# The World At-A-Glance

WASHINGTON (AP) - The government proposes cutting off payments to welfare mothers who refuse to help identify and track down the father of their children, but mothers who cooperate would be rewarded with cash bounties. Rules proposed by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare also would require all adult applicants or recipients of family welfare payments to obtain Social Security numbers and furnish those numbers to a welfare agency.

SAIGON (AP) - The new

government of South Vietnam demanded today that all property taken out of the country by fleeing Vietnamese — including combat planes and gold—be returned. The Foreign Ministry of the Revolutionary Government in Saigon charged that "dozens of warships, freighters, and hundreds of cargo and combat planes" were taken away, a Hanoi broadcast said. The ministry said all property inside and outside of Vietnam owned by the defeated government belongs to the Vietnamese people and is at the disposal of their new government.

DA NANG, South Vietnam (AP) -A spokesman for South Vietnam's new government says 103,000 enlisted men and noncommissioned officers taken prisoner in the Da Nang area in March have been released to return to their homes. Six thousand officers, ranging in rank from lieutenants to the major general commanding the Army of the Republic of Vietnam's 4th Corps also were captured, and all are still held "for re-education," the spokesman said. The new government allowed The Associated Press and a CBS television crew to visit one of the "re-education camps" for 900 officers at Dien Ban, about 20 miles south of Da Nang.

Spokesmen for industry argued against the bill, maintaining enforcement already is adequate and that involvement of the attorney general's office might hamper their efforts to provide energy or produce goods. And they objected to giving the attorney general both policing and prosecuting powers, and to duplicating enforcement powers already granted to the

College Park Shopping Center. First let me say that I can understand the feelings of the people in this area as they do have a serious problem with the noise and traffic, associated with weekend and nighttime congregation automobiles (motorcycles also) on the shopping center parking lot. This problem could be improved if there were some business in the center who would ask the city police to remove the congregation. As most everyone knows by now this zone reading it was passed with all four Councilman Acri absent.

He felt like this would possibly increase traffic and also increase business for other stores in the

Before the second reading on this change I had heard there had been some opposition so I attempted to contact Mr. Harold Hall and get his feelings on the matter but, was advised he was out of town. After this I contacted Mr. Acri and asked his feelings, he advised me he had not heard any opposition at all, and he did not give a "damn" either way

At the second meeting there was a petition containing 188 names, all against this change. Now only people within the limits of 200 feet of the shopping center property are eligible to voice objections. Some of these names came from several blocks away, also some of these

This discussion had nothing whatever to do with the item at hand. Now this sounds to me like Mr. Acri did give a "damn" all along.

Mayor Choate made no comment whatever on the issue, but when time came to vote the pressures were too much, he voted no.

#### CLINICALLY DEAD

## Continued To Breathe After Obit Published

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) A man considered clinically dead continued to breathe for three weeks after his wife made the decision to withdraw his life support system and his obituary was published, hospital officials revealed today.

Joseph Klimek, 24, of Manchester entered Manchester Hospital Jan. 31 suffering from a rare blood disease which causes slow internal bleeding.

Two weeks later he was transferred to Hartford Hospital where his spleen was removed. But he suffered a heart attack, cutting off oxygen to his brain and

Doctors placed Klimek, an accountant and father of a 2year-old son, on a respirator. But for eight weeks he showed no improvement. showed no response.

On the morning of April 8, Dr. G. W. Anderson, chief of Hospital, shut off the respirator after consulting with Mrs. Klimek. Breathing stopped immediately but the heart continued to beat, a

common ocurrence. No breathing was noted for several minutes and Klimek was pronounced dead and preparations began for autopsy. The family was notified of his death, and the obituary was released to a

Later that morning, nurses noted Klimek had resumed breathing. He subsequently was given intravenous feedings, but the respirator was not used. Anderson said how Klimek continued to breathe without the
