# Friona school board to purchase defibrillators

The Friona school board met in regular session Thursday February 21 at 7 p.m. A discussion was held with woodworking teacher Danny Campbell and auto mechanics teacher Mitch Terry about program needs in their departments.

An inter-local election agreement with the city was approved. The city and the school district will have a joint polling place for the May elections. Kim Thompson was appointed election clerk for the district.

The board approved an order of election for two trustee positions. The terms of Danny Hand and Tracy Bunker are expiring. Sign-up for the school board election is available at the superintendents office from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday thru Friday. Deadline for filing a candidate application is March 10.

In other business the board approved recommendations on school policy from the Texas Association of School Boards and approved the purchase of 7 defibrillators for placement in the district.

The board reviewed performance of administrative personnel and extended contracts with a cost of living salary adjustment and also reviewed Special Ed staff not on the state salary scale and adjusted salaries.

The next school board meeting will be held March 13 at 5 p.m. in the board room of the administration building.





Prep time 15 minutes

1 jar (16 oz) Aunt Nellie's sliced or whole pickled beets, drained and chopped.

1 medium orange, peeled, seeded and diced or ½ cup

diced, drained mandarin oranges


2 tbsp chopped green onion

2 tbsp minced cilantro

1 tbsp fresh lime juice 2 tsp minced fresh ginger

1/4 tsp salt

1. Place all ingredients in medium bowl; stir gently to combine. Cover and refrigerate about 30 minutes to let flavors blend. Serve with crackers, flatbread, or chips. Makes about two cups.


