BAIRD-Kenneth Mark Melman, 17, of Fort Worth, received a 45-day jail term Thursday following his guilty plea to a reduced possession of marijuana charge before 42nd District Judge Don Lane here. The charge was reduced to a Class A misdemeanor due to the possession of marijuana being less than 4 ozs. Melman admitted possessing 13 "lids"

of marijuana on January 5 when he was arrested two miles east of Baird by DPS Troopers Bill Russell and David Mayes and Callahan County Deputy Sheriff Ed Duncan.

The car Melman was driving was determined to have been stolen. After he finishes the jail term, he will be transferred to Tarrant County to face trial on felony theft charges.

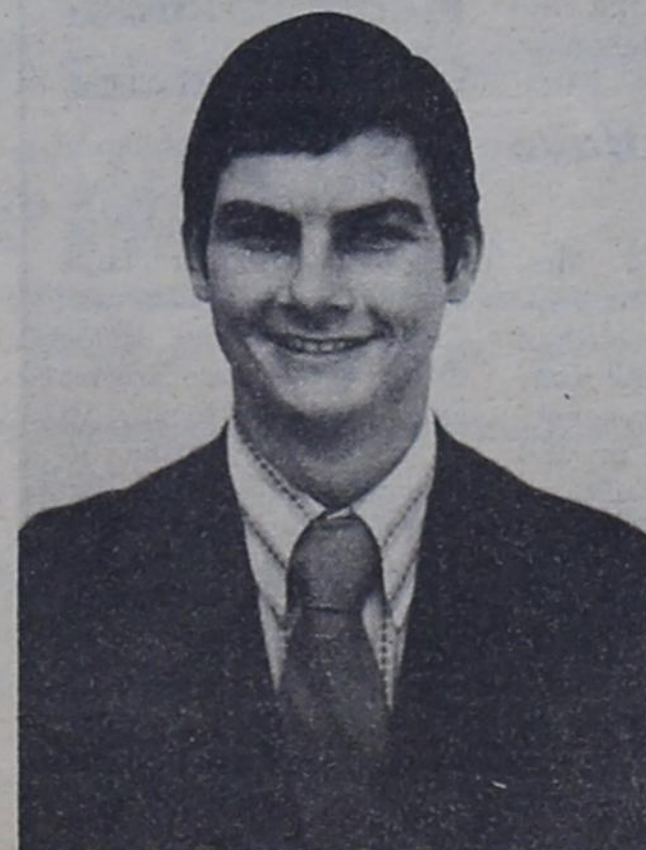

## Shackelford Is New Baird Student Teacher

BAIRD-Roy Shackelford, senior Agricultural Education major from Tarleton State University, has begun his student teaching in the Baird Public Schools. He is under the supervision of Dick Vestal, vocational agriculture teacher.

Shackelford will be in the community from March 12 through May 9 for the purpose of receiving training for vocational agriculture teaching. This arrangement has been made by mutual agreement between Mr. Bill Gunn, Superintendent of Schools, and Tarleton State University. The student teacher will assist with all activities concerning the local vocational agriculture program. Upon completion of this training period he will receive the Bachelor of Science degree from Tarleton State University and be eligible for a vocational agriculture teaching certificate.

Drs. Bill Irick, Johnny Johnson, and Len Steakley are the Tarleton State University supervisors for the teacher education program in the Department of Agricultural Education.

### Mailbox Theft In Eula Area Now Solved

BAIRD—According to the Callahan County Sheriff's Department, the mailbox theft that occurred in the Eula area February 19 has been solved.

A juvenile was responsible for taking mail out of the box, and for forging a name on a check from the box and cashing it.

The owner of the check stopped payment on it and notified the sheriff's department of the theft.

After notification, the officials went to the house to obtain the check in question and went to the store that it was cashed at for positive identification of the suspect.

The suspect was then talked to and after obtaining a statement from him, he was brought before Judge Mack Kniffen on forgery charges.

Last week, another mailbox theft was reported in the Clyde Lake vicinity.

In other news, sheriff's department

officials transported a juvenile to the Brownwood State School.

The youth, who previously been charged in 4 different burglaries, was seized by Callahan County Sheriff officials inside the house while in the process of burglarizing it.

The youth was brought before Judge Don Lane and sentenced to the Brownwood State School.

The W.H. Varner ranch, located 12 miles south of Baird on 283, was burglarized sometime between 2-28-79 and 3-3-79. Several items were taken in the burglary including a Duncan Phyfe sofa, china cabinet, dishes, rugs, chairs, etc. Varner has posted a \$200 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of subject or subjects in connection with this incident.

A \$1000 reward is still being offered for information on the plastic pipe theft on the Caldwell lease, south of Admiral.

