as $\$ 49,400,000,000$ as compared with \$44,400,000,000 in 1933 . Each of the 12 major industrial groups, with the exception of the electric light and power and manufactured gas indus-

mint, except interest, shared the rise. Generally, the 1934 gains were largest in those industries and types corded the largest relative decline during the depression.
