

#### Envy of the World.

The history of the world, since recorded time began, has been blackened at regular and frequent intervals by terrible famines Countless millions have died miserably from hunger. And thos cataclysms were not confined to long past, primitive times. In the last quarter century starvation has stalked through China, Russia and other nations

Yet, in the United States, we have never had a famine. may say short-sightedly that this is because we are blessed with an abundance of resources. But other countries, where the standard of living is abysmally low compared with ours, have great resources hunger-ridden nations the average man and woman work much longer hours, and performed a great deal more manual labor than does the

The basic reason for our abundance lies elsewhere. It has been in a theory of government that encourages every man to do his utmos and reap the rewards that has stimulated voluntary, individual enter prise and that, finlly, has given every mn the right to compete with any other in his chosen field.

We see how this system works on every hand. As a simple example, every American can walk into a store and buy all the meat something that is impossible in most other countries Free enterprise is responsible for putting that meat in the butcher's showcase - for turning steers, hogs and other animals into cuts tha are ready for consumption. To meet the needs of the country, great packing industry has been developed to bridge the gap between the livestock producer and our homes. It performs a vital serviat a cost which is almost unbelievably small.

So it goes, in every field of enterprise. Free people, working in a free economy, have made the American standard of living the envy of the world.

#### Unemployment Insurance Abuses.

Is state unemployment insurance becoming something of a racket in many instances? The official figures lead one to that unsavor


In 1946 a year of full employment, the ratio of benefits paid t contributions collected for the country as a whole was 12.1 per cent Eighteen states paid out more in benefits than they received in ur employment levies, and three paid out more than twice as much.

The experience in 1947 was a little better. But the ratio of benefits paid to contributions collected was over 70 per cent, and several states paid out more than they took in,

It must be kept in mind that this happened during years when the national income, employment and production in general were at an all-time peak. In another depression with its consequent mass unemployment, it is almost impossible to visualize what would happer to the funds. Obviously, their receipt would be only a drop in the bucket compared to outgo, and a stupendous burden would be placed on the taxpavers,

men are using the unemployment funds as a means of obtaining free vacations when they don't feel like working - and that laxity either in the law or in the administration of the law is making this possible, That is an inexcusable abuse of a system which ws set up to help find a job after a period of honest, aggressive searching. It mus be stopped, and it can only be stopped by action within the states.


