NEW DELHI, India (AP) A Supreme Court justice said today he will announce Tuesday whether he will allow Prime Minister Indira Gandhi to remain in office during her appeal of a lower court's conviction of corrupt electioneering practices.

V.R. Krishna Iyer, appointed to the Supreme Court in 1973 on the recommendation of Mrs. Gandhi's government and acting as a one-man tribunal while the full 13-man bench is on vacation, listened to 51/2 hours of arguments by her lawyers and opposing counsel.

Consideration of her appeal against the conviction itself will not begin until the Supreme Court returns from vacation in mid-July.

Highly placed sources in Gandhi's Congress party said if Iyer rules against her, she was considering trying to remain at the head of the government under a legal provision that allows a person to be a cabinet minister for six months without being a member of parliament.

The sources said Mrs. Gandhi could attempt to justify invoking this law with the argument that she expects the Supreme Court to exonerate her before the six months elapse

Current rates filed with the board by 11 companies do not exceed \$7,491 for an orthopedic surgeon and \$1,018 for a nonsurgical physician in Harris County for the same coverage.

Ray Foster of Austin. representing the rating organization, said the proposed rates are based on Texas experience but used nationwide factors for prefuture malpractice claims.

He said the rates do not include the reduction in the statute of limitations for filing malpractice suits that was passed by the legislature in May on a temporary two-year basis.

Since the reduction is temporary, legal questions arise about including it in a rate base, Foster said.

He also predicted more malpractice claims. "The publicity attendant on this malpractice problem is going to generate a lot of

claims," Foster said.

The State Insurance Board called the hearing to obtain information for use in evaluating malpractice policy forms and rating plans filed by various companies and for setting rates to be used by a pool of 360 companies that will share the risk of covering

For reasons yet unknown, research shows trust and faith in the doctor trigger physical and mental changes that relieve suffering in many, he

LISBON, Portugal (AP) - The Communist party told its militants to stay away from a big Socialist party rally tonight, apparently to put the blame on the Socialists if any trouble developed.

The Communist party's information and propaganda section said members should not participate in the Socialist march to the presidential palace "in any form."

The demonstration was expected to bring tens of thousands of Socialists into the streets as a reminder to the leftist military government that their party is the nation's biggest, and to put before the public the ruling Revolutionary Council's weekend declaration that it will support a multi-party political

The Socialists also are expected to make a show of strength for their newspaper, Republica, closed since May 20 after being seized by the

WASHINGTON (AP) — With work conditions and billions of dollars at stake, the government opened controversial hearings today to determine what noise levels should be allowed on the job.

Labor and industry have lined up on opposing sides over new regulations proposed by the Labor Department's Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Daniel P. Boyd, an OSHA official and the leadoff witness, defended the government's proposal and stressed it was just that, a proposal subject to change based on evidence to be presented during the lengthy hearings.

"It does not, therefore, reflect a final agency position, but rather merely represents the best judgment of our staff at the time the standard was proposed," Boyd said. Before setting final standards, OSHA expects to hear during four weeks of testimony from more than 100 witnesses representing the AFL-CIO, the scientific community, other government agencies and dozens of industry and trade associations.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) -Nitrogen fertilizers may ultimately cause more damage than aerosol sprays to the ozone layer which protects the earth from the sun's most intense ultraviolet rays, a Harvard

scientist says. As the national debate increases over the use of sprays containing fluorocarbons such as Freon, Michael McElroy is focusing on the \$8-billion nitrogen fertilizer industry. "Our abundance of food in

large measure on our chemical industry," he said in an interview Sunday, noting that nitrogen fertilizers greatly increase crop However, nitrogen fertilizers trigger a series of chemical changes which ultimately produce nitric oxide. That chemical eventually finds its way into

Scientists aren't sure what the ozone reduction would mean, but McElroy says it could disrupt plant life within the sea, food grains ashore and increase skin cancer among humans.

With the combination of ailments, past and present (diabetes, ulcer, diverticulosis) hers is a difficult problem to evaluate easily. It does sound as though there could be some neurological disturbance affecting her swallowing mechanism.

