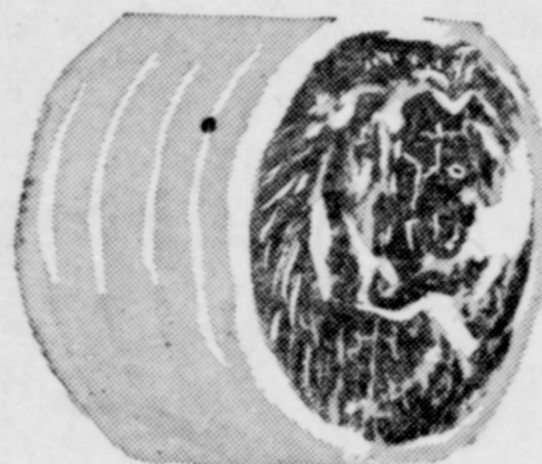

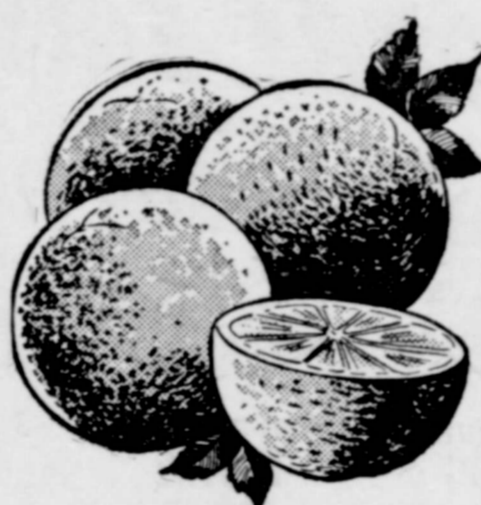

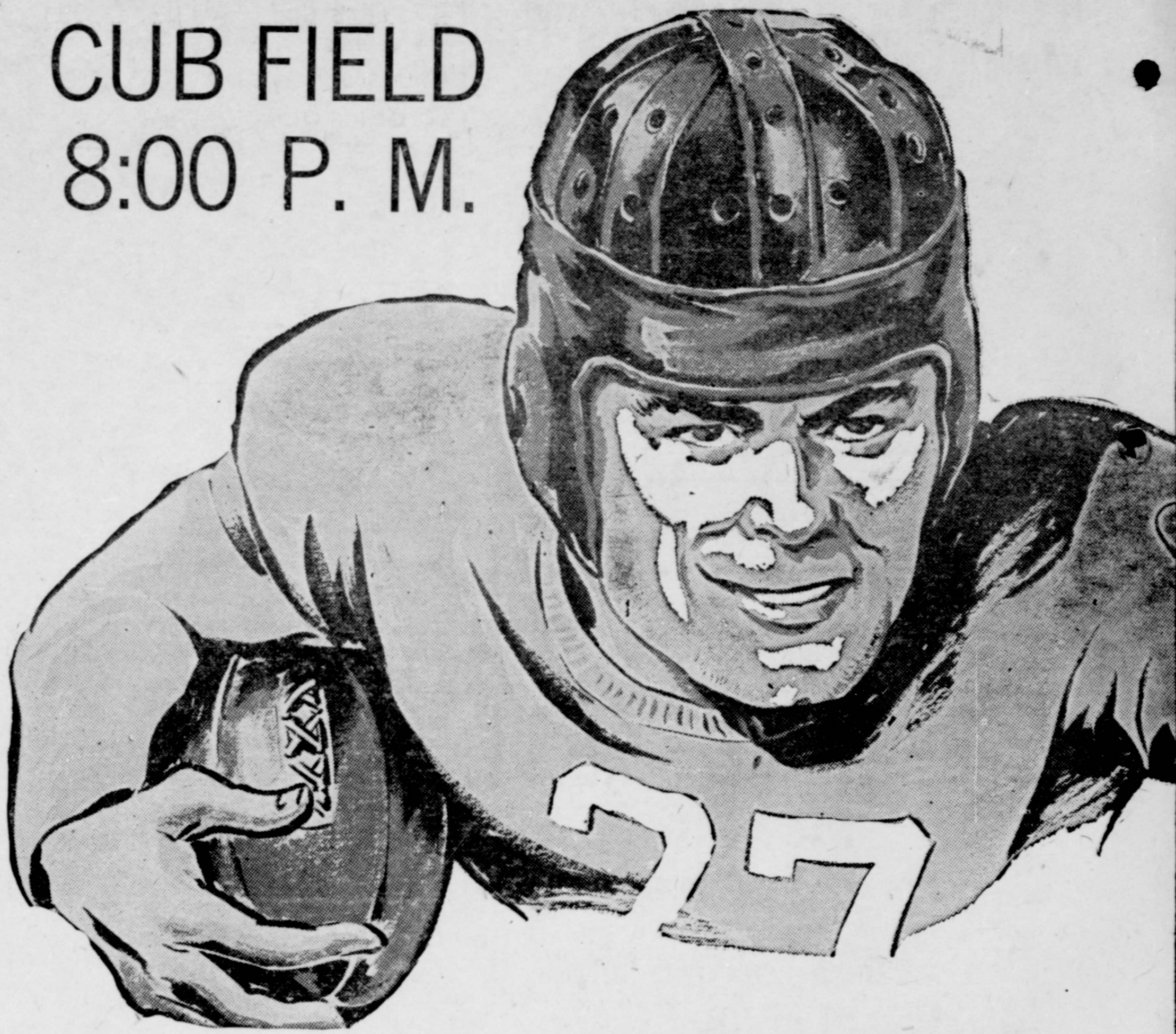

The next club meeting will be with Mrs. Edna Howard on the 12th of November.—Reporter.

