"Amadeus," presented by FHS, along with "The Tragedy of King Lear," by Muleshoe, were chosen for area competition, which will be held this Friday, April 5 at Muleshoe.

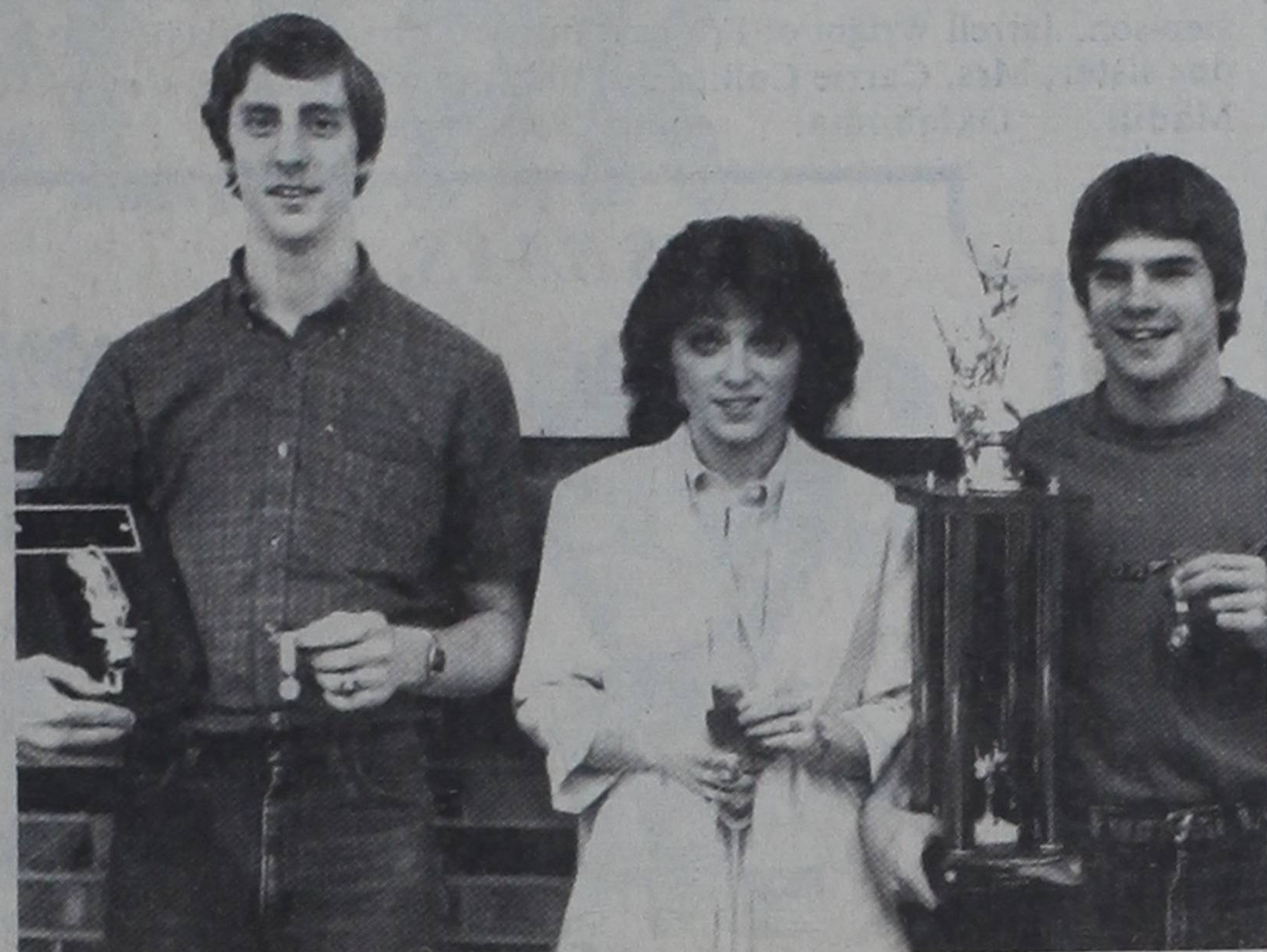
Garnering "best actress" honors was Sheila Gresham, while Brent Hinkle and Chuck Ellis each were named to the district's all-star cast.

In addition to the Friona and Muleshoe plays, those to be in competition in the area event will be Boys Ranch, "The Ransom of Red Chief," and "Mother Courage and Her Children" from Canadian High School.

