Electricity always seeks the shortest path to the ground. It
travels easily through "conductors." Metal, water, trees and the human body are excellent conductors of electricity, Martinez Handym painters should make sure ladders don't place them high enough that they could contact a power line. Aluminum ladders, which are good conductors, should lines, Martinez said.
Outdoor TV, radio and CB
Onter antennas pose another hazard. They're often unwieldy and tall enough to touch overhead lines. should be left to professionals, Martinez advised.
In rural areas, irrigation pipe
should should be handled with care. "Lightweight irrigation pipe is an Martinez said. "Many sections are all enough when lifted to overhead lines. Farmers need to be extremely careful when moving
