## Area Gets More Snow And Cold

THE PHEASANT season got underway last weekend, and local hunting buffs cannot recall a first weekend which was as pleasant from the weather standpoint.

At the time of this writing, it appears that the second weekend may make up for that situation considerably, but the fact remains that the opening weekend was beautiful, and hunters enjoyed that change very much.

Even though the number of pheasants is down for the 1984 season, most of the hunters with whom we visited indicated that they were able to get their birds, although it may have taken a little longer than usual.

The patterns used by the birds may have been somewhat different, due to the warmer weather. One hunter indicated that the birds were more evident in the cover areas than in the stubble, which was a change of routine.

Apparently there were fewer hunters here from outside the area for the opening weekend, although the weekend still drew a considerable number of visitors.

Noticeably down, according to some observers, were the number of hunters on Sunday morning as opposed to the opening day.

This may turn out to be good from the pheasant population standpoint. Since the numbers are down, it stands to reason that harvesting fewer pheasants would be in order.

Along that line, we need to issue a pat on the back to the State Parks and Wildlife Commission, which, on the very eve of the season, passed the resolution keeping the limit on the pheasant season as it had been for past years.

We were of the opinion that things on the state level could not be accomplished on a short notice, but this must have been the exception.

BRUCE PARR has come up with a novel idea for the holiday season. Parr, who owns a number of horses and horse-drawn wagons, etc., is volunteering his services to take groups Christmas caroling around town.

His first offer is to church groups, school groups, etc. All he asks is that the group furnish him a "pilot," a route, a phone number and a time of day.

Bruce also needs someone who would drive a team of horses and could volunteer their services.

If you have the names of shut-ins you would like to have included on such a route, call us at the Star and we'll pass it along to Bruce.

One of the first such ventures was scheduled by the Friona Future Homemakers Thursday night, but it was "weathered out."

## Millionaire Game Sales Underway

The Friona Millionaire games arrived on Tuesday, and sales are underway from the various merchants in town, and from the Chamber of Commerce.

The Chamber points out that only 300 of the games have been produced, so those wanting to have a copy are urged to get theirs immediately. Price of the games is \$13.00.

As individuals buy the Millionaire game, they are asked to register for the day's interest on a million dollars (\$250), which will be awarded to some lucky purchaser of one of the games.

The business which sold the game will also receive \$100 from the Chamber of Commerce.

Proceeds from the sale of the games will go to pay for the new city brochure, which has just been printed up. The brochures are to be used for industrial purposes, as a tool for attracting new businesses to town.

The new brochures are on display at the places of businesses where the board games are on sale.

The committee which worked on the brochure included David Barnett, chairman, Larry Knowles and Karen Zachary. The production of the new brochure has been an on-going project since last April.

# FRIONA FLASHBACKS

....from the files of The Friona Star

**55 YEARS AGO--DEC. 20, 1929**

Six Friona citizens, H.L. Vance, J.B. McFarland, E.B. Whitefield, L.F. Lillard, F.N. Welch and F.W. Reeve, motored to Tulia last Friday to attend a meeting in interest of the Wheat Growers.

County Commissioner D.H. Meade reports that the stretch of road leading south from Friona to The Hub is now in prime condition, he having just completed thoroughly grading it.

**50 YEARS AGO--DEC. 21, 1934**

Quite a number of people were in Amarillo on Thursday of last week, representing the various communities and towns of Parmer County at the big Chamber of Commerce meeting that was called at that city on that date. The principle speaker for the occasion was A.D. Skinner of Washington, secretary of the United States Chamber of Commerce. Those attending from Friona were Mayor F.W. Reeve, George A. Heath, T.J. Crawford, Howard Morris, Otho Whitefield, Milford Alexander and County and District Clerk, V. Rushing and County Judge Elect, Walter Lander.

**45 YEARS AGO--DEC. 22, 1939**

Last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, one of the best basketball tournaments ever held in the Friona gym was staged. There were ten boys' teams and eight girls' teams entered. In all

there were twenty-three basketball games played. Many of the visitors expressed their views that they had never been to a better tournament. Mr. Ezell and Wilbur Meade said that they had never officiated in a tournament where more sportsmanship was shown. Dimmitt won first place, Canyon second and Springlake third in the boys' division. Lazbuddie won first place, Dimmitt second and Oklahoma Lane third place in the girls' division.

**40 YEARS AGO--DEC. 22, 1944**

J.H. Hinds has announced that he will open his new grocery store in the Warren building on Sixth Street, to be known as "Friona Food Market," on Friday, December 22. Mr. Hinds is experienced in the management of grocery and food stores, and has his store furnished with all modern equipment. He will have a meat market in connection with his regular grocery business. He has lived in Friona for several years and was formerly employed with the Cashway Grocery and Market here.

**30 YEARS AGO--DEC. 16, 1954**

Over 15,000 bales of cotton had been ginned late yesterday by the three gins in the Friona vicinity. This was not counting several hundred bales still waiting in the yards. Ginmen reported that they were only a day or two behind in most instances, and the cotton harvest seemed to be nearing an orderly completion.

Jackie Rule and Jimmy Norwood were hospitalized early this morning after the car in which they were riding plunged into a highline pole just north of Hub. Neither of the boys was believed injured seriously. Norwood suffered two broken ribs and both had numerous cuts and bruises. Investigating officers believed a blowout might have caused the Norwood car to leave the pavement. The impact of the vehicle on the pole broke an insulator allowing wires to touch, throwing Friona out of electricity

for some three hours after the 4 a.m. collision.

