## "TAAS" Scores High In Friona

Friona Independent School Distric
rated high in the Texas Assessmen rated high in the Texas Assessmen
of Academic Scores (TAAS) compared to other schools its size in the region.
The scores were leaked to the media recently and have been widely publicized, although they were no
intended to be released by the Texas Education Agency.
hools in the South Plains region Friona's TAAS scores were the
The TEA ranked school district according to the percentage of how rade students passed all parts of the TAAS, which was administered last spring.
Friona had 55.33 per cent of the Friona had 55.33 per cent of the
students taking the TAAS test to pass, 135 of the 244 students
taking it. This was well above the taking it. This was well above the
state average of 46 per cent that passed.
Besides having the top ranking among the area's class AAA
schools, Friona also ranked 18th overall among the 76 schools in the region.

A pair of juniors--Juan Gamboa and Chris Hanna, finished 1-2 in scoring and in yards gained rushing,
Gamboa led in rushing with 544 yards to 525 for Hanna. But Hanna led the scoring department with 42 points, to 24 for Gamboa. Another pair of juniors, Jimmy
Arias and Jay Belcher, led the Arias and Jay Belcher, led the catches for 346 yards, and Belcher had seven catches for 158 yards. Arias had a pair of TD catches, and Belcher one. passing with 791 Be fing led in his career as a Chieftain quarterback as the all-time leader in yards gained passing, with 3,080 yards. He gained 1,511 yards as a junior, when he led the area yards as a sophomore and 97 as a freshman.

## Soil Moisture Survey Underway For High Plains Water District

High Plains Water District and USDA-Soil Conservation Service (USDA-SCS) personnel are now collecting data for the annual preplant soil moisture survey.

The purpose of the survey is The purpose of the survey is to determine tye general soir moisture
availability and deficit trends across the 15-county High Plains Water District service area.

Review of the pre-plant soil moisture survey information helps
agricultural producers determine the agricunt of water they need to apply to bring their five-foot root zone soil profile to field capacity without over-irigating or under-irrigating. Historical data shows that there
a better likelihood of producing is a better likelihood of producing
above-average crop yields when the above-average crop yields when the
plant root zone of the soil is at or near field capacity prior to planting.
"Unless the area receives significant precipitation during the
winter, we expect to find exite the winter, we expect to find extremely
dry soil conditions at most of the 310 soil moisture monitoring sites within the Water Doistrict," said
Wilfred E "Willie" Wilfred E. "Willie" Crenwelge,

DA-SCS soil scientist.
"Irrigation for the 1993
"Irrigation for the 1993
rowing season ended in early growing season ended in early
August. Since that time, there has been very little precipitation. Crops remaining in the field continued to deplete the available soil moisture from that time until
first freeze," he added. first freeze," he added.

Crenwelge and Brian Houston

The USDA-SCS soil scientist noted that 20 additional temporary soil moisture sites will be read in newly-annexed portions of Cochran and Hale counties. Permanent sites have already been installed in the County.
