Kaiser Bill $T$ HE sinking of four ships in March, United States and Germany. <br> The sinking of six shlps in Mareh, 1859, averted a war between the United States and Germany. <br> Forty-seven years ago Amerlea and Germany were Involved in a dispute over the question of soverelgnty of the Samoan islands. When the diplomatic quarrel reached an acute stage. both nations rushed warships to the South seas. <br> All of these ships left thelr home ports with definite instructions to tight If necessary and with officers and men expecting a battle. <br> Then the god of storms "stole the show" from the god of war. March 15 and 16,1589 , were the dates of the great samoan hurricane. When it struck, there were in the harbor of Apla, besides the three American and German battleships, the British man-of-war, Calliope, six large verchant ships and 25 coasting vessels of various sizes. Shlp after ship was destroyed. The Calliope alone escaped. The "sea power" of the two nations, <br> which were abcut to go to war, was wiped out of existence and both wouldbe belligerents decided to arbltrate thelr difficulties. For the next 30 years they exercised foint control over Samoa.