**25 YEARS AGO--DEC. 17, 1959**

With temperatures tumbling from Sunday's high of 68 degrees in Friona to the low 20's Monday a cold front moved into Parmer County spreading damage to rural utility lines and leaving an estimated 1,000 persons without electricity Tuesday morning. The front brought snow to this area which in places drifted to several feet in depth and covered the ground with an estimated fall of about four inches up until late Monday night.

**20 YEARS AGO--DEC. 7, 1964**

Ground was broken and the foundation poured this week on a building which will house the Friona Star and Graphic Arts Printing. The building, which is to be located between Southwestern Public Service Company and Production Credit Association, will be ready sometime early in 1965.

Wayne Clausen, chairman of the United Fund drive in Friona, this week requested all captains to turn in their money and prospect lists to him by Monday, so that a "clean-up" campaign may be begun. A total of \$3100 had been raised toward the goal of \$7000 as of Tuesday.

**15 YEARS AGO--DEC. 18, 1969**

Friona's outstanding citizens for 1969 were honored last Saturday night at the annual Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture Banquet. Louis Welch was honored as the Chamber's "Man of the Year." Mrs. Robert Alexander was chosen "Woman of the Year," and Mrs. Cleo Gauna, of Gib's Cleaners was cited as "Most Courteous Employee." The committee which selected the "Teacher of the Year" from the Friona School system came up with a novel choice when both Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Hodgson were chosen.

Pallbearers were Scott Morrison, Sonny Mays, Ralph Morrison, Wayne Johnson, Gary Self and John Frank Martin.

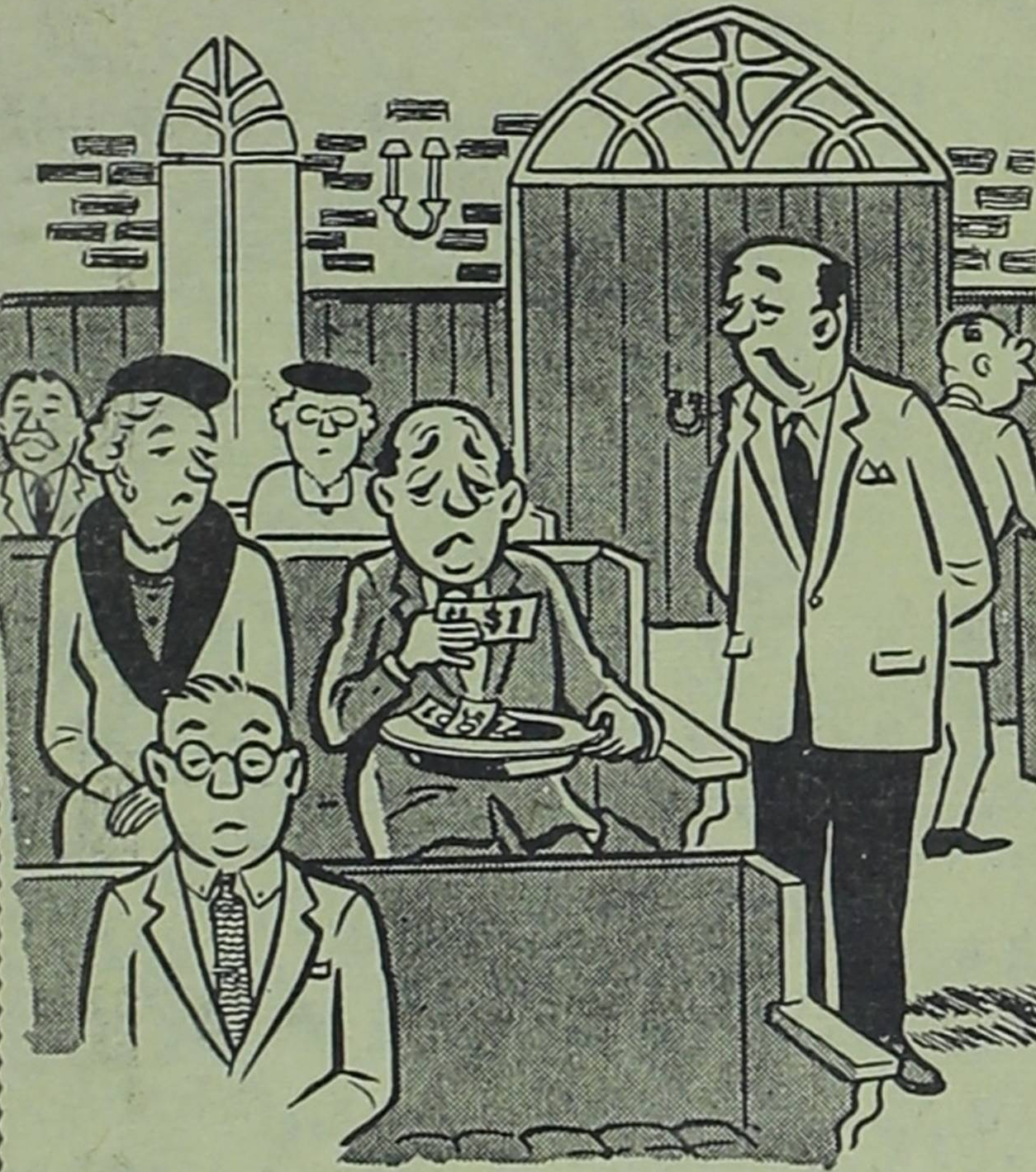


**WTSU Society Accepts Three Local Students**

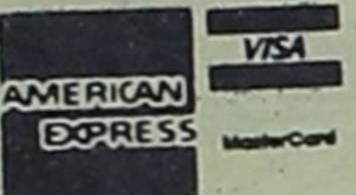