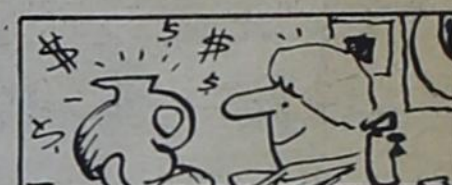

### Mendez Found Innocent In Rape Trial

BAIRD—Luciano Mendez, 79, was found not guilty Friday by a 42nd District Court jury of charges that he raped his 16-year-old granddaughter on March 13, 1978.

The 5-man, 7-woman jury deliberated about 2 hours before returning the ver-

dict. Mendez had denied the teenager's claims that he fathered the child she abandoned in a trash can behind Baird High School on in November.

Criminal District Attorney Pat Elliott prosecuted. Abilene attorney John Weeks was appointed to represent Mendez.

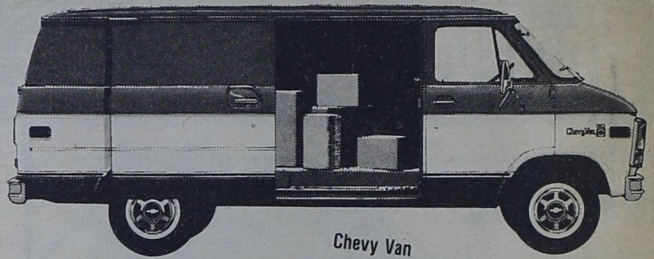
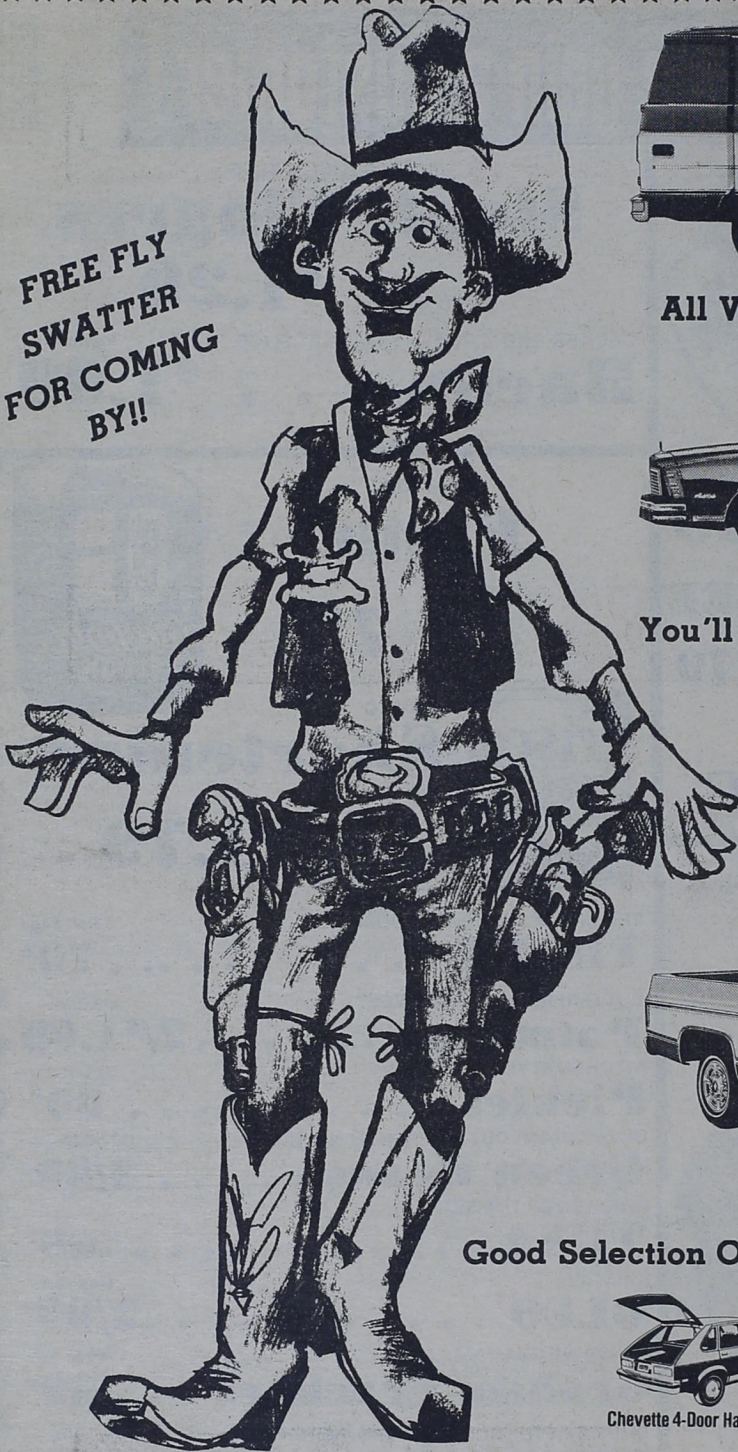

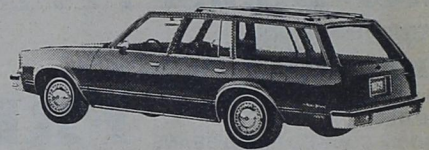