Mild diabetes can cause this. So can a "little stroke." The barium swallow X-ray should have revealed the presence of any real lump. It would be more difficult to determine the cause of any neurological problem.

If your aunt does have what is called "diabetic neuritis," it would reveal itself in other findings. There might be an eye muscle weakness, for example, or a tingling of the extremities, and perhaps a lessening of tendon reflex revealed in the knee-jerk tests.

Careful control of diabetes

is essential, and don't let the term "mild diabetes" fool your aunt into complacency. Persons with mild diabetes can have nerve problems, as mentioned earlier, as readily as can those with

more severe conditions.

Dr. Dr. Thosteson: About two years ago I had a very bad sunburn on my legs. They swelled up, especially at the ankles. I had no medical treatment.

Now, even though there is no redness or swelling, I still get this burning feeling, especially around the ankles. Do you think this is caused by the sunburn two years ago? — B.K.R.

Severe sunburn, especially one severe enough to have caused the swelling you describe, can cause tissue damage. Severe sunburn can be dangerous in many ways.





Claims CIA **Had Orders** From Top

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Barry Goldwater said today that the Central Intelligence Agency "took orders from the top" in carrying out illegal activities

The Arizona Republican, a member of the Senate Intelligence Committee, said the panel's investigation will show the CIA did not want to do some of the things it did but felt obliged to follow orders.

Goldwater made the statement in the Senate as the committee arranged to call as a witness John Roselli, a West Coast underworld figure and associate of slain Chicago mobster Sam Giancana in a reputed plot against Fidel Castro.

Roselli, scheduled to appear Tuesday in response to a subpoena, was expected to be quizzed about reports that he and Giancana were approched on behalf of the CIA to arrange for Mafia members to assassinate Castro.

Giancana, who also had been expected to testify, was shot to death in his home in a Chicago suburb last week.

Also expected to testify is William K. Harvey, a former CIA official who reliable sources have said was involved in plots to kill Castro.

This week's edition of Time magazine said CIA officials began exploring the possibility of killing Castro in the spring of 1960 when suggestions were put forth that Castro's food or cigars be poisoned.

According to the Time account, Giancana and Roselli were approached to find a man in Havana to liquidate Castro. The two Americans, who were hoping to escape prosecution by the Justice Department, in turn recruited a gangster with access to Castro.

Meanwhile, the CIA's medical section produced some exotic pills and even "fixed" a box of fine Havanna cigars. The cigars never left the CIA lab but the pills were sent to Miami. according to the Time The would-be assassin was

to be paid \$150,000 if he suceeded. A few thousand dollars in earnest money was turned over to him. But no one knows what

ever happened to the pills or to the hired hit man, the Time story said. At any rate, the pill caper never succeeded. A substitute plotter later claimed to have put two separate three-man teams of

infiltrators ashore in Cuba.

But if he did so, nothing was ever heard of them, Time Meanwhile, Harvey was asked in 1961 to explore methods of neutralizing Castro through "executive action," a method that included defamation, bribery or assassination. According to the Time account, Harvey had no authority to act but

Malaysia Muhammad Ali said today his heavyweight championship defense against Joe Bugner July 1 will be his last

"You can write I'm gonna retire," Ali told a news conference he called for his hotel following a training session.

"I'm gonna announce it officially on television so the people can hear my voice," said Ali. "To fans and nonfans alike this will be the last time you'll see me fight.'

The Bugner fight, which will start at about 9:45 a.m. here, will be seen in many parts of the world live on close-circuit television beginning at about 10:45 p.m., EDT, June 30 in the United States.

Ali's announcement was greeted with skepticism by some of his camp followers. "He ain't gonna turn down \$8 million," said one.

And Ali did seem to leave a little room for a change of mind when at one point he said, "I'm 99 per cent sure I'm gonna retire.

