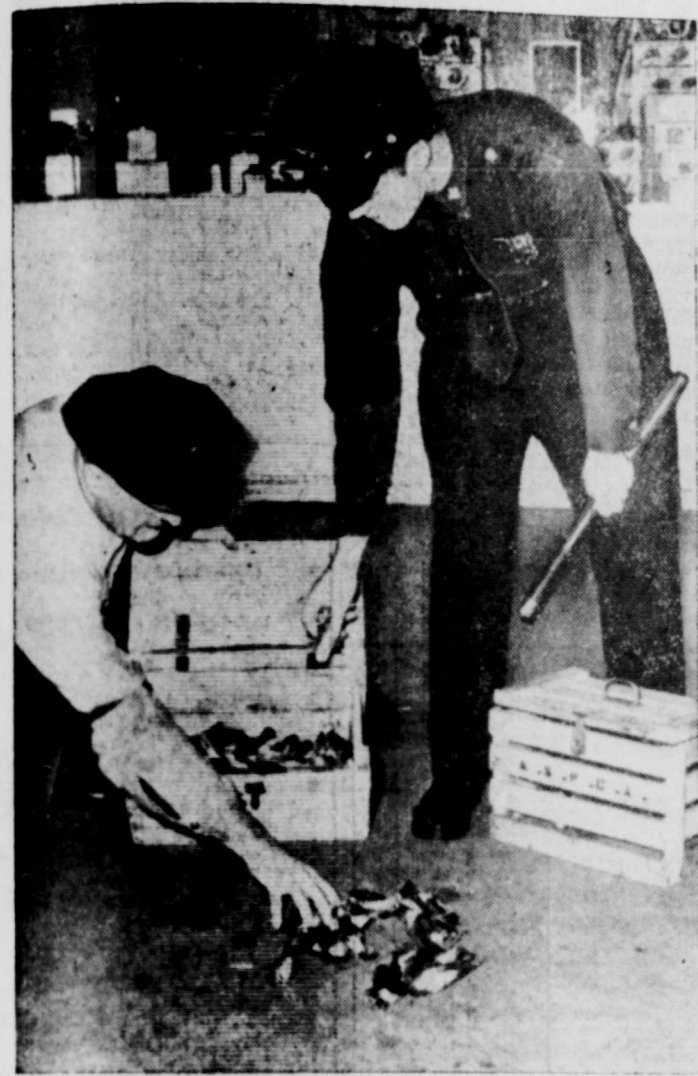

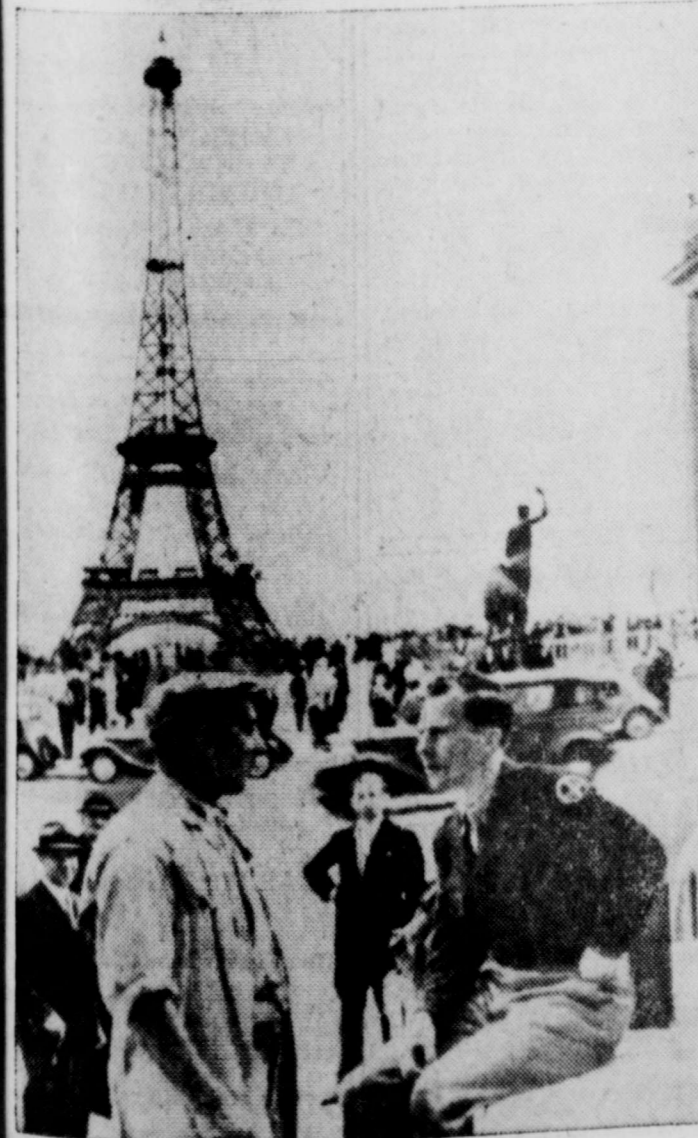

WHEN WE WENT home Saturday night we had two new linotypers lined up. Came Tuesday and the best we could do was to start up the machine personally. Although we been around newspaper offices since we were a junior in high school our acquaintance with a linotype machine has been academic; but formal.

A GOOD OPERATOR can set from one to two columns of type in an hour our speed crowds a third of a column. There are several thousand pieces to a linotype machine and a lot can go wrong. For example we can't seem to make the commas fall and you will probably find some places where commas should be but aren't.

WE ARE WORKING on the situation and hope to have the linotyping department in good order very soon. Mr. Roy Davis of the horse magazine paid us a visit and watched us for a while. Geographer Needed By Civil Service

Geographer and Research Psychologist examinations were announced today by the U. S. Civil Service Commission.

The geographer positions pay from \$3,727 to \$10,305 a year and are located in Washington, D. C. and vicinity. No written test is required but applicants must (a) have completed 4 years of college study which has included courses in geography or allied fields; or (b) have had 4 years of technical experience in geography or closely allied fields; or (c) have had any combination of (a) and (b). In addition, from 1 to 3 years of professional experience in the field of geography is required. For the higher grade positions, the experience must show that the applicant has the ability to organize, direct, and coordinate research or do other important and difficult work in the field of geography.