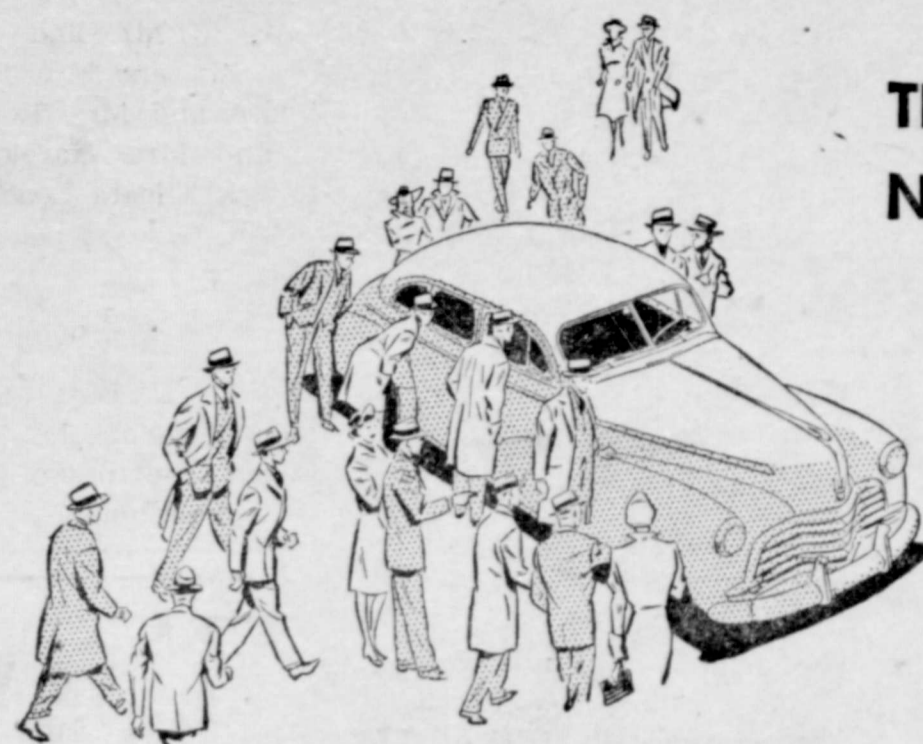