Beelee Goodwin, city manager, points out that ordinance number 81 provides for the levying of dog tags and annual vaccination of pets, to curtail rabies.

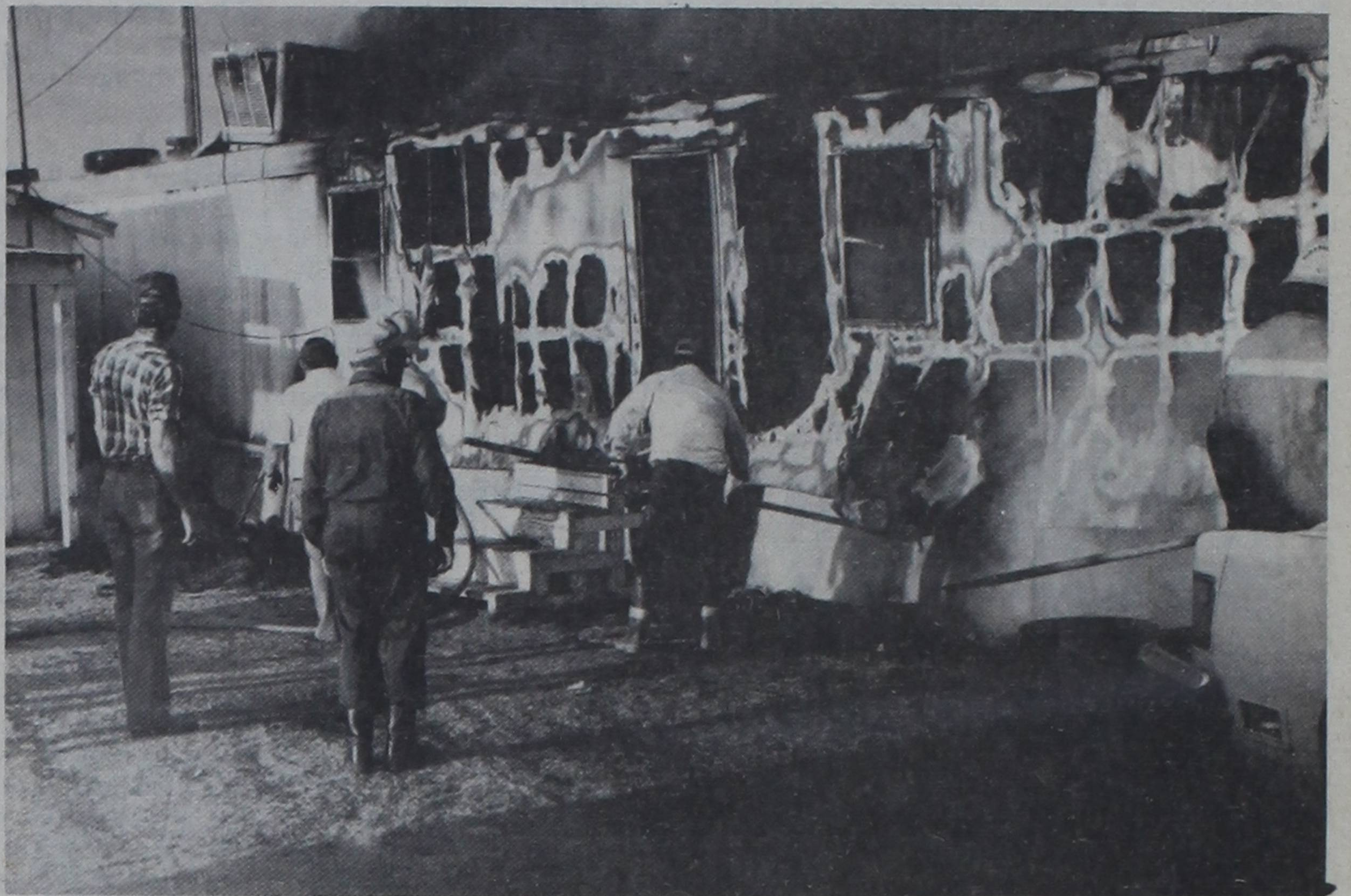
## Egg Hunt Sunday

## Trailer House Lost; Family Is Spared

Easter week was not a happy one for the Joe Smith family, who lived in a trailer house just west of Hub.

The trailer caught fire when a water heater exploded Wednesday afternoon. The three-bedroom trailer house was completely destroyed by the fire.