The examination for Research Psychologist is for filling positions paying \$3,727 and \$4,479 a year. Washington, D. C., and throughout the United States. To qualify, applicants must pass a written test and must (a) have completed a 4-year college course which has included courses applicable to the positions; or (b) have had 4 years of appropriate responsible experience; or (c) any combination of (a) and (b). In addition, they must have had 1 to 2 years of appropriate graduate study or important research experience, or an equivalent combination of the graduate study and experience.

Application for the Geographer examination will be accepted in the Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C., until further notice; however, persons who wish to receive early consideration should have their applications on file not later than October 19, 1948. Persons interested in the Research Psychologist examination must have their applications on file with the Civil Service Commission not later than November 9, 1948.

Further information and application forms may be obtained from the Commission's Local Secretary, Mr. Sam B. King located at Cisco P. O. from Civil Service regional offices, or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C.

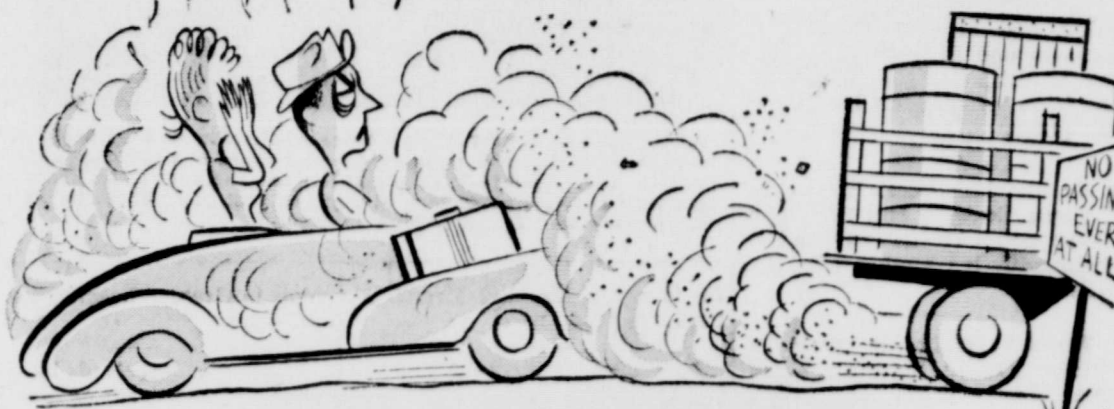