A retirement would mean there would be no third fight against Joe Frazier, a fight for which he would get about \$8 million. He is getting \$2 million plus expenses to fight

The 33-year-old champion, seemingly restless and saying he was tired of training and even of the adulation that is continually showered upon him, said he had told his manager, Herbert Muhammad, of his

"He told me it's my life and I can do what I want to or I can go again one more time for \$8 million," Ali said.

The state Pardon and Parole Board adopted the policy Sunday at its regular monthly meeting here. The board also decided to tighten the granting of paroles.

The Rev. Littleton Fowler of Hugo proposed that convicts make systematic repayments to victims as a condition of their parole.

The policy will apply in any cases where convicts took money for property which was not returned to victims. The board reserved the right to examine each case individually but the policy will mostly affect bogus check cases.

'I feel that anybody who makes parole should have a minimum wage to live on, but if they can make restitution they should. We've got to think about the victims too," said board chairman Charles Chesnut of Miami.

The board then applied the policy to inmate Thomas Walkabout, a carpenter serving seven years for passing \$1,500 worth of hot checks in Tulsa.

"I think it's fair." Walkabout told the board. "I want to pay those people

Board member John R. Green of Duncan raised the issue of pardons, noting that a convict serving a 15-year term was paroled last January and has already asked for a pardon.

"I don't want to pardon someone until they have completed their term of supervision, unless there are extraordinary cumstances," Green said.

The board also found out that Gov. David Boren has bounced back a pardon request by prison activist Jim Goodridge because Warden Richard Crips protested

Goodridge, executive director of Help Our Prisoners Exist (HOPE), received a pardon recommendation last April from the board. He is on parole from a five-year term for an Oklahoma City forgery.

hard-hitting critic of the corrections Oklahoma system and Warden Crips. Crisp fired off an angry letter to the governor soon after the board recommended a pardon for Goodridge. No injuries were reported in the explosions and fire 40 to 50 small butane Sunday at the Angleton Butane Co. but some 500 persons were forced to evacuate their homes in the

Fire Chief A.L. Kelley said a gas leak reported at mid morning turned into a chain of small explosions a minute

He said the fire spread across a city-block area. An 18,000 gallon tank exploded,

hundreds of feet in the air, shattered windows and damaging walls of a nearby

townhouses. Explosions also occurred in a 4,000-gallon tank and in

cylinders, Kelley said. Persons evacuated lived in the townhouses, two mobile homes and a housing sub-





Expected Housing Veto Cinch To Trigger Fight

WASHINGTON (AP) -The Senate dispute over last programs contained in a \$5.3 November's New Hampshire Senate race continues this vetoed earlier, raising a week while the House tries to question as to whether he override President Ford's will accept this bill. expected veto of a housing

The Senate votes Tuesday on whether to limit debate on the New Hampshire election. The dispute threatens to shorten or eliminate a 10-day July 4 recess scheduled to start at the end of the week.

House leaders, meanwhile, have scheduled an effort Wednesday to override the expected housing-bill veto in the latest test of a presidential-congressional battle that Ford has dominated so far.

In three previous tests, the House has failed to override vetoes of bills dealing with farm matters, jobs and strip mining.
Ford is expected to veto

the housing bill today or Tuesday on the ground it is too costly and would hinder midafternoon when three the administration's efforts to keep the budget deficit at \$60 billion. Supporters of the measure claim it would spur housing contruction and prevent foreclosures by offering mortgage interest subsidies to middle-income foreclosures.



Raising Debt Ceiling Is **Now Annual Charade**

The Congress is going through its periodic charade in raising the public debt ceiling. A charade is actually what it is because the Federal Government must borrow money to pay its debts or else default on its obligations. It is comparable to a C.O.D.

It does not affect federal spending because it is an obligation of the Government already incurred. The ceiling simply says that this is all the money Government can borrow within any given period and has nothing to do

If the debt ceiling ever served any purpose at all it was simply psychological and nothing more. Even that has been lost insofar as creating the appearance of being responsible in Federal spending.

The permanent debt ceiling is now set at \$400 billion. Numerous "temporary" ceilings have been