The Friona Fire Department answered the summons, but by the time the firemen arrived at the scene, the trailer was completely engulfed in flames.

The Smith family escaped from the burning trailer house with just the clothes they were wearing, and a television set.

Also staying with the Smiths and their two pre-school age youngsters were their married daughter, Laura Cantrell and her two infants.

The fire put the two families out of a home, as well as without food and clothing.

Smith, an employee of PACO Feed Yard, was trying to be philosophical while his home was being consumed by the blaze.

"I am a heart patient, and if this had happened at night, I might not have woke up," he said, explaining that his medication pretty well "knocks him out."

The Smiths' son-in-law, Randy Cantrell, the daughter and infants had been staying with them in the trailer house while Cantrell was looking for a job. He just this week had found a job with Carl Bruegel, and the young couple and their children were making plans to move into a place of their own, when the unfortunate accident happened.

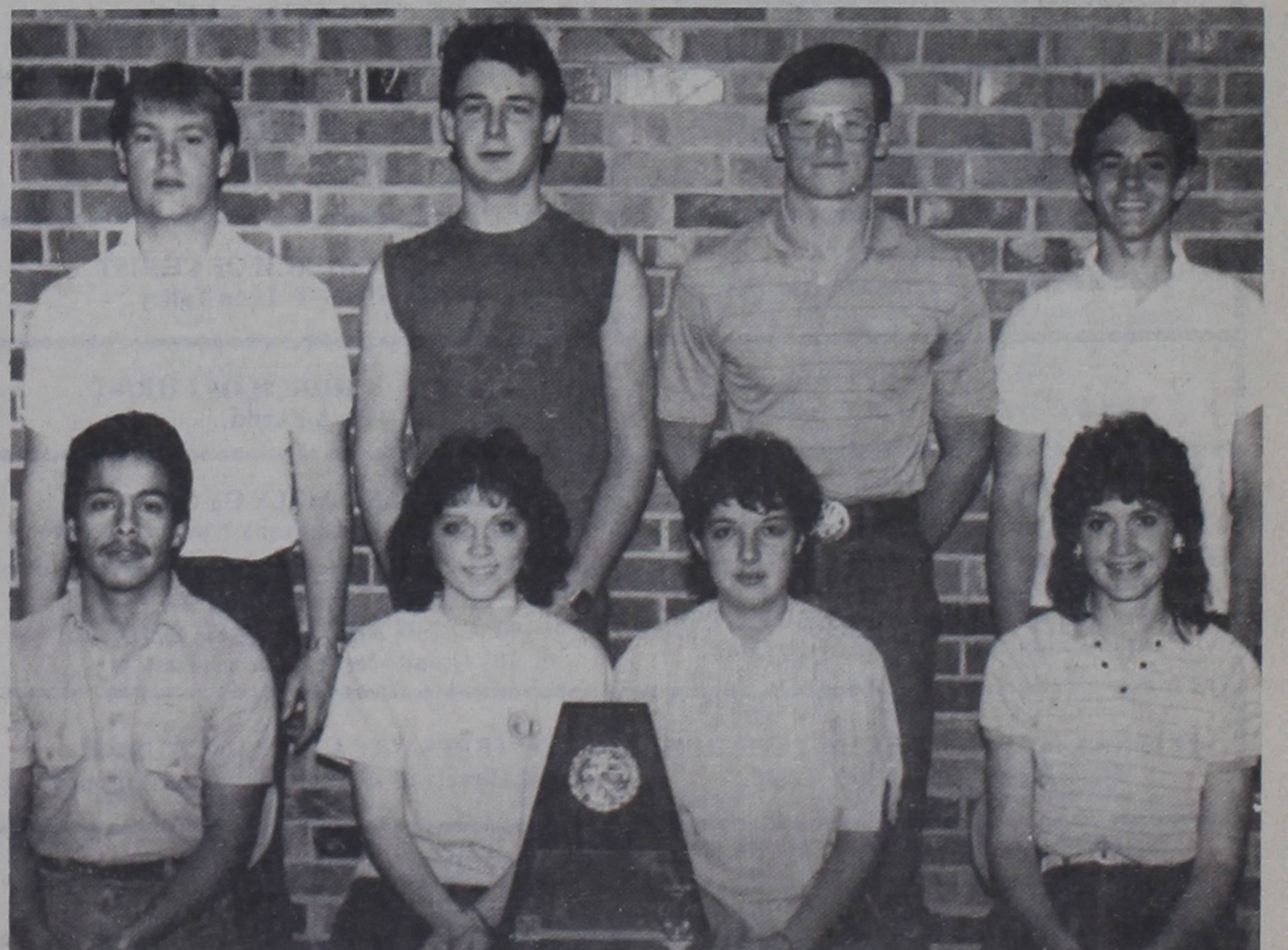
No explanation was available as to why the water heater exploded.

