## What's the Matter With Texas

 A circular issued by the government, Sept., 25th, shows that a widerange of prices are being paid for cotton and cotton seed in the different cotton states. The price in North Carolina is $\$ 60$ per ton for seed and 34.6 per pound for cotton. In Texas they are paying $\$ 26.10$ for seed and 28.8 for cotton. It is hard to reconcile this difference on a fair and just basis. Texas is placed on record as paying less for cotton and seed than
any other State in the cotton region, any other State in the cotton region,
and if the figures quoted in the circular are absolutely correct we are placed in a very unenviable position Farmers are strongly urged by J. W Neill, Director of the Institutes in Texas, to hold their cotton for 48 cents, middling basis. and to demand $\$ 50$ per ton for seed.-Ralls Banner