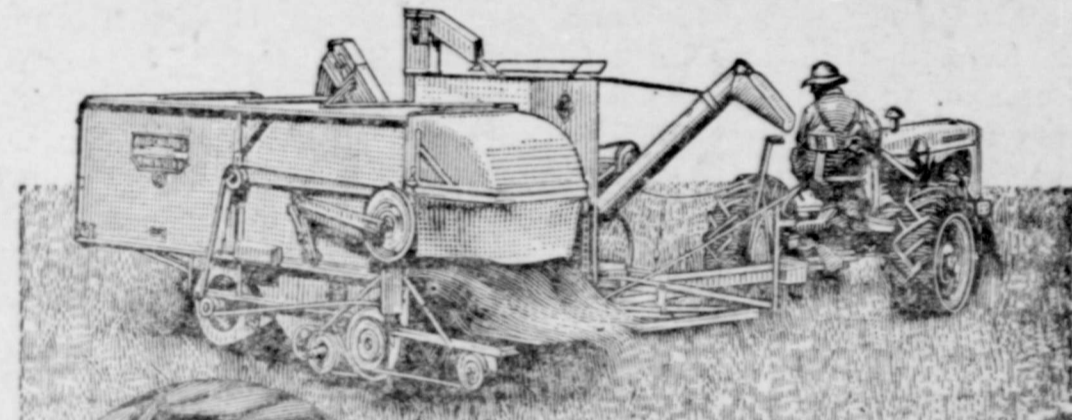

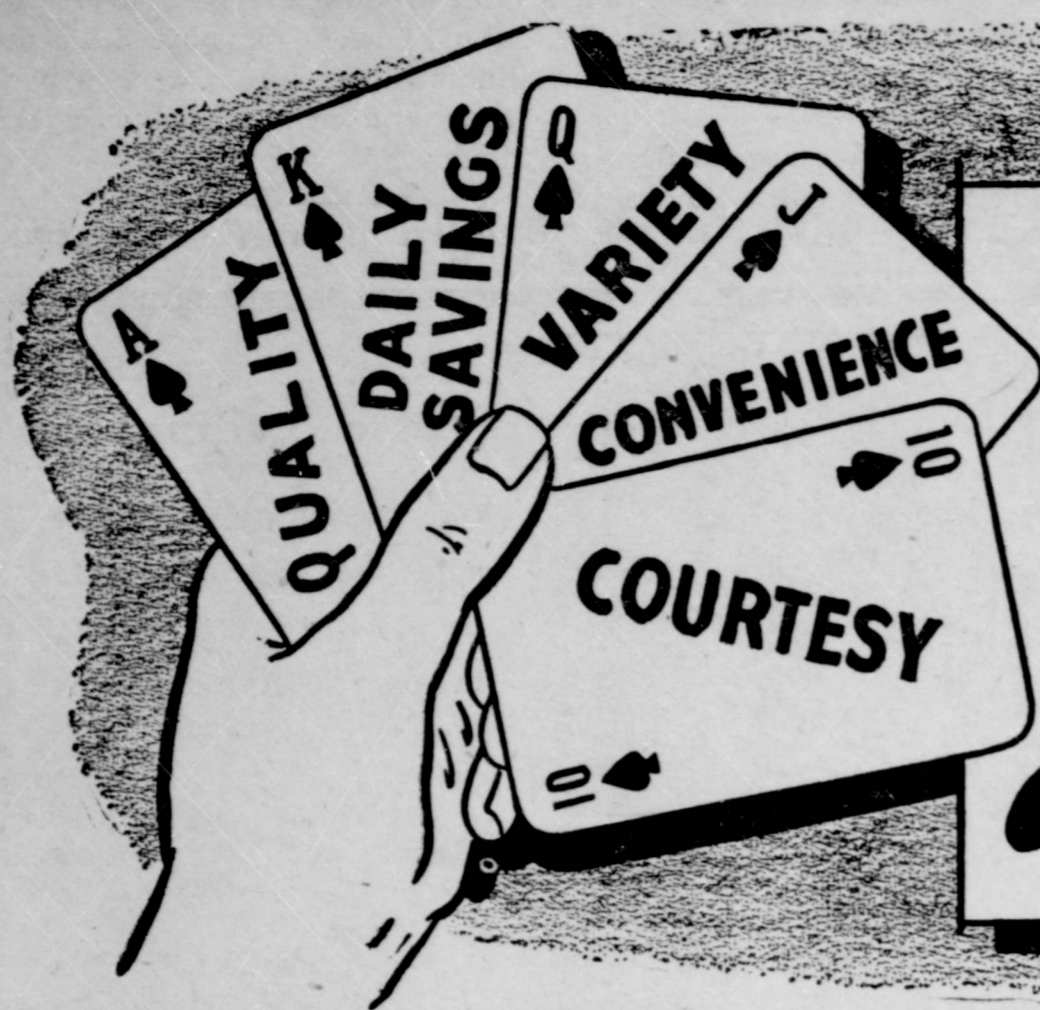