"It just blew up, and suddenly everything was on fire," Laura Cantrell said.

"I grabbed the TV set, the women grabbed the kids, and we got outside," Smith said. Due to the rapid-spreading fire, it was not possible for the family members to go back inside to save much of anything else.

They had managed to get a couple of blankets, and had made a pallet outside the trailer house for the young children. They could only watch helplessly as the firemen worked to contain the blaze, which proceeded to consume everything inside.

The Smiths were renting the trailer house from Ed Walters. They had lived at Hub for the past two years.

....from the files of The Friona Star

## 55 YEARS AGO--APRIL 4, 1930

Occasionally indications of the progress and prosperity of the territory surrounding Friona at the present time appear in unexpected places, yet are the more welcome in that they help establish the fact that people are better contented throughout this region and are planning homes of greater convenience and comfort. During

the past week, Blythe Bros., Delco-Light and Frigidaire distributors have installed nineteen Delco-Light plants in farm homes in the region they serve. Among these were R.P. Daniel and Hugh Lee of Friona.

## 50 YEARS AGO--APRIL 5, 1935

In 1935, a one year subscription to the Friona Star cost \$1.50 for a year.

## 45 YEARS AGO--APRIL 5, 1940

F.A. Spring, who has succeeded Dan Ethridge in the insurance business here, moved his family here last Saturday, and is occupying the Kinsley house that was vacated by Mr. and Mrs. Ethridge, when they moved to Lubbock. Spring will be in charge of the agency office, the name of which has been changed to The F.A. Spring Agency.

## 40 YEARS AGO--APRIL 6, 1945

Owing to two wrecks that occurred on the Santa Fe Railroad on Thursday of last week, the mail service here was badly demoralized. One of the wrecks occurred west of Clovis, during the early part of the day, and the other occurred at Friona, just west of the stock pens, during the afternoon. No mail was received here Thursday and Friday.

## 30 YEARS AGO--MARCH 31, 1955

Dillie M. Kelley was tendered contract for the position of Superintendent of Schools in Friona Monday evening. Kelley, in signing the two-year contract, will take over July 1 from Supt. Dalton Caffey who has submitted his resignation with two years still to run on his present three-year contract.

## 20 YEARS AGO--APRIL 1, 1965

The Friona School Board this week let a contract to Vibra-Whirl and Company of Panhandle on a bid of \$52,975 for the construction of a new football stadium at Friona High School. The bid figure will include the building of a permanent stadium on the west side of the proposed field, which will contain 1533 seats exclusive of isle space.

## 15 YEARS AGO--APRIL 2, 1970

Residents of Friona will be called upon for the second time to vote for or against a one-cent city sales tax this Saturday, as a highlight of the annual city and school elections. City Manager Jake Outland points out that in reality, the vote will give residents an opportunity to choose between a sales tax as a means of additional revenue, or the alternative of a raise in property tax.

# Moseley's Rites Held Tuesday

Funeral services for David Moseley, 92, were held Tuesday, April 2, in the First United Methodist Church of Friona with Rev. Archie Echols, pastor, and Rev. Daymun White, pastor of the First Baptist Church, officiating.

Burial was in the Friona Cemetery under the direction of Ellis-Blackwell Funeral Home.

Born December 9, 1892 in Wood County, Texas, Moseley had been a resident of Parmer County since 1926, moving here from Hammon, Oklahoma. He was a former Parmer County Commissioner, former member of the Friona School Board and served in the U.S. Army during World War I.

Moseley married Eva B. Collier July 3, 1919 in Ringling, Oklahoma. She preceded him in death May 28, 1965. He married Gladys Wright March 24, 1976 in Childress. Moseley died Sunday, March 31, in Prairie Acres Nursing Home.

Survivors include his wife, Gladys of Friona; two sons, Hugh Moseley of Farwell and Jack Moseley of Friona; one daughter, Mrs. Edith Johnson of Friona; one step-son, Jarrell Wright of Friona; one sister, Mrs. Carrie Collier of Madill, Oklahoma; eight

grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.

