## To Obtain Second Lieutenants

Second Lieutenants having all out disappeared from the muster rolls, the Army is now taking steps to replenish the supply Captain Wayne Hall, Station Commander of the US Army and US Air Force Recruting Station n Abilene stated today.

Appointments as second lieuenants, men aid women, with at least two years of active duty, opportunities for commissions in the regular army, are now open to both civilians and to members of the regular army and the organized reserves.

Civilians must have had at least one year of military service between December 7, 1941 and June 30, 1947, be between 19 and 32 years old, and have a minimum of two years in an accredited college or university.

#### W A C Army Officer Candidate School Announced

The WAC Army Officer Candidate School will begin another class at Camp Lee, Va., April 1,

1949, it has been announced. The class will be open to both civilians and to present members of the WAC. Applicants must have at least two years college. Age limits for civilians is 19 to 28 but applicants in the WAV prior to October 2, 1948, will be accepted up to 32 years of age.

Applications will not be accepted from women with dependents under 18 or who have formerly held commissions in any armed force.

Married applicants must have previous military service.


