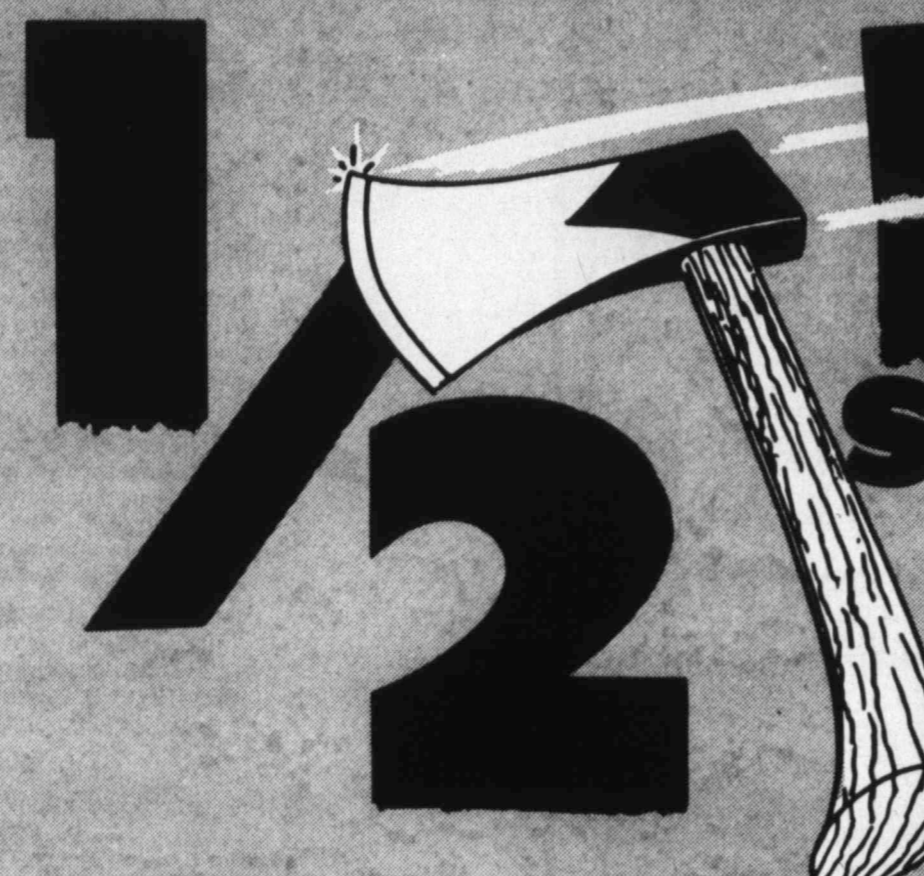

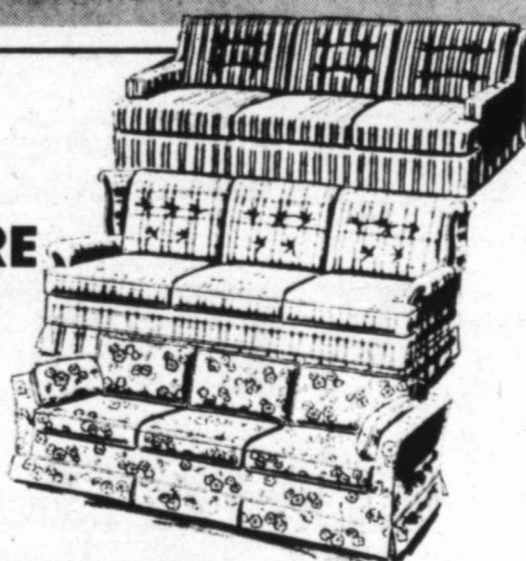

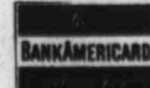

Flood Waters Force Families From Homes

Rain, drizzle and fog lingered over the southeastern states today as flood waters rose in Mississippi, Louisiana and Alabama.

About 500 families in Columbus, Miss., left their homes Sunday night as the Tombigbee River rose to eight feet above flood stage and spread out over a three-square mile area.

Sunday was in southern Georgia where reports of one inch of rain in six hours were common.

Civil defense authorities said the worst appears over for Tennessee which was hard hit last week by heavy rains. Officials revised their damage estimates from the rains upward to \$32 million, and Tennessee Gov. Ray Blanton asked the federal government to declare the state a disaster area so it can receive special federal funds.

Nashville's Grand Ole Opry was forced to perform in the city's Municipal Auditorium when the Cumberland River washed over its banks and covered

much of the new Opryland music park.

Fog was widespread from the nation's midsection to the Appalachians, where snow was falling.

O'Hare International Airport in Chicago, the nation's busiest, was shut down early today because of the fog. Driving conditions were hazardous throughout the Midwest.

Flagstaff, Ariz., was blanketed with two inches of snow and Salt Lake City measured one inch. Wintry weather was common in the West with rain along the northern Pacific Coast, turning to snow in the Rockies.

A travelers advisory was posted through the night for the mountains and interior areas of Southern California because of high winds. High wind warnings were in effect Sunday night in extreme southern Nevada. Temperatures before dawn ranged from 17 at Butte, Mont., Ely, Nevada, and Pellston, Mich., to 77 at Key West, Fla.