Pallbearers were C.L. Vestal, R.J. Renner, Jr., Lloyd Rector, W.S. Ingram, Chris Ingram, John Ingram, Eric Rushing, and Lloyd Mingus.

Honorary pallbearers were friends and family.

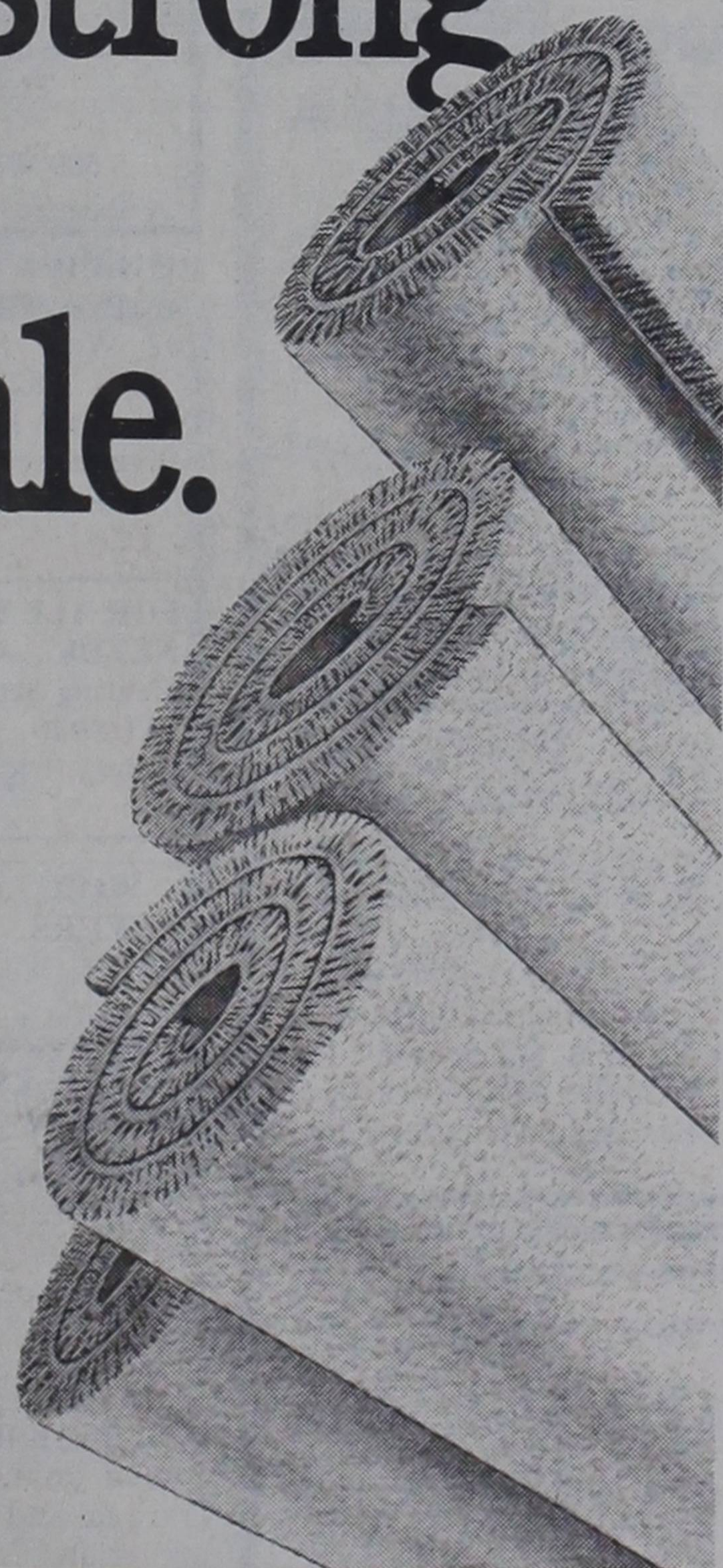

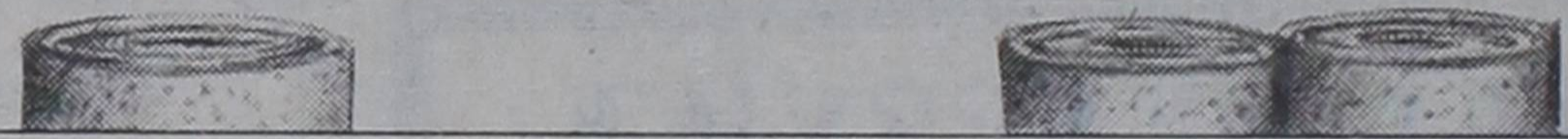

## Around The House

Food irradiation may offer a nonchemical alternative to commercial food storage problems and provide advantages to consumers.

