Purpose of the seminar is to give the student a better understanding of the American system and way of life. Emphasis will be placed on the economic, moral and social aspects of the American society. Instruction will consist of lectures, films, and panel discussions.

SOME DISABLED VETERANS GET FREE LICENSE PLATES

AUSTIN — Details of a new program which will provide free 1972 automobile license plates to some disabled veterans were revealed today by the Texas Highway Department.

The program was set up by an act of the 62nd Legislature.

To qualify, an applicant must:

- Be a Texas resident;
- Be a veteran of the armed forces of the United States;
- Have a disability rating of 70 per cent or more;
- Be drawing compensation from the federal government as

the result of service-connected disability.

A qualified veteran is entitled to register one passenger car or light commercial vehicle with a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of one ton or less for his own use without paying the prescribed registration fee. There is a statutory fee of \$1 which must accompany each application.

Specially designed license plates will be issued with the letters "DV" appearing as either a prefix or suffix to the license number. The words "Disabled Vet" also will appear on the plates.

Vehicles with Disabled Vet plates will be exempt from paying parking fees charged by any governmental authority other than the federal government. This includes parking meters.

Callahan Recertified Free Brucellosis Area

The local County Extension office has recently received word from the Texas Animal Health Commission that Callahan County has received recertification for a Modified Certified Free Brucellosis Area for the next three years. Due to the drought and the decreased number of cattle in the county, the recertification has been granted for 750 herds totaling 15,500 head of beef cattle. Thru marketing cattle testing procedures, an adequate number of cattle were tested to recertify the county for an additional three years.

BAIRD — This is to advise that producers in Callahan County who wish to graze or hay set-aside or CAP acreages need not file a request to do so, except; in those cases where the producer plans to relet grazing of standing hay to a third party.

Free grazing and haying of set-aside acres under the annual programs extends through the required period of designation. (September 30, 1971).

The free grazing and haying provisions for CAP acres (long term agreement) ends September 30, 1971, and unless the Secretary approves use beyond that date cattle must be removed.
