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# National Bank Absorbs State at Levelland

A deal was consummated last week by which the First National Bank bought the business and assets of the First State Bank, the change becoming effective Wednesday. So quiet had the negotiations proceeded that the public had little or no knowledge of the impending fact but one bank, and the matter came largely as a surprise. The books of the State Bank were

transferred to the First National early that morning and the deposits were transferred to that institution

and the business went on as usual. Both banks made good statements as of December 31st. but the conviction had been growing among the officials that two banks in Levelland, under present conditions, would not be profitable to the extent that the money tied up as capital stock would return dividends that would justify a continuance. Banks, as have other business institutions, have within the past few years suffered a large increase in overhead expenses while interest rates remain the same as in previous periods. For the past several years the dollar has been worth only about 60 or 70 per cent of its value prior to the world war, the salaries of help has been higher, and for these reasons it has been necessary for a bank to do twice the amount of business as formerly to declare the same dividend. That is the principal reason that there are today 6,000 fewer banks in the United States than

there were ten years ago. The officials of the two banks are to be commended for the fact that they among themselves solved their their patrons.