Irradiation preserves food by using high energy gamma rays, X-rays, or electrons to kill microorganisms and insects that can contaminate foods. The energy levels used are so low that they do not make the food radioactive.

Since use of certain chemicals, such as ethylene dibromide (EDB), on stored grains and citrus fruits has been suspended, there is renewed interest in using irradiation.

The irradiation process was first patented for food preservation in France in 1930, and it is currently used in 121 countries. Potatoes, grain products, chicken, fish, and strawberries are among the 31 products treated by irradiation in other countries.

Today, in the United States, only spices and powdered vegetable seasonings are commercially irradiated. But the Food and Drug Administration has proposed a rule which would allow processors to irradiate a wider range of foods.

Unlike the sterilization of food by cooking, irradiation raises the temperature of the food only slightly. That minimizes nutrient loss and changes in texture, color and flavor.

In addition to destroying insects, irradiation treatment causes chemical and physiological changes that delay ripening of some fruits or sprouting in root crops, which is an obvious advantage in storing and transporting food.

A low dose of irradiation can destroy food-borne parasites, such as trichinae, the organisms that cause the disease trichinosis in swine and humans. Irradiation also provides an alternative to chemical fumigants like EDB and preservatives like sodium nitrate and nitrite.

Irradiation technology has many implications for the American food industry and food consumers.

Anyone who has a child that will be five years of age on or before September 1, 1985 is asked to contact the principal's office or phone 247-3340 so their name can be included on the mailing list.

