

If you do not have this transfer made in the State records, you will have to pay a Penalty of \$2.50 for your neglect, instead of a Dollar as here tofore. AND if you do not have this transfer made before 20 days you will be charged a Penalty of \$5.00. This Law is now in effect. That you may have the advantage of this Knowledge, I am taking this means of warning dealers in Automobiles of this Penalty to save you money.
