THIS YEAR marks the 50th anniversary of the rural electrification movement in Texas.

Tommy Weemes of the Deaf Smith REC brought us the following article, penned by C.G. Scruggs, editor of the Progressive Farmer.

Those of you who "bridged the gap" between lamps for light and electric lights will no doubt identify with some of his thoughts.

#### THE MAGIC OF "LIGHTS"

"Few moments in life can be compared with that "magic" day when--for the first time--we reached up and pulled the metal chain on a single-drop socket hanging from the ceiling and the room flooded with light.

Only those who lived without electricity for years can understand. Trying to read, to study, to do handwork in the dim yellow glow of kerosene lamps was difficult and eye straining. Even the advanced Aladdin lamps or carbide lights were weak compared with "electric lights."

Those who were born into the electric age in rural areas can't possibly imagine the drabness, the dullness, that marked life on the farm without electricity.

No hot water unless you heated it on a wood stove.

No refrigerators. No icemakers. No air conditioners.

Countless "no's."

Ironing day in the summer was fire in the kitchen stove was necessary to keep the flat irons warm. Flushed faces beaded with perspiration, damp blouses, blistered fingers, drudgery, and of every farm wife and daughter.

The twin to the misery of ironing sat in the backyard-the iron washpot, black-stained from wood fires that burned in hot weather and cold. Nearby was the backbreaking, knuckle-burning washboard.

the roof of our farm garage for hours, each day for weeks, watching the distant crews as they "set" the light poles and strung the wire. I thought they would never was wired with single-drop sockets and bulbs in each room. No other electric appliance was then affordable.

Finally, finally, finally came the day when the meter was installed and the final connection made.

A magic moment. No thrill since has matched it.

It's important to remember that electricity came late to the rural areas of America--long after the cities and towns routinely enjoyed its benefits. Rural America lived in darkness and suffered backbreaking labor until the momentous REA legislation was enacted into law.

The fierce pride that farm people once held for their rural electric cooperatives (REC's) has since subsided into indifference, and the luxury of electric power is now taken for granted."





Nationwide, most electrical accidents involving the public occur because of carelessness, Martinez said.

"Because people are so used to overhead lines, sometimes they don't notice them or they forget how much power is in them," he said.

People working around the house--painting, trimming trees or doing other jobs--must remember to keep themselves and their tools and equipment away from power lines," Martinez said.

"The slightest touch could be enough to seriously injure or kill," he said.

Electricity always seeks the shortest path to the ground. It easily through travels "conductors." Metal, water, trees and the human body are excellent conductors of electricity, Martinez explained.

Handymen and professional painters should make sure ladders don't place them high enough that they could contact a power line. Aluminum ladders, which are good conductors, should themselves be kept away from lines, Martinez said.

Outdoor TV, radio and CB antennas pose another hazard. They're often unwieldy and tall enough to touch overhead lines. Installation of outdoor antennas should be left to professionals," Martinez advised.


In rural areas, irrigation pipe should be handled with care. "Lightweight irrigation pipe is an excellent conductor of electricity," Martinez said. "Many sections are tall enough when lifted to hit overhead lines. Farmers need to be extremely careful when moving pipe. Rabbit hunters who lift irrigation pipe to chase out rabbits need to be just as careful."

SPS linemen who work with power lines are well trained and have a variety of special clothing and equipment to protect themselves. "And still they always respect the power in those lines," he said.

Children, especially, need to be taught to respect the power of electricity. "They need to know the dangers of playing near a substation, climbing trees that have power lines through them, and flying kites near overhead lines,' Martinez said.

Storms can cause potentially dangerous situations by knocking down power lines. "If you see a line from a utility pole hanging down or on the ground, stay away from it," Martinez said. "Assume it's a live wire. Call SPS or the police or fire department immediately."