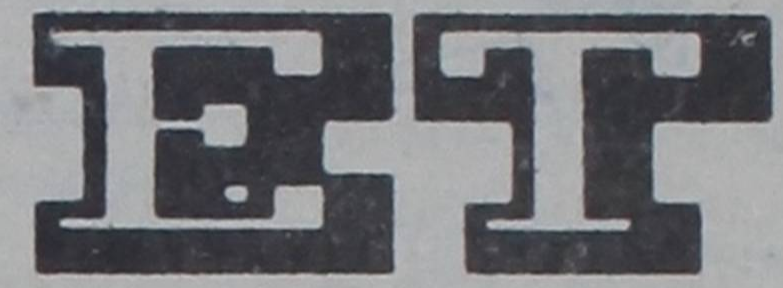

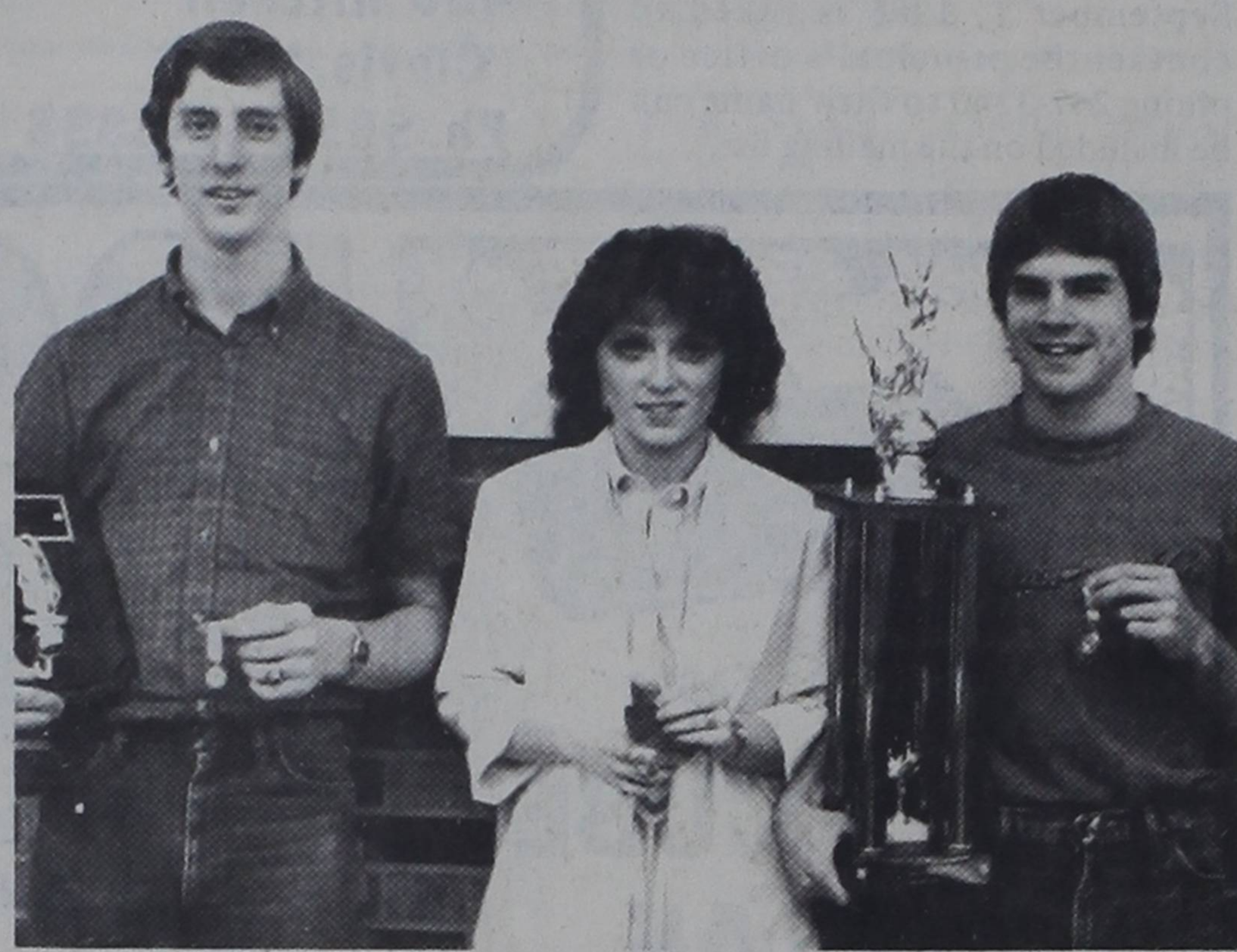

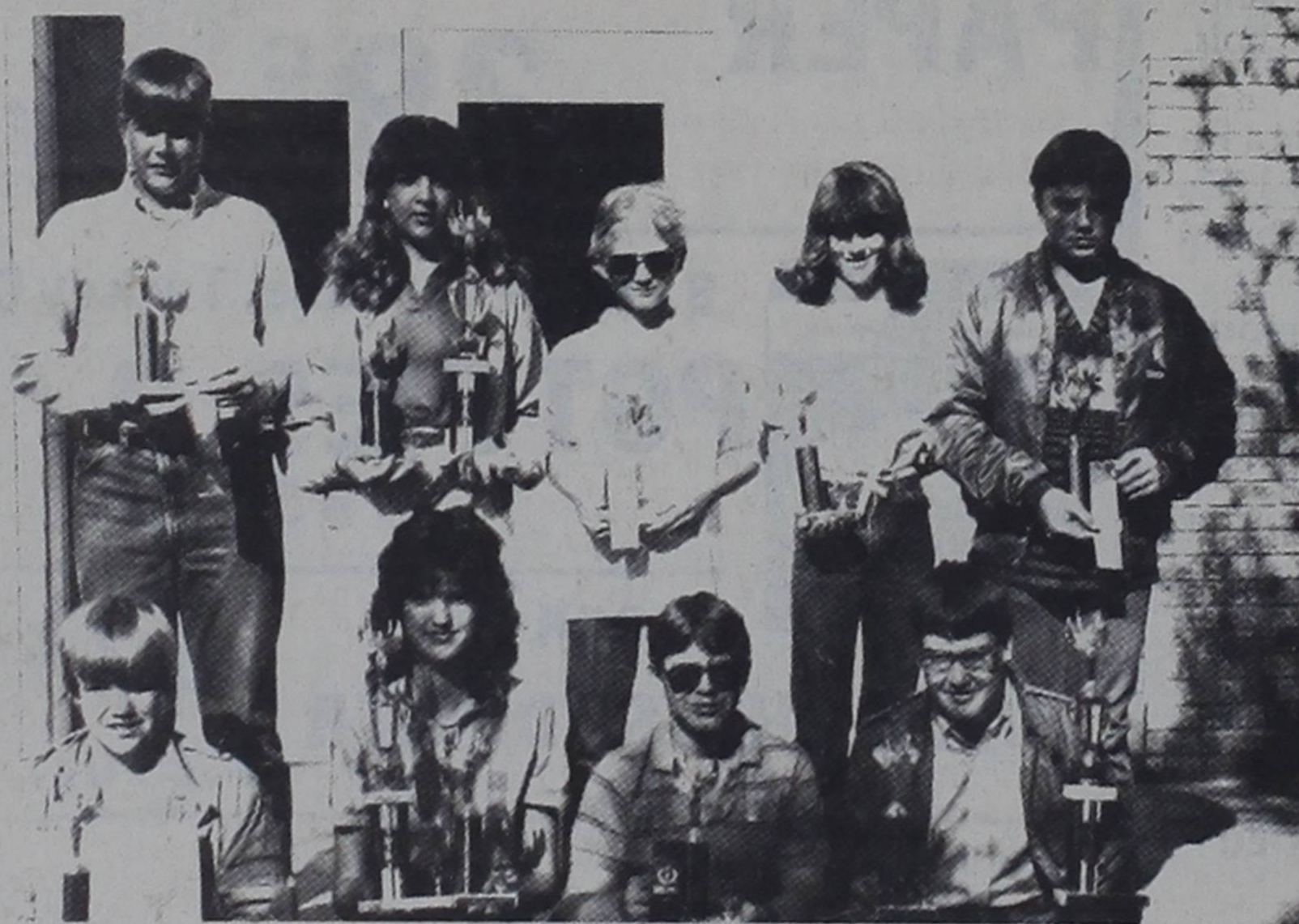

# New Surgery May Eliminate Glasses

Dr. B.W. Armistead, local optometrist, recently returned from an exciting and unusual seminar in Austin at the Bailey Square Surgical Center. He was one of 29 optometrists who were privileged to observe a new and revolutionary surgical procedure called "Radial Keratotomy" where myopia (nearsightedness) is either drastically reduced or eliminated.

Dr. Doyle Leslie, an ophthalmologist and an anterior eye segment surgeon, performed the surgery and lectured to the group in attendance. Dr. Leslie studied under the American doctor who brought this innovative procedure from Russia to the United States. It was first performed in Russia by an eye surgeon named Dr. Svyatoflav Fyodorov in Moscow a little over ten years ago. Dr. Leslie has performed over 5,000 Radial Keratotomy's since 1980...more

than any other surgeon in the United States.

Drs. Armistead and Smith of Littlefield have been approved for the necessary "Pre-Surgery Exams" required to determine if a patient is a good candidate for this new surgical procedure. They have also been approved for the "Post Surgical Care" of these patients when the patient returns home following surgery. A telephone wats line is available for their use to keep in touch with the eye surgeon should any problems develop following surgery.

In describing this new surgical procedure, Dr. Armistead said that the thickness of the cornea is measured precisely with a special instrument. The cornea has five layers and the surgeon is most careful not to penetrate the fifth layer but he must make the incision deep enough to produce the desired results. The greater the

amount of myopia which needs to be reduced, the deeper the incision must be made. A special surgical instrument is used whereby the exact depth of the blade can be set...making the incision exactly the desired depth.

The surgery is done under a local anesthetic, using eye drops to deaden the cornea. It only takes about 15 minutes and is done as an out-patient procedure. The patient goes home the same day the surgery is performed, and usually the operated eye does not need to wear a bandage.

Using a high-power surgical microscope, eight radial, micro-fine incisions are made on the outside surface of the cornea. These micro incisions are made outside the central optical zone of the cornea so that the central optical zone (direct vision) is not effected. As the cornea heals, these tiny incisions cause a flattening of the cornea...thus reducing the amount of myopia (nearsightedness).

Radial Keratotomy is not for everyone and yet it is a "God-send" for some nearsighted patients who find eyeglasses or contact lenses unacceptable or undesirable.

This new surgery to reduce or eliminate myopia is typical of the enormous progress being made in the eye care field. Patients in this area who think they might be interested in this type of surgery may contact Dr. Armistead or Dr. Smith of Littlefield and they will be happy to discuss it in detail and determine if you would be a good candidate for this procedure. They have a video tape which can be shown to prospective patients which vividly points out the advantages and the disadvantages of this new surgical procedure.
